THE FIRST BOOK OF SĂM'Ū-ĔL, OTHERWISE CALLED, THE FIRST BOOK OF THE KINGS

CHAPTER 1

Now there was a certain man of Rā-mă-thā-ĩm-zō-phǐm, of mount Ē-phră-ĭm, and his name was Ĕl-kā-năh, the son of Jĕ-rō-hăm, the son of E-lī-hū, the son of Tō-hū, the son of Zŭph, an Ĕph-ră-thīte:

2 And he had two wives; the name of the one was Hăn-năh, and the name of the other Pĕ-nĭn-năh: and Pĕ-nĭn-năh had children, but Hăn-năh had no children.

3 And this man went up out of his city yearly to worship and to sacrifice unto the LORD of hosts in Shī-lōh. And the two sons of Ē-lī, Hŏph-nī and Phĭn-ĕ-hăs, the priests of the LORD, were there.

4¶ And when the time was that Ĕl-kā-năh offered, he gave to Pĕ-nĭn-năh his wife, and to all her sons and her daughters, portions: 5 But unto Hăn-năh he gave a worthy portion; for he loved Hăn-năh: but the LORD had shut up her womb.

6 And her adversary also provoked her sore, for to make her fret, because the LORD had shut up her womb.

7 And as he did so year by year, when she went up to the house of the LORD, so she provoked her; therefore she wept, and did not eat.

8 Then said Ĕl-kā-'năh her husband to her, Hăn-'năh, why weepest thou? and why eatest thou not? and why is thy heart grieved? am not I better to thee than ten sons? 9 ¶ So Hăn-năh rose up after they had eaten in Shī-lōh, and after they had drunk. Now Ē-lī the priest sat upon a seat by a post of the temple of the LORD.

10 And she was in bitterness of soul, and prayed unto the LORD, and wept sore.

11 And she vowed a vow, and said, O LORD of hosts, if thou wilt indeed look on the affliction of thine handmaid, and remember me, and not forget thine handmaid, but wilt give unto thine handmaid a man child, then I will give him unto the LORD all the days of his life, and there shall no rasor come upon his head.

12 And it came to pass, as she continued praying before the LORD, that Ē'lī marked her mouth. 13 Now Hăn'năh, she spake in her heart; only her lips moved, but her voice was not heard: therefore Ē'lī thought she had been drunken.

14 And Ē-lī said unto her, How long wilt thou be drunken? put away thy wine from thee.

15 And Hăn-năh answered and said, No, my lord, I am a woman of a sorrowful spirit: I have drunk neither wine nor strong drink, but have poured out my soul before the LORD.

16 Count not thine handmaid for a daughter of Bē'lĭ-ăl: for out of the abundance of my complaint and

grief have I spoken hitherto.

17 Then Ē'lī answered and said, Go in peace: and the God of Ĭś'rā-ĕl grant *thee* thy petition that thou hast asked of him.

18 And she said, Let thine handmaid find grace in thy sight. So the woman went her way, and did eat, and her countenance was no more *sad*.

19 ¶ And they rose up in the morning early, and worshipped before the LORD, and returned, and came to their house to Rā-māh: and Ĕl-kā-nāh knew Hăn-nāh his wife; and the LORD remembered her.

20 Wherefore it came to pass, when the time was come about after Hăn-năh had conceived, that she bare a son, and called his name Săm-ū-ĕl, saying, Because I have asked him of the LORD.

21 And the man El-kā-năh, and all his house, went up to offer unto the LORD the yearly sacrifice, and his yow.

22 But Hăn'năh went not up; for she said unto her husband, *I will not go up* until the child be weaned, and *then* I will bring him, that he may appear before the LORD, and there abide for ever.

23 And Ĕl-kā-năh her husband said unto her, Do what seemeth thee good; tarry until thou have weaned him; only the LORD establish his word. So the woman abode, and gave her son suck until she weaned him.

24 ¶ And when she had weaned

him, she took him up with her, with three bullocks, and one ē-phäh of flour, and a bottle of wine, and brought him unto the house of the LORD in Shī-lōh: and the child was young.

25 And they slew a bullock, and brought the child to Ē-lī.

26 And she said, Oh my lord, as thy soul liveth, my lord, I am the woman that stood by thee here, praying unto the LORD.

27 For this child I prayed; and the LORD hath given me my petition which I asked of him:

28 Therefore also I have lent him to the LORD; as long as he liveth he shall be lent to the LORD. And he worshipped the LORD there.

CHAPTER 2

AND Hăn-năh prayed, and said, My heart rejoiceth in the LORD, mine horn is exalted in the LORD: my mouth is enlarged over mine enemies; because I rejoice in thy salvation.

2 There is none holy as the LORD: for there is none beside thee: neither is there any rock like our God.

3 Talk no more so exceeding proudly; let *not* arrogancy come out of your mouth: for the LORD *is* a God of knowledge, and by him actions are weighed.

4 The bows of the mighty men *are* broken, and they that stumbled are girded with strength.

5 They that were full have hired out themselves for bread; and they that were hungry ceased: so that the barren hath born seven; and she that hath many children is waxed feeble.

6 The LORD killeth, and maketh alive: he bringeth down to the grave, and bringeth up.

7 The LORD maketh poor, and maketh rich: he bringeth low, and lifteth up.

8 He raiseth up the poor out of the dust, and lifteth up the beggar from the dunghill, to set them among princes, and to make them inherit the throne of glory: for the pillars of the earth are the LORD'S, and he hath set the world upon them.

9 He will keep the feet of his saints, and the wicked shall be silent in darkness; for by strength shall no man prevail.

10 The adversaries of the LORD shall be broken to pieces; out of heaven shall he thunder upon them: the LORD shall judge the ends of the earth; and he shall give strength unto his king, and exalt the horn of his anointed.

11 And Ĕl-kā-năh went to Rā-măh to his house. And the child did minister unto the LORD before Ē-lī the priest.

12 ¶ Now the sons of \bar{E} - $l\bar{l}$ were sons of $B\bar{e}$ - $l\bar{l}$ - $a\bar{l}$; they knew not the LORD.

13 And the priests' custom with the people was, that, when any man offered sacrifice, the priest's servant came, while the flesh was in seething, with a fleshhook of three teeth in his hand: 14 And he struck *it* into the pan, or kettle, or caldron, or pot; all that the fleshhook brought up the priest took for himself. So they did in Shī-lōh unto all the Ĭś-rā-ĕl-ītes that came thither.

15 Also before they burnt the fat, the priest's servant came, and said to the man that sacrificed, Give flesh to roast for the priest; for he will not have sodden flesh of thee, but raw.

16 And *if* any man said unto him, Let them not fail to burn the fat presently, and *then* take *as much* as thy soul desireth; then he would answer him, *Nay*; but thou shalt give *it me* now: and if not, I will take *it* by force.

17 Wherefore the sin of the young men was very great before the LORD: for men abhorred the offering of the LORD.

18 \P But Săm'ū-ĕl ministered before the LORD, being a child, girded with a linen ē'phŏd.

19 Moreover his mother made him a little coat, and brought *it* to him from year to year, when she came up with her husband to offer the yearly sacrifice.

20 ¶ And Ē-lī blessed Ĕl-kā-năh and his wife, and said, The LORD give thee seed of this woman for the loan which is lent to the LORD. And they went unto their own home.

21 And the LORD visited Hăn-năh, so that she conceived, and bare three sons and two daughters. And the child Săm-ū-ĕl grew

before the LORD.

22 \P Now \bar{E} -l \bar{l} was very old, and heard all that his sons did unto all \bar{l} s- \bar{r} a- \bar{e} l; and how they lay with the women that assembled at the door of the tabernacle of the congregation.

23 And he said unto them, Why do ye such things? for I hear of your evil dealings by all this people.

24 Nay, my sons; for *it is* no good report that I hear: ye make the LORD'S people to transgress.

25 If one man sin against another, the judge shall judge him: but if a man sin against the LORD, who shall intreat for him? Notwithstanding they hearkened not unto the voice of their father, because the LORD would slay them.

26 And the child Săm'ū-ĕl grew on, and was in favour both with the LORD, and also with men.

27 \P And there came a man of God unto \bar{E} - \hat{I} , and said unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Did I plainly appear unto the house of thy father, when they were in \bar{E} - \hat{g} ypt in Phâr- \hat{a} oh's house?

28 And did I choose him out of all the tribes of Ĭś-rā-ĕl to be my priest, to offer upon mine altar, to burn incense, to wear an ē-phŏd before me? and did I give unto the house of thy father all the offerings made by fire of the children of Ĭś-rā-ĕl?

29 Wherefore kick ye at my sacrifice and at mine offering, which I have commanded *in my* habitation; and honourest thy

sons above me, to make yourselves fat with the chiefest of all the offerings of Ĭś-rā-ĕl my people?

30 Wherefore the LORD God of Ĭś-rā-ĕl saith, I said indeed that thy house, and the house of thy father, should walk before me for ever: but now the LORD saith, Be it far from me; for them that honour me I will honour, and they that despise me shall be lightly esteemed.

31 Behold, the days come, that I will cut off thine arm, and the arm of thy father's house, that there shall not be an old man in thine house.

32 And thou shalt see an enemy in my habitation, in all the wealth which God shall give Ĭś-rā-ĕl: and there shall not be an old man in thine house for ever.

33 And the man of thine, whom I shall not cut off from mine altar, shall be to consume thine eyes, and to grieve thine heart: and all the increase of thine house shall die in the flower of their age.

34 And this *shall be* a sign unto thee, that shall come upon thy two sons, on Hŏph-nī and Phĭn-ĕ-hăs; in one day they shall die both of them.

35 And I will raise me up a faithful priest, that shall do according to that which is in mine heart and in my mind: and I will build him a sure house; and he shall walk before mine anointed for ever.

36 And it shall come to pass, that every one that is left in thine

house shall come and crouch to him for a piece of silver and a morsel of bread, and shall say, Put me, I pray thee, into one of the priests' offices, that I may eat a piece of bread.

CHAPTER 3

And the child Săm-ū-ĕl ministered unto the LORD before Ē-lī. And the word of the LORD was precious in those days; there was no open vision.

2 And it came to pass at that time, when Ē-lī was laid down in his place, and his eyes began to wax dim, that he could not see;

3 And ere the lamp of God went out in the temple of the LORD, where the ark of God was, and Săm'ū-ĕl was laid down to sleep;

4 That the LORD called Săm-ū-el: and he answered, Here am I.

5 And he ran unto Ē-lī, and said, Here am I; for thou calledst me. And he said, I called not; lie down again. And he went and lay down. 6 And the LORD called yet again, Săm-ū-ĕl. And Săm-ū-ĕl arose and went to Ē-lī, and said, Here am I; for thou didst call me. And he answered, I called not, my son; lie down again.

7 Now Săm'ū-ĕl did not yet know the LORD, neither was the word of the LORD yet revealed unto him.

8 And the LORD called Săm'ū-ĕl again the third time. And he arose and went to \bar{E} 'lī, and said, Here am I; for thou didst call me. And \bar{E} 'lī perceived that the LORD had called the child.

9 Therefore Ē-lī said unto Săm-u-el, Go, lie down: and it shall be, if he call thee, that thou shalt say, Speak, LORD; for thy servant heareth. So Săm-u-el went and lay down in his place.

10 And the LORD came, and stood, and called as at other times, Săm'ū-ĕl, Săm'ū-ĕl. Then Săm'ū-ĕl answered, Speak; for thy servant heareth.

11 ¶ And the LORD said to Săm-ū-ĕl, Behold, I will do a thing in Ĭś-rā-ĕl, at which both the ears of every one that heareth it shall tingle.

12 In that day I will perform against \bar{E} - $l\bar{l}$ all things which I have spoken concerning his house: when I begin, I will also make an end.

13 For I have told him that I will judge his house for ever for the iniquity which he knoweth; because his sons made themselves vile, and he restrained them not.

14 And therefore I have sworn unto the house of \bar{E} - $l\bar{l}$, that the iniquity of \bar{E} - $l\bar{l}$'s house shall not be purged with sacrifice nor offering for ever.

15 \P And Săm'ū-ĕl lay until the morning, and opened the doors of the house of the LORD. And Săm'ū-ĕl feared to shew Ē'lī the vision.

16 Then Ē'lī called Săm'ū-ĕl, and said, Săm'ū-ĕl, my son. And he answered, Here am I.

17 And he said, What is the thing that the LORD hath said unto thee?

I pray thee hide *it* not from me: God do so to thee, and more also, if thou hide *any* thing from me of all the things that he said unto thee.

18 And Săm'ū-ĕl told him every whit, and hid nothing from him. And he said, It *is* the LORD: let him do what seemeth him good.

19 ¶ And Săm'ū-ĕl grew, and the LORD was with him, and did let none of his words fall to the ground.

20 And all Ĭś-rā-ĕl from Dăn even to Beer-shē-bă knew that Săm-ū-ĕl was established to be a prophet of the LORD.

21 And the LORD appeared again in Shī-lōh: for the LORD revealed himself to Săm-ū-ĕl in Shī-lōh by the word of the LORD.

CHAPTER 4

And the word of Săm-ū-ël came to all Ĭś-rā-ĕl. Now Ĭś-rā-ĕl went out against the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes to battle, and pitched beside Ĕb-ĕn-ē-zĕr: and the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes pitched in Ā-phĕk.

2 And the Phǐl-r̃s-tīnes put themselves in array against Tš-rā-ĕl: and when they joined battle, Tš-rā-ĕl was smitten before the Phĭl-r̃s-tīnes: and they slew of the army in the field about four thousand men.

3 ¶ And when the people were come into the camp, the elders of Ĭśʻrā-ĕl said, Wherefore hath the LORD smitten us to day before the Phĭl-ĭs-tīneś? Let us fetch the ark of the covenant of the LORD out of

Shī-lōh unto us, that, when it cometh among us, it may save us out of the hand of our enemies.

4 So the people sent to Shī-lōh, that they might bring from thence the ark of the covenant of the LORD of hosts, which dwelleth between the chĕr-ū-bĭms: and the two sons of Ē-lī, Hŏph-nī and Phĭn-ĕ-hăs, were there with the ark of the covenant of God.

5 And when the ark of the covenant of the LORD came into the camp, all Ĭś-rā-ĕl shouted with a great shout, so that the earth rang again.

6 And when the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes heard the noise of the shout, they said, What *meaneth* the noise of this great shout in the camp of the Hē-brēws? And they understood that the ark of the LORD was come into the camp.

7 And the Phǐl-ĭs-tīnes were afraid, for they said, God is come into the camp. And they said, Woe unto us! for there hath not been such a thing heretofore.

8 Woe unto us! who shall deliver us out of the hand of these mighty Gods? these *are* the Gods that smote the E-ġyp-tīāns with all the plagues in the wilderness.

9 Be strong, and quit yourselves like men, O ye Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes, that ye be not servants unto the Hē-brēws, as they have been to you: quit yourselves like men, and fight.

10 ¶ And the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes fought, and Ĭs-rā-ĕl was smitten, and they

fled every man into his tent: and there was a very great slaughter; for there fell of Ĭś-rā-ĕl thirty thousand footmen.

11 And the ark of God was taken; and the two sons of Ē-lī, Hŏph-nī and Phĭn-ĕ-hās, were slain.

12 ¶ And there ran a man of Běn-jă-mĭn out of the army, and came to Shī-lōh the same day with his clothes rent, and with earth upon his head.

13 And when he came, lo, Ē-lī sat upon a seat by the wayside watching: for his heart trembled for the ark of God. And when the man came into the city, and told *it*, all the city cried out.

14 And when \bar{E} - $l\bar{l}$ heard the noise of the crying, he said, What *meaneth* the noise of this tumult? And the man came in hastily, and told \bar{E} - $l\bar{l}$.

15 Now Ē-lī was ninety and eight years old; and his eyes were dim, that he could not see.

16 And the man said unto $\bar{E}^2l\bar{i}$, I am he that came out of the army, and I fled to day out of the army. And he said, What is there done, my son?

17 And the messenger answered and said, Ĭś-rā-ĕl is fled before the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes, and there hath been also a great slaughter among the people, and thy two sons also, Hŏph-nī and Phĭn-ĕ-hăs, are dead, and the ark of God is taken.

18 And it came to pass, when he made mention of the ark of God, that he fell from off the seat back-

ward by the side of the gate, and his neck brake, and he died: for he was an old man, and heavy. And he had judged Ĭś-rā-ĕl forty years.

19 ¶ And his daughter in law, Phĭn-ĕ-hăs' wife, was with child, near to be delivered: and when she heard the tidings that the ark of God was taken, and that her father in law and her husband were dead, she bowed herself and travailed; for her pains came upon her.

20 And about the time of her death the women that stood by her said unto her, Fear not; for thou hast born a son. But she answered not, neither did she regard it.

21 And she named the child Ī-chă-bŏd, saying, The glory is departed from Ĭs-rā-ĕl: because the ark of God was taken, and because of her father in law and her husband.

22 And she said, The glory is departed from Ĭś-rā-ĕl: for the ark of God is taken.

CHAPTER 5

And the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes took the ark of God, and brought it from Ĕb-ĕn-ē-zĕr unto Ăsh-dŏd. 2 When the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes took the ark of God, they brought it into the house of Dā-gŏn, and set it by Dā-gŏn.

3 ¶ And when they of Ăsh-dŏd arose early on the morrow, behold, Dā-gŏn was fallen upon his face to the earth before the ark of the LORD. And they took Dā-gŏn, and set him in his place again.

4 And when they arose early on

the morrow morning, behold, Dā-ʻgŏn was fallen upon his face to the ground before the ark of the LORD; and the head of Dā-ʻgŏn and both the palms of his hands were cut off upon the threshold; only the stump of Dā-ʻgŏn was left to him.

5 Therefore neither the priests of Dā-ʻgŏn, nor any that come into Dā-ʻgŏn's house, tread on the threshold of Dā-ʻgŏn in Åsh-ʻdŏd unto this day.

6 But the hand of the LORD was heavy upon them of Ash'dod, and he destroyed them, and smote them with emerods, even Ash'dod and the coasts thereof.

7 And when the men of Åsh'dŏd saw that *it was* so, they said, The ark of the God of Ĭś'rā-ĕl shall not abide with us: for his hand is sore upon us, and upon Dā'gŏn our god.

8 They sent therefore and gathered all the lords of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes unto them, and said, What shall we do with the ark of the God of Ĭs-rā-ĕl? And they answered, Let the ark of the God of Ĭs-rā-ĕl be carried about unto Găth. And they carried the ark of the God of Ĭs-rā-ĕl about thither.

9 And it was so, that, after they had carried it about, the hand of the LORD was against the city with a very great destruction: and he smote the men of the city, both small and great, and they had emerods in their secret parts.

10 ¶ Therefore they sent the ark of

God to Ĕk-rŏn. And it came to pass, as the ark of God came to Ĕk-rŏn, that the Ĕk-rŏn-ītes cried out, saying, They have brought about the ark of the God of Ĭś-rā-ĕl to us, to slay us and our people.

11 So they sent and gathered together all the lords of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes, and said, Send away the ark of the God of Ĭs-rā-ĕl, and let it go again to his own place, that it slay us not, and our people: for there was a deadly destruction throughout all the city; the hand of God was very heavy there.

12 And the men that died not were smitten with the emerods: and the cry of the city went up to heaven.

CHAPTER 6

And the ark of the LORD was in the country of the Phil-is-tines seven months.

2 And the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes called for the priests and the diviners, saying, What shall we do to the ark of the LORD? tell us wherewith we shall send it to his place.

3 And they said, If ye send away the ark of the God of Ĭś-rā-ĕl, send it not empty; but in any wise return him a trespass offering: then ye shall be healed, and it shall be known to you why his hand is not removed from you.

4 Then said they, What shall be the trespass offering which we shall return to him? They answered, Five golden emerods, and five golden mice, according to the number of the lords of the Phĭl-ĩs-tīnes: for one plague was

on you all, and on your lords.

5 Wherefore ye shall make images of your emerods, and images of your mice that mar the land; and ye shall give glory unto the God of Ĭś-rā-ĕl: peradventure he will lighten his hand from off you, and from off your gods, and from off your land.

6 Wherefore then do ye harden your hearts, as the Ē-ġyp-tīāns and Phâr-aoh hardened their hearts? when he had wrought wonderfully among them, did they not let the people go, and they departed?

7 Now therefore make a new cart, and take two milch kine, on which there hath come no yoke, and tie the kine to the cart, and bring their calves home from them:

8 And take the ark of the LORD, and lay it upon the cart; and put the jewels of gold, which ye return him for a trespass offering, in a coffer by the side thereof; and send it away, that it may go.

9 And see, if it goeth up by the way of his own coast to Běth-shē'měsh, then he hath done us this great evil: but if not, then we shall know that it is not his hand that smote us; it was a chance that happened to us.

10 ¶ And the men did so; and took two milch kine, and tied them to the cart, and shut up their calves at home:

11 And they laid the ark of the LORD upon the cart, and the coffer with the mice of gold and the

images of their emerods.

12 And the kine took the straight way to the way of Běth-shē'měsh, and went along the highway, lowing as they went, and turned not aside to the right hand or to the left; and the lords of the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes went after them unto the border of Běth-shē'měsh.

13 And they of Běth-shē'měsh were reaping their wheat harvest in the valley: and they lifted up their eyes, and saw the ark, and rejoiced to see it.

14 And the cart came into the field of Jŏsh-ū-ă, a Bĕth-shē-mīte, and stood there, where *there was* a great stone: and they clave the wood of the cart, and offered the kine a burnt offering unto the LORD.

15 And the Lē'vītes took down the ark of the LORD, and the coffer that was with it, wherein the jewels of gold were, and put them on the great stone: and the men of Běth–shē'měsh offered burnt offerings and sacrificed sacrifices the same day unto the LORD.

16 And when the five lords of the Phǐl-ĭs-tīnes had seen *it*, they returned to Ĕk-rŏn the same day.
17 And these *are* the golden emerods which the Phǐl-ĭs-tīnes returned *for* a trespass offering unto the LORD; for Ăsh-dŏd one, for Gā-ză one, for Ās-kē-lon one, for Găth one, for Ĕk-rŏn one;

18 And the golden mice, according to the number of all the cities of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes belonging to the

five lords, both of fenced cities, and of country villages, even unto the great stone of Ā'bĕl, whereon they set down the ark of the LORD: which stone remaineth unto this day in the field of Jŏsh'ū-ă, the Bĕth-shē'mīte.

19 ¶ And he smote the men of Běth–shē-měsh, because they had looked into the ark of the LORD, even he smote of the people fifty thousand and threescore and ten men: and the people lamented, because the LORD had smitten many of the people with a great slaughter.

20 And the men of Běth-shē'měsh said, Who is able to stand before this holy LORD God? and to whom shall he go up from us?

21 ¶ And they sent messengers to the inhabitants of Kĭr´jăth–jē´ā-rĭm, saying, The Phĭl´īs-tīnes have brought again the ark of the LORD; come ye down, and fetch it up to you.

CHAPTER 7

AND the men of Kĭr'jăthjē'ā-rĭm came, and fetched up the ark of the LORD, and brought it into the house of Ă-bĭn'ā-dāb in the hill, and sanctified Ĕl-ē-ā'zär his son to keep the ark of the LORD.

2 And it came to pass, while the ark abode in Kĭr-jāth-jē-ă-rĭm, that the time was long; for it was twenty years: and all the house of Ĭś-rā-ĕl lamented after the LORD. 3 ¶ And Săm-ū-ĕl spake unto all

 $3\,\P$ And Săm-´ū-ĕl spake unto all the house of Ĭś-ʿrā-ĕl, saying, If ye

do return unto the LORD with all your hearts, then put away the strange gods and Ash'tă-rōth from among you, and prepare your hearts unto the LORD, and serve him only: and he will deliver you out of the hand of the Phǐl-ĭs-tīneś.

4 Then the children of Ĭś-rā-ĕl did put away Bā-ã-lǐm and Ăsh-tă-rōth, and served the LORD only.

5 And Săm'ū-ĕl said, Gather all Ĭś'rā-ĕl to Mĭz'pēh, and I will pray for you unto the LORD.

6 And they gathered together to Mĭz'pēh, and drew water, and poured it out before the LORD, and fasted on that day, and said there, We have sinned against the LORD. And Săm'ū-ĕl judged the children of Ĭś'rā-ĕl in Mĭz'pēh.

7 And when the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes heard that the children of Ĭs-rā-ĕl were gathered together to Mĭz-pēh, the lords of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes went up against Ĭs-rā-ĕl. And when the children of Ĭs-rā-ĕl heard it, they were afraid of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes.

8 And the children of Ĭś-rā-ĕl said to Săm-ū-ĕl, Cease not to cry unto the LORD our God for us, that he will save us out of the hand of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīneś.

9 ¶ And Săm-ū-ĕl took a sucking lamb, and offered it for a burnt offering wholly unto the LORD: and Săm-ū-ĕl cried unto the LORD for Ĭś-rā-ĕl; and the LORD heard him.

10 And as Săm'ū-ĕl was offering up the burnt offering, the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes drew near to battle against Ĭs'rā-ĕl: but the LORD thundered with a great thunder on that day upon the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes, and discomfited them; and they were smitten before Ĭs'rā-ĕl.

11 And the men of Ĭś-rā-ĕl went out of Mĭz-pēh, and pursued the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes, and smote them, until they came under Bĕth-cär.

12 Then Săm'ū-ĕl took a stone, and set it between Mĭz'pēh and Shĕn, and called the name of it Ĕb'ĕn-ē'zĕr, saying, Hitherto hath the LORD helped us.

13 ¶ So the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes were subdued, and they came no more into the coast of Ĭs-rā-ĕl: and the hand of the LORD was against the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes all the days of Săm-ū-ĕl.

14 And the cities which the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes had taken from Ĭsʻrā-ĕl were restored to Ĭsʻrā-ĕl, from Ĕkʻrŏn even unto Găth; and the coasts thereof did Ĭsʻrā-ĕl deliver out of the hands of the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes. And there was peace between Ĭsʻrā-ĕl and the Ămʻō-rītes.

15 And Săm'ū-ĕl judged Ĭs'rā-ĕl all the days of his life.

16 And he went from year to year in circuit to Běth-ĕl, and Gĭl-găl, and Mĭz-pēh, and judged Ĭś-rā-ĕl in all those places.

17 And his return was to Rā'măh; for there was his house; and there he judged Ĭś'rā-ĕl; and there he

built an altar unto the LORD.

CHAPTER 8

AND it came to pass, when Săm-ū-ĕl was old, that he made his sons judges over Ĭś-rā-ĕl.

2 Now the name of his firstborn was Jō-ĕl; and the name of his second, Ă-bī-ăh: they were judges in Beer-shē-bă.

3 And his sons walked not in his ways, but turned aside after lucre, and took bribes, and perverted judgment.

4 Then all the elders of Ĭš'rā-ĕl gathered themselves together, and came to Săm'ū-ĕl unto Rā'măh,

5 And said unto him, Behold, thou art old, and thy sons walk not in thy ways: now make us a king to judge us like all the nations.

6 ¶ But the thing displeased Săm'ū-ĕl, when they said, Give us a king to judge us. And Săm'ū-ĕl prayed unto the LORD.

7 And the LORD said unto Săm'ū-ĕl, Hearken unto the voice of the people in all that they say unto thee: for they have not rejected thee, but they have rejected me, that I should not reign over them.

8 According to all the works which they have done since the day that I brought them up out of \bar{E} - \dot{g} ypt even unto this day, wherewith they have forsaken me, and served other gods, so do they also unto thee.

9 Now therefore hearken unto

their voice: howbeit yet protest solemnly unto them, and shew them the manner of the king that shall reign over them.

10 \P And Săm' \bar{u} -ĕl told all the words of the LORD unto the people that asked of him a king.

11 And he said, This will be the manner of the king that shall reign over you: He will take your sons, and appoint *them* for himself, for his chariots, and *to be* his horsemen; and *some* shall run before his chariots.

12 And he will appoint him captains over thousands, and captains over fifties; and will set them to ear his ground, and to reap his harvest, and to make his instruments of war, and instruments of his chariots.

13 And he will take your daughters to be confectionaries, and to be cooks, and to be bakers.

14 And he will take your fields, and your vineyards, and your oliveyards, even the best of them, and give them to his servants.

15 And he will take the tenth of your seed, and of your vineyards, and give to his officers, and to his servants.

16 And he will take your menservants, and your maidservants, and your goodliest young men, and your asses, and put *them* to his work.

17 He will take the tenth of your sheep: and ye shall be his servants. 18 And ye shall cry out in that day because of your king which ye shall have chosen you; and the LORD will not hear you in that day. 19 ¶ Nevertheless the people refused to obey the voice of Săm'ū-ĕl; and they said, Nay; but we will have a king over us;

20 That we also may be like all the nations; and that our king may judge us, and go out before us, and fight our battles.

21 And Săm'ū-ĕl heard all the words of the people, and he rehearsed them in the ears of the LORD.

22 And the LORD said to Săm'ū-ĕl, Hearken unto their voice, and make them a king. And Săm'ū-ĕl said unto the men of Ĭś'rā-ĕl, Go ye every man unto his city.

CHAPTER 9

Now there was a man of Běn-jă-mĭn, whose name was Kǐsh, the son of Ă-bī-ĕl, the son of Zē-rôr, the son of Bě-chō-răth, the son of Ă-phī-āh, a Běn-jă-mīte, a mighty man of power.

2 And he had a son, whose name was Saul, a choice young man, and a goodly: and there was not among the children of Ĭś-rā-ĕl a goodlier person than he: from his shoulders and upward he was higher than any of the people.

3 And the asses of Kish Saul's father were lost. And Kish said to Saul his son, Take now one of the servants with thee, and arise, go seek the asses.

4 And he passed through mount E-phră-im, and passed through

the land of Shăl-ĩ-shă, but they found *them* not: then they passed through the land of Shāl-ĩm, and *there they were* not: and he passed through the land of the Běn-jă-mītes, but they found *them* not.

5 And when they were come to the land of Zuph, Saul said to his servant that was with him, Come, and let us return; lest my father leave caring for the asses, and take thought for us.

6 And he said unto him, Behold now, there is in this city a man of God, and he is an honourable man; all that he saith cometh surely to pass: now let us go thither; peradventure he can shew us our way that we should go.

7 Then said Saul to his servant, But, behold, if we go, what shall we bring the man? for the bread is spent in our vessels, and there is not a present to bring to the man of God: what have we?

8 And the servant answered Saul again, and said, Behold, I have here at hand the fourth part of a shē-kĕl of silver: that will I give to the man of God, to tell us our way. 9 (Beforetime in Ĭś-rā-ĕl, when a man went to inquire of God, thus he spake, Come, and let us go to the seer: for he that is now called a Prophet was beforetime called a Seer.)

10 Then said Saul to his servant, Well said; come, let us go. So they went unto the city where the man of God was.

11 ¶ And as they went up the hill to the city, they found young maidens going out to draw water, and said unto them, Is the seer here?

12 And they answered them, and said, He is; behold, *he* is before you: make haste now, for he came to day to the city; for *there* is a sacrifice of the people to day in the high place:

13 As soon as ye be come into the city, ye shall straightway find him, before he go up to the high place to eat: for the people will not eat until he come, because he doth bless the sacrifice; and afterwards they eat that be bidden. Now therefore get you up; for about this time ye shall find him.

14 And they went up into the city: and when they were come into the city, behold, Săm'ū-ĕl came out against them, for to go up to the high place.

15¶Now the LORD had told Săm'ū-ĕl in his ear a day before Saul came, saying,

16 To morrow about this time I will send thee a man out of the land of Běn-jă-mĭn, and thou shalt anoint him to be captain over my people Ĭś-rā-ĕl, that he may save my people out of the hand of the Phǐl-ĭs-tīneṡ: for I have looked upon my people, because their cry is come unto me.

17 And when Săm-u-el saw Saul, the LORD said unto him, Behold the man whom I spake to thee of! this same shall reign over my people.

18 Then Saul drew near to Săm'ū-ĕl in the gate, and said, Tell me, I pray thee, where the seer's house is.

19 And Săm'ū-ĕl answered Saul, and said, I am the seer: go up before me unto the high place; for ye shall eat with me to day, and to morrow I will let thee go, and will tell thee all that is in thine heart. 20 And as for thine asses that were lost three days ago, set not thy mind on them; for they are found. And on whom is all the desire of Ĭś'rā-ĕl? Is it not on thee, and on all thy father's house?

21 And Saul answered and said, Am not I a Běn-jă-mīte, of the smallest of the tribes of Ĭś-rā-ĕl? and my family the least of all the families of the tribe of Běn-jă-mĭn? wherefore then speakest thou so to me?

22 And Săm'ū-ĕl took Saul and his servant, and brought them into the parlour, and made them sit in the chiefest place among them that were bidden, which were about thirty persons.

23 And Săm'ū-ĕl said unto the cook, Bring the portion which I gave thee, of which I said unto thee, Set it by thee.

24 And the cook took up the shoulder, and that which was upon it, and set it before Saul. And Săm'ū-ĕl said, Behold that which is left! set it before thee, and eat: for unto this time hath it been kept for thee since I said, I have invited

the people. So Saul did eat with Săm'-ū-ĕl that day.

25 ¶ And when they were come down from the high place into the city, $S\bar{a}m'\bar{u}-\bar{e}l$ communed with $S\widehat{aul}$ upon the top of the house.

26 And they arose early: and it came to pass about the spring of the day, that Săm'ū-ĕl called Saul to the top of the house, saying, Up, that I may send thee away. And Saul arose, and they went out both of them, he and Săm'ū-ĕl, abroad. 27 And as they were going down to the end of the city, Săm'ū-ĕl said to Saul, Bid the servant pass on before us, (and he passed on,) but stand thou still a while, that I may shew thee the word of God.

CHAPTER 10

THEN Săm'ū-ĕl took a vial of oil, and poured it upon his head, and kissed him, and said, Is it not because the LORD hath anointed thee to be captain over his inheritance?

2 When thou art departed from me to day, then thou shalt find two men by Rā-chěl's sepulchre in the border of Běn-jă-mǐn at Zěl-zăh; and they will say unto thee, The asses which thou wentest to seek are found: and, lo, thy father hath left the care of the asses, and sorroweth for you, saying, What shall I do for my son? 3 Then shalt thou go on forward from thence, and thou shalt come to the plain of Tā-bôr, and there shall meet thee three men going up to God to Běth-ěl, one carrying

three kids, and another carrying three loaves of bread, and another carrying a bottle of wine:

4 And they will salute thee, and give thee two *loaves* of bread; which thou shalt receive of their hands.

5 After that thou shalt come to the hill of God, where *is* the garrison of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes: and it shall come to pass, when thou art come thither to the city, that thou shalt meet a company of prophets coming down from the high place with a psaltery, and a tabret, and a pipe, and a harp, before them; and they shall prophesy:

6 And the Spirit of the LORD will come upon thee, and thou shalt prophesy with them, and shalt be turned into another man.

7 And let it be, when these signs are come unto thee, *that* thou do as occasion serve thee; for God *is* with thee.

8 And thou shalt go down before me to Gĭl'găl; and, behold, I will come down unto thee, to offer burnt offerings, and to sacrifice sacrifices of peace offerings: seven days shalt thou tarry, till I come to thee, and shew thee what thou shalt do.

9 ¶ And it was so, that when he had turned his back to go from Săm'ū-ĕl, God gave him another heart: and all those signs came to pass that day.

10 And when they came thither to the hill, behold, a company of prophets met him; and the Spirit of God came upon him, and he prophesied among them.

11 And it came to pass, when all that knew him beforetime saw that, behold, he prophesied among the prophets, then the people said one to another, What is this that is come unto the son of Kish? Is Saul also among the prophets?

12 And one of the same place answered and said, But who is their father? Therefore it became a proverb, Is Saul also among the prophets?

13 And when he had made an end of prophesying, he came to the high place.

14¶ And Saul's uncle said unto him and to his servant, Whither went ye? And he said, To seek the asses: and when we saw that *they were* no where, we came to Săm'ū-ĕl.

15 And Saul's uncle said, Tell me, I pray thee, what Săm'ū-ĕl said unto you.

16 And Saul said unto his uncle, He told us plainly that the asses were found. But of the matter of the kingdom, whereof Săm'ū-ĕl spake, he told him not.

17 ¶ And Săm'ū-ĕl called the people together unto the LORD to Mĭz'pēh;

18 And said unto the children of Ĭś-rā-ĕl, Thus saith the LORD God of Ĭś-rā-ĕl, I brought up Ĭś-rā-ĕl out of Ē-ġÿpt, and delivered you out of the hand of the Ē-ġÿp-tīāns, and out of the hand of all

kingdoms, and of them that oppressed you:

19 And ye have this day rejected your God, who himself saved you out of all your adversities and your tribulations; and ye have said unto him, Nay, but set a king over us. Now therefore present yourselves before the LORD by your tribes, and by your thousands.

20 And when Săm-u-ël had caused all the tribes of Ĭś-rā-el to come near, the tribe of Běn-jă-mĭn was taken.

21 When he had caused the tribe of Běn-jă-mĭn to come near by their families, the family of Matri was taken, and Saul the son of Kĭsh was taken: and when they sought him, he could not be found.

22 Therefore they inquired of the LORD further, if the man should yet come thither. And the LORD answered, Behold, he hath hid himself among the stuff.

23 And they ran and fetched him thence: and when he stood among the people, he was higher than any of the people from his shoulders and upward.

24 And Săm'ū-ĕl said to all the people, See ye him whom the LORD hath chosen, that *there is* none like him among all the people? And all the people shouted, and said, God save the king.

25 Then Săm-ū-ĕl told the people the manner of the kingdom, and wrote it in a book, and laid it up before the LORD. And Săm-ū-ĕl

sent all the people away, every man to his house.

26 ¶ And Saul also went home to Gĭb-ĕ-ăh; and there went with him a band of men, whose hearts God had touched.

27 But the children of Bē-lǐ-al said, How shall this man save us? And they despised him, and brought him no presents. But he held his peace.

CHAPTER 11

THEN Nā-hāsh the Ām-mon-īte came up, and encamped against Jā-besh-gĭl-e-ād: and all the men of Jā-besh said unto Nā-hāsh, Make a covenant with us, and we will serve thee.

2 And Nā-hāsh the Ăm-mon-īte answered them, On this condition will I make a covenant with you, that I may thrust out all your right eyes, and lay it for a reproach upon all ĭs-rā-ĕl.

3 And the elders of Jā-besh said unto him, Give us seven days' respite, that we may send messengers unto all the coasts of Ĭś-rā-el: and then, if there be no man to save us, we will come out to thee.

4 ¶ Then came the messengers to Gĭb´e-ăh of Saul, and told the tidings in the ears of the people: and all the people lifted up their voices, and wept.

5 And, behold, Saul came after the herd out of the field; and Saul said, What *aileth* the people that they weep? And they told him the tidings of the men of Jā-běsh.

6 And the Spirit of God came upon Saul when he heard those tidings, and his anger was kindled greatly. 7 And he took a yoke of oxen, and hewed them in pieces, and sent them throughout all the coasts of Ĭś-rā-ĕl bv hands the messengers, saying, Whosoever cometh not forth after Saul and after Săm-ū-ĕl, so shall it be done unto his oxen. And the fear of the LORD fell on the people, and they came out with one consent.

8 And when he numbered them in Bē-zĕk, the children of Ĭś-rā-ĕl were three hundred thousand, and the men of Jûd-ah thirty thousand.

9 And they said unto the messengers that came, Thus shall ye say unto the men of Jā'bĕsh-gĭl'ĕ-ăd, To morrow, by that time the sun be hot, ye shall have help. And the messengers came and shewed it to the men of Jā'bĕsh; and they were glad.

10 Therefore the men of Jā-besh said, To morrow we will come out unto you, and ye shall do with us all that seemeth good unto you.

11 And it was so on the morrow, that Saul put the people in three companies; and they came into the midst of the host in the morning watch, and slew the Am-mon-ites until the heat of the day: and it came to pass, that they which remained were scattered, so that two of them were not left together.

12 ¶ And the people said unto

Săm'ū-ĕl, Who is he that said, Shall Saul reign over us? bring the men, that we may put them to death.

13 And Saul said, There shall not a man be put to death this day: for to day the LORD hath wrought salvation in Iš-rā-ĕl.

14 Then said Săm'ū-ĕl to the people, Come, and let us go to Gĭl'găl, and renew the kingdom there.

15 And all the people went to Gĭl-́găl; and there they made Saul king before the LORD in Gĭl-́găl; and there they sacrificed sacrifices of peace offerings before the LORD; and there Saul and all the men of Ĭś-́rā-ĕl rejoiced greatly.

CHAPTER 12

AND Săm'ū-ĕl said unto all Iš'rā-ĕl, Behold, I have hearkened unto your voice in all that ye said unto me, and have made a king over you.

2 And now, behold, the king walketh before you: and I am old and grayheaded; and, behold, my sons *are* with you: and I have walked before you from my childhood unto this day.

3 Behold, here I am: witness against me before the LORD, and before his anointed: whose ox have I taken? or whose ass have I taken? or whom have I defrauded? whom have I oppressed? or of whose hand have I received any bribe to blind mine eyes therewith? and I will restore it you.

4 And they said, Thou hast not defrauded us, nor oppressed us, neither hast thou taken ought of any man's hand.

5 And he said unto them, The LORD is witness against you, and his anointed is witness this day, that ye have not found ought in my hand. And they answered, He is witness.

6¶ And Săm- \overline{u} -ĕl said unto the people, *It is* the LORD that advanced Mō-'sès and \widehat{Aa} -ron, and that brought your fathers up out of the land of \overline{E} -'gypt.

7 Now therefore stand still, that I may reason with you before the LORD of all the righteous acts of the LORD, which he did to you and to your fathers.

8 When Jā-cob was come into Ē-ġypt, and your fathers cried unto the LORD, then the LORD sent Mō-śeś and Aa-ron, which brought forth your fathers out of Ē-ġypt, and made them dwell in this place.

9 And when they forgat the LORD their God, he sold them into the hand of Sĭs´e-ră, captain of the host of Hā′zôr, and into the hand of the Phĭl´īs-tīnes, and into the hand of the king of Mō´āb, and they fought against them.

10 And they cried unto the LORD, and said, We have sinned, because we have forsaken the LORD, and have served Bā-á-lǐm and Ash-tă-rōth: but now deliver us out of the hand of our enemies, and we will serve thee.

11 And the LORD sent Jěr-ŭb-bā-al, and Bē-dăn, and Jěph-thăh, and Săm-ū-el, and delivered you out of the hand of your enemies on every side, and ye dwelled safe.

12 And when ye saw that Nā-hash the king of the children of Am-mon came against you, ye said unto me, Nay; but a king shall reign over us: when the LORD your God was your king.

13 Now therefore behold the king whom ye have chosen, *and* whom ye have desired! and, behold, the LORD hath set a king over you.

14 If ye will fear the LORD, and serve him, and obey his voice, and not rebel against the commandment of the LORD, then shall both ye and also the king that reigneth over you continue following the LORD your God:

15 But if ye will not obey the voice of the LORD, but rebel against the commandment of the LORD, then shall the hand of the LORD be against you, as *it was* against your fathers.

16 ¶ Now therefore stand and see this great thing, which the LORD will do before your eyes.

17 Is it not wheat harvest to day? I will call unto the LORD, and he shall send thunder and rain; that ye may perceive and see that your wickedness is great, which ye have done in the sight of the LORD, in asking you a king.

18 So Săm'ū-ĕl called unto the LORD; and the LORD sent thunder and rain that day: and all the

people greatly feared the LORD and Săm'-ū-ĕl.

19 And all the people said unto Săm-ʿū-ĕl, Pray for thy servants unto the LORD thy God, that we die not: for we have added unto all our sins this evil, to ask us a king. 20 ¶ And Săm-ʿū-ĕl said unto the people, Fear not: ye have done all this wickedness: yet turn not aside from following the LORD, but serve the LORD with all your heart; 21 And turn ye not aside: for then should ye go after vain things, which cannot profit nor deliver; for they are vain.

22 For the LORD will not forsake his people for his great name's sake: because it hath pleased the LORD to make you his people.

23 Moreover as for me, God forbid that I should sin against the LORD in ceasing to pray for you: but I will teach you the good and the right way:

24 Only fear the LORD, and serve him in truth with all your heart: for consider how great *things* he hath done for you.

25 But if ye shall still do wickedly, ye shall be consumed, both ye and your king.

CHAPTER 13

SÂUL reigned one year; and when he had reigned two years over Ĭś-rā-ĕl,

2 Saul chose him three thousand men of Ĭś-rā-ĕl; whereof two thousand were with Saul in Mĭch-măsh and in mount Bĕth-ĕl, and a thousand were with

Jŏn-a-than in Gib-e-ah of Ben-ja-min: and the rest of the people he sent every man to his tent.

3 And Jŏn-a-than smote the garrison of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes that was in Gē-ba, and the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes heard of it. And Saul blew the trumpet throughout all the land, saying, Let the Hē-brēws hear.

4 And all Ĭśʻrā-ĕl heard say that Saul had smitten a garrison of the Phĭlʻīs-tīnes, and that Ĭśʻrā-ĕl also was had in abomination with the Phĭlʻīs-tīnes. And the people were called together after Saul to Gĭlʻgăl.

5 ¶ And the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes gathered themselves together to fight with Ĭś-rā-ĕl, thirty thousand chariots, and six thousand horsemen, and people as the sand which is on the sea shore in multitude: and they came up, and pitched in Mĭch-măsh, eastward from Bĕth-ā-vĕn.

6 When the men of Ĭśʻrā-ĕl saw that they were in a strait, (for the people were distressed,) then the people did hide themselves in caves, and in thickets, and in rocks, and in high places, and in pits.

7 And some of the Hē-brēws went over Jôr-dăn to the land of Găd and Gĭl-ĕ-ād. As for Saul, he was yet in Gĭl-găl, and all the people followed him trembling.

8 ¶ And he tarried seven days, according to the set time that Săm'-ū-ĕl had appointed: but

Săm'ū-ĕl came not to Gĭl'găl; and the people were scattered from him.

9 And Saul said, Bring hither a burnt offering to me, and peace offerings. And he offered the burnt offering.

10 And it came to pass, that as soon as he had made an end of offering the burnt offering, behold, Săm'ū-ĕl came; and Saul went out to meet him, that he might salute him.

11 ¶ And Săm'ū-ĕl said, What hast thou done? And Saul said, Because I saw that the people were scattered from me, and that thou camest not within the days appointed, and that the Phil-ĭs-tīnes gathered themselves together at Mĭch-măsh;

12 Therefore said I, The Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes will come down now upon me to Gĭl-găl, and I have not made supplication unto the LORD: I forced myself therefore, and offered a burnt offering.

13 And Săm'ū-ĕl said to Saul, Thou hast done foolishly: thou hast not kept the commandment of the LORD thy God, which he commanded thee: for now would the LORD have established thy kingdom upon Ĭś'rā-ĕl for ever.

14 But now thy kingdom shall not continue: the LORD hath sought him a man after his own heart, and the LORD hath commanded him to be captain over his people, because thou hast not kept that which the LORD commanded thee.

15 And Săm'ū-ĕl arose, and gat him up from Gĭl'găl unto Gĭb'ĕ-ăh of Bĕn'jă-mĭn. And Saul numbered the people *that were* present with him, about six hundred men.

16 And Saul, and Jŏn-ʿā-thăn his son, and the people that were present with them, abode in Gĭb-ʿĕ-āh of Bĕn-ʿjā-mĭn: but the Phĭl-ʿīs-tīnes encamped in Mĭch-ʿmāsh.

 $17 \overline{\P}$ And the spoilers came out of the camp of the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes in three companies: one company turned unto the way that leadeth to \check{O} ph-răh, unto the land of Shû-ăl:

18 And another company turned the way to Běth-hôr-ŏn: and another company turned to the way of the border that looketh to the valley of Zĕ-bō-ĭm toward the wilderness.

19 \P Now there was no smith found throughout all the land of Ĭśʻrā-ĕl: for the Phĭlʻĭs-tīnes said, Lest the Hēʻbr $\overline{\mathrm{ew}}$ s make them swords or spears:

20 But all the Ĭś-rā-ĕl-ītes went down to the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes, to sharpen every man his share, and his coulter, and his axe, and his mattock.

21 Yet they had a file for the mattocks, and for the coulters, and for the forks, and for the axes, and to sharpen the goads.

22 So it came to pass in the day of battle, that there was neither sword nor spear found in the hand of any of the people that were with Saul and Jŏn-a-thăn: but with Saul

and with Jŏn-´a-than his son was there found.

23 And the garrison of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes went out to the passage of Mĭch-măsh.

CHAPTER 14

Now it came to pass upon a day, that Jŏn-a-than the son of Saul said unto the young man that bare his armour, Come, and let us go over to the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes' garrison, that is on the other side. But he told not his father.

2 And Saul tarried in the uttermost part of Gib-e-ah under a pomegranate tree which is in Mig-ron: and the people that were with him were about six hundred men;

3 And Å-hī-áh, the son of Å-hī-tub, Ī-chā-bŏd's brother, the son of Phĭn-ĕ-hās, the son of Ē-lī, the LORD's priest in Shī-lōh, wearing an ē-phŏd. And the people knew not that Jŏn-ã-thăn was gone.

4 ¶ And between the passages, by which Jŏn-ʿā-thǎn sought to go over unto the Phǐl-ʿīs-tīnes' garrison, there was a sharp rock on the one side, and a sharp rock on the other side: and the name of the one was Bō-ʻzĕz, and the name of the other Sĕn-ʿēh.

5 The forefront of the one was situate northward over against Mĭch-măsh, and the other southward over against Gĭb-ĕ-ăh.

6 And Jŏn-a-than said to the young man that bare his armour, Come, and let us go over unto the garrison of these uncircumcised: it may be that the LORD will work for us: for *there is* no restraint to the LORD to save by many or by few.

7 And his armourbearer said unto him, Do all that *is* in thine heart: turn thee; behold, I *am* with thee according to thy heart.

8 Then said Jŏn-a-than, Behold, we will pass over unto *these* men, and we will discover ourselves unto them.

9 If they say thus unto us, Tarry until we come to you; then we will stand still in our place, and will not go up unto them.

10 But if they say thus, Come up unto us; then we will go up: for the LORD hath delivered them into our hand: and this *shall be* a sign unto us.

11 And both of them discovered themselves unto the garrison of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes: and the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes said, Behold, the Hē-ʿbrēws come forth out of the holes where they had hid themselves

12 And the men of the garrison answered Jŏn-ʿā-thǎn and his armourbearer, and said, Come up to us, and we will shew you a thing. And Jŏn-ʿā-thǎn said unto his armourbearer, Come up after me: for the LORD hath delivered them into the hand of Ĭś-rā-ĕl.

13 And Jŏn'ā-thăn climbed up upon his hands and upon his feet, and his armourbearer after him: and they fell before Jŏn'ā-thăn; and his armourbearer slew after

him.

14 And that first slaughter, which Jŏn-a-than and his armourbearer made, was about twenty men, within as it were an half acre of land, which a yoke of oxen might plow.

15 And there was trembling in the host, in the field, and among all the people: the garrison, and the spoilers, they also trembled, and the earth quaked: so it was a very great trembling.

16 And the watchmen of Saul in Gĭb-ĕ-ăh of Bĕn-jă-mĭn looked; and, behold, the multitude melted away, and they went on beating down *one another*.

17 Then said Saul unto the people that were with him, Number now, and see who is gone from us. And when they had numbered, behold, Jŏn-ʿā-thăn and his armourbearer were not there.

18 And Saul said unto Ă-hī-ăh, Bring hither the ark of God. For the ark of God was at that time with the children of Ĭs-rā-ĕl.

19 ¶ And it came to pass, while Saul talked unto the priest, that the noise that was in the host of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes went on and increased: and Saul said unto the priest, Withdraw thine hand.

20 And Saul and all the people that were with him assembled themselves, and they came to the battle: and, behold, every man's sword was against his fellow, and there was a very great discomfiture.

21 Moreover the Hē-brēws that were with the Phǐl-is-tīnes before that time, which went up with them into the camp from the country round about, even they also turned to be with the İs-rā-ĕl-ites that were with Saul and Jŏn-ă-thăn.

22 Likewise all the men of Ĭśʻrā-ĕl which had hid themselves in mount Ēʻphră-ĭm, when they heard that the Phĭlʻīs-tīnes fled, even they also followed hard after them in the battle.

23 So the LORD saved Ĭś'rā-ĕl that day: and the battle passed over unto Běth-ā'věn.

24 ¶ And the men of Ĭś-rā-ĕl were distressed that day: for Saul had adjured the people, saying, Cursed be the man that eateth any food until evening, that I may be avenged on mine enemies. So none of the people tasted any food.

25 And all *they of* the land came to a wood; and there was honey upon the ground.

26 And when the people were come into the wood, behold, the honey dropped; but no man put his hand to his mouth: for the people feared the oath.

27 But Jŏn'ā-thăn heard not when his father charged the people with the oath: wherefore he put forth the end of the rod that was in his hand, and dipped it in an honeycomb, and put his hand to his mouth; and his eyes were enlightened.

28 Then answered one of the people, and said, Thy father straitly charged the people with an oath, saying, Cursed *be* the man that eateth *any* food this day. And the people were faint.

29 Then said Jŏn-´ā-thăn, My father hath troubled the land: see, I pray you, how mine eyes have been enlightened, because I tasted a little of this honey.

30 How much more, if haply the people had eaten freely to day of the spoil of their enemies which they found? for had there not been now a much greater slaughter among the Phĭl-ĭs-tīneṡ?

31 And they smote the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes that day from Mĭch-măsh to Ai-jă-lŏn: and the people were very faint.

32 And the people flew upon the spoil, and took sheep, and oxen, and calves, and slew *them* on the ground: and the people did eat *them* with the blood.

33 ¶ Then they told Saul, saying, Behold, the people sin against the LORD, in that they eat with the blood. And he said, Ye have transgressed: roll a great stone unto me this day.

34 And Saul said, Disperse your-selves among the people, and say unto them, Bring me hither every man his ox, and every man his sheep, and slay them here, and eat; and sin not against the LORD in eating with the blood. And all the people brought every man his ox

with him that night, and slew them there.

35 And Saul built an altar unto the LORD: the same was the first altar that he built unto the LORD.

36 ¶ And Saul said, Let us go down after the Phǐl-ĭs-tīnes by night, and spoil them until the morning light, and let us not leave a man of them. And they said, Do whatsoever seemeth good unto thee. Then said the priest, Let us draw near hither unto God.

37 And Saul asked counsel of God, Shall I go down after the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes? wilt thou deliver them into the hand of Ĭs-rā-ĕl? But he answered him not that day.

38 And Saul said, Draw ye near hither, all the chief of the people: and know and see wherein this sin hath been this day.

39 For, as the LORD liveth, which saveth Ĭś-rā-ĕl, though it be in Jŏn-ă-thăn my son, he shall surely die. But there was not a man among all the people that answered him.

40 Then said he unto all Ĭś-rā-ĕl, Be ve on one side and I and

Be ye on one side, and I and Jŏn-ă-thăn my son will be on the other side. And the people said unto Saul, Do what seemeth good unto thee.

41 Therefore Saul said unto the LORD God of Ĭś-rā-ĕl, Give a perfect lot. And Saul and Jŏn-ă-thăn were taken: but the people escaped.

42 And Saul said, Cast *lots* between me and Jŏn-a-thăn my son. And Jŏn-a-thăn was taken.

43 Then Saul said to Jŏn-a-than,

Tell me what thou hast done. And Jŏn-ʿā-thăn told him, and said, I did but taste a little honey with the end of the rod that was in mine hand, and, lo, I must die.

44 And Saul answered, God do so and more also: for thou shalt surely die, Jŏn-a-thăn.

45 And the people said unto Saul, Shall Jŏn-a-than die, who hath wrought this great salvation in Iś-rā-ĕl? God forbid: as the LORD liveth, there shall not one hair of his head fall to the ground; for he hath wrought with God this day. So the people rescued Jŏn-a-than, that he died not.

46 Then Saul went up from following the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes: and the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes went to their own place.

47 ¶ So Saul took the kingdom over Ĭś-rā-ĕl, and fought against all his enemies on every side, against Mō-ăb, and against the children of Ăm-mon, and against Ē-dom, and against the kings of Zō-băh, and against the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes: and whithersoever he turned himself, he vexed *them*. 48 And he gathered an host, and smote the Ă-măl-ĕk-ītes, and delivered Ĭṣ-rā-ĕl out of the hands of them that spoiled them.

49 Now the sons of Saul were Jŏn-ʿa-than, and Ĭsh-ʿū-ī, and Mĕl-ʿchī-shû-ʿa: and the names of his two daughters were these; the name of the firstborn Mē-ʿrab, and the name of the younger Mī-ʿchal: 50 And the name of Saul's wife was

Ă-hĭn-ō-ăm, the daughter of Ă-hī-mă-ăz: and the name of the captain of his host was Ăb-nĕr, the son of Nĕr, Saul's uncle.

51 And Kĭsh was the father of Saul; and Nĕr the father of Ăb-nĕr was the son of Ă-bī-ĕl.

52 And there was sore war against the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes all the days of Saul: and when Saul saw any strong man, or any valiant man, he took him unto him.

CHAPTER 15

SĂM'Ū-ĒL also said unto Saul, The LORD sent me to anoint thee to be king over his people, over Ĭś'rā-ĕl: now therefore hearken thou unto the voice of the words of the LORD.

2 Thus saith the LORD of hosts, I remember that which Ăm-ă-lĕk did to Ĭś-rā-ĕl, how he laid wait for him in the way, when he came up from Ē-ġypt.

3 Now go and smite Ăm-ʿā-lek, and utterly destroy all that they have, and spare them not; but slay both man and woman, infant and suckling, ox and sheep, camel and ass.

4 And Saul gathered the people together, and numbered them in Tĕ-lā-ĭm, two hundred thousand footmen, and ten thousand men of Jûd-ah.

5 And Saul came to a city of Ăm-ă-lĕk, and laid wait in the valley.

6¶ And Saul said unto the Kē-'nītes, Go, depart, get you down from among the Ă-măl-'ĕk-ītes,

lest I destroy you with them: for ye shewed kindness to all the children of Ĭś-rā-ĕl, when they came up out of Ē-ġypt. So the Kē-nītes departed from among the Ă-măl-ĕk-ītes.

7 And Saul smote the Ă-măl-ĕk-ītes from Hăv-ĩ-läh until thou comest to Shur, that is over against Ē-ġypt.

8 And he took Ā'găg the king of the Ă-măl'ĕk-ītes alive, and utterly destroyed all the people with the edge of the sword.

9 But Saul and the people spared Ā'găg, and the best of the sheep, and of the oxen, and of the fatlings, and the lambs, and all that was good, and would not utterly destroy them: but every thing that was vile and refuse, that they destroyed utterly.

10 ¶ Then came the word of the LORD unto Săm'ū-ĕl, saying,

11 It repenteth me that I have set up Saul to be king: for he is turned back from following me, and hath not performed my commandments. And it grieved Săm'ū-ĕl; and he cried unto the LORD all night.

12 And when Săm'ū-ĕl rose early to meet Saul in the morning, it was told Săm'ū-ĕl, saying, Saul came to Cär'mĕl, and, behold, he set him up a place, and is gone about, and passed on, and gone down to Gĭl'găl.

13 And Săm'ū-ĕl came to Saul: and Saul said unto him, Blessed *be* thou of the LORD: I have

performed the commandment of the LORD.

14 And Săm'ū-ĕl said, What meaneth then this bleating of the sheep in mine ears, and the lowing of the oxen which I hear?
15 And Saul said, They have brought them from the Ă-măl'ĕk-ītes: for the people spared the best of the sheep and of the oxen, to sacrifice unto the LORD thy God; and the rest we have utterly destroyed.

16 Then Săm-u-ĕl said unto Saul, Stay, and I will tell thee what the LORD hath said to me this night. And he said unto him, Say on.

17 And Săm-ʿū-ĕl said, When thou wast little in thine own sight, wast thou not made the head of the tribes of Ĭś-ʿrā-ĕl, and the LORD anointed thee king over Ĭś-ʿrā-ĕl?
18 And the LORD sent thee on a journey, and said, Go and utterly destroy the sinners the Ă-măl-ʿĕk-ītes, and fight against them until they be consumed.

19 Wherefore then didst thou not obey the voice of the LORD, but didst fly upon the spoil, and didst evil in the sight of the LORD?

20 And Saul said unto Săm'ū-ĕl, Yea, I have obeyed the voice of the LORD, and have gone the way which the LORD sent me, and have brought Ā'găg the king of Ăm'ā-lĕk, and have utterly destroyed the Ă-măl'ēk-ītes.

21 But the people took of the spoil, sheep and oxen, the chief of the things which should have been utterly destroyed, to sacrifice unto the LORD thy God in Gĭl-găl. 22 And Săm-ū-ĕl said, Hath the LORD as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams.

23 For rebellion *is as* the sin of witchcraft, and stubbornness *is as* iniquity and idolatry. Because thou hast rejected the word of the LORD, he hath also rejected thee from *being* king.

24 ¶ And Saul said unto Săm'ū-ĕl, I have sinned: for I have transgressed the commandment of the LORD, and thy words: because I feared the people, and obeyed their voice.

25 Now therefore, I pray thee, pardon my sin, and turn again with me, that I may worship the LORD.

26 And Săm-u-ël said unto Saul, I will not return with thee: for thou hast rejected the word of the LORD, and the LORD hath rejected thee from being king over Ĭś-rā-ĕl. 27 And as Săm-u-ĕl turned about to go away, he laid hold upon the skirt of his mantle, and it rent.

28 And Săm'ū-ĕl said unto him, The LORD hath rent the kingdom of Ĭś'rā-ĕl from thee this day, and hath given it to a neighbour of thine, that is better than thou.

29 And also the Strength of Ĭś-rā-ĕl will not lie nor repent: for he is not a man, that he should repent.

30 Then he said, I have sinned: yet honour me now, I pray thee, before the elders of my people, and before Iš-rā-el, and turn again with me, that I may worship the LORD thy God.

31 So Săm'ū-ĕl turned again after Saul; and Saul worshipped the LORD.

32 ¶ Then said Săm'ū-ĕl, Bring ye hither to me Ā'găg the king of the Ă-măl'ĕk-ītes. And Ā'găg came unto him delicately. And Ā'găg said, Surely the bitterness of death is past.

33 And Săm-u-ël said, As thy sword hath made women childless, so shall thy mother be childless among women. And Săm-u-ël hewed Ā-gāg in pieces before the LORD in Gīl-gāl.

34 ¶ Then Săm'ū-ĕl went to Rā'măh; and Saul went up to his house to Gĭb'ĕ-ăh of Saul.

35 And Săm'ū-ĕl came no more to see Saul until the day of his death: nevertheless Săm'ū-ĕl mourned for Saul: and the LORD repented that he had made Saul king over Ĭś'rā-ĕl.

CHAPTER 16

AND the LORD said unto Săm'ū-ĕl, How long wilt thou mourn for Saul, seeing I have rejected him from reigning over Ĭś'rā-ĕl? fill thine horn with oil, and go, I will send thee to Jĕs'sĕ the Bĕth'lĕ-hĕ-mīte: for I have provided me a king among his sons.

2 And Săm'ū-ĕl said, How can I go?

if Saul hear it, he will kill me. And the LORD said, Take an heifer with thee, and say, I am come to sacrifice to the LORD.

3 And call Jĕs-sĕ to the sacrifice, and I will shew thee what thou shalt do: and thou shalt anoint unto me *him* whom I name unto thee.

4 And Săm'ū-ĕl did that which the LORD spake, and came to Bĕth'lĕ-hĕm. And the elders of the town trembled at his coming, and said, Comest thou peaceably?

5 And he said, Peaceably: I am come to sacrifice unto the LORD: sanctify yourselves, and come with me to the sacrifice. And he sanctified Jěs-sě and his sons, and called them to the sacrifice.

 $6\P$ And it came to pass, when they were come, that he looked on \bar{E} -lī-ab, and said, Surely the LORD's anointed is before him.

7 But the LORD said unto Săm'ū-ĕl, Look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because I have refused him: for the LORD seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the LORD looketh on the heart.

8 Then Jěs-sě called Å-bĭn-á-dáb, and made him pass before Săm-ū-ĕl. And he said, Neither hath the LORD chosen this.

9 Then Jes-se made Sham-mah to pass by. And he said, Neither hath the LORD chosen this.

10 Again, Jĕs-sĕ made seven of his sons to pass before Săm-ū-ĕl. And

Săm-ū-ĕl said unto Jĕs-sĕ, The LORD hath not chosen these.

11 And Săm-ʿū-ĕl said unto Jĕs-ʿsĕ, Are here all thy children? And he said, There remaineth yet the youngest, and, behold, he keepeth the sheep. And Săm-ʿū-ĕl said unto Jĕs-ʿsĕ, Send and fetch him: for we will not sit down till he come hither.

12 And he sent, and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, and withal of a beautiful countenance, and goodly to look to. And the LORD said, Arise, anoint him: for this is he

13 Then Săm'ū-ĕl took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the midst of his brethren: and the Spirit of the LORD came upon Dā-vĭd from that day forward. So Săm-ū-ĕl rose up, and went to Rā-măh.

14 ¶ But the Spirit of the LORD departed from Saul, and an evil spirit from the LORD troubled him. 15 And Saul's servants said unto him, Behold now, an evil spirit from God troubleth thee.

16 Let our lord now command thy servants, which are before thee, to seek out a man, who is a cunning player on an harp: and it shall come to pass, when the evil spirit from God is upon thee, that he shall play with his hand, and thou shalt be well.

17 And Saul said unto his servants, Provide me now a man that can play well, and bring him to me.

18 Then answered one of the servants, and said, Behold, I have

seen a son of Jěs'sě the Běth'-lě-hě-mīte, that is cunning in playing, and a mighty valiant man, and a man of war, and prudent in matters, and a comely person, and the LORD is with him. 19 ¶ Wherefore Saul sent messengers unto Jěs'sě, and said, Send me Dā'vĭd thy son, which is with the sheep.

20 And Jes-se took an ass laden with bread, and a bottle of wine, and a kid, and sent them by Dā-vid his son unto Saul.

21 And Dā-vid came to Saul, and stood before him: and he loved him greatly; and he became his armourbearer.

22 And Saul sent to Jěs-se, saying, Let Dā-vid, I pray thee, stand before me; for he hath found favour in my sight.

23 And it came to pass, when the *evil* spirit from God was upon Saul, that Dā-vĭd took an harp, and played with his hand: so Saul was refreshed, and was well, and the evil spirit departed from him.

CHAPTER 17

Now the Phǐl-ĭs-tīnes gathered together their armies to battle, and were gathered together at Shō-chōh, which belongeth to Jûd-ăh, and pitched between Shō-chōh and Ă-zē-kăh, in Ē-phěs-dăm-mĭm.

2 And Saul and the men of Ĭś-rā-ĕl were gathered together, and pitched by the valley of Ē-lāh, and set the battle in array against the Phĭl-ĭs-tīneś.

3 And the Phǐl-ĭs-tīnes stood on a mountain on the one side, and Ĭs-rā-ĕl stood on a mountain on the other side: and *there was* a valley between them.

4 ¶ And there went out a champion out of the camp of the Phil-ĭs-tīnes, named Gō-lī-ath, of Gath, whose height was six cubits and a span.

5 And he had an helmet of brass upon his head, and he was armed with a coat of mail; and the weight of the coat was five thousand shē-kěls of brass.

6 And *he had* greaves of brass upon his legs, and a target of brass between his shoulders.

7 And the staff of his spear was like a weaver's beam; and his spear's head weighed six hundred shē'kěls of iron: and one bearing a shield went before him.

8 And he stood and cried unto the armies of Ĭśʻrā-ĕl, and said unto them, Why are ye come out to set your battle in array? am not I a Phĭl-ĭs-tīne, and ye servants to Saul? choose you a man for you, and let him come down to me.

9 If he be able to fight with me, and to kill me, then will we be your servants: but if I prevail against him, and kill him, then shall ye be our servants, and serve

10 And the Phǐl-ĩs-tīne said, I defy the armies of Ĭś-rā-ĕl this day; give me a man, that we may fight together.

11 When Saul and all Ĭś-rā-ĕl

heard those words of the Phil-is-tine, they were dismayed, and greatly afraid.

12 ¶ Now Dā-vid was the son of that Ĕph-rā-thīte of Bĕth-lĕ-hĕm-jû-dăh, whose name was Jĕs-sĕ; and he had eight sons: and the man went among men for an old man in the days of Saul.

13 And the three eldest sons of Jes'se went and followed Saul to the battle: and the names of his three sons that went to the battle were E-li-ab the firstborn, and next unto him A-bin-a-dab, and the third Sham-mah.

14 And Dā-vid was the youngest: and the three eldest followed Saul. 15 But Dā-vid went and returned from Saul to feed his father's sheep at Běth-lě-hěm.

16 And the Phǐl-ĭs-tīne drew near morning and evening, and presented himself forty days.

17 And Jěs-sě said unto Dā-vǐd his son, Take now for thy brethren an ē-phäh of this parched *corn*, and these ten loaves, and run to the camp to thy brethren;

18 And carry these ten cheeses unto the captain of *their* thousand, and look how thy brethren fare, and take their pledge.

19 Now Saul, and they, and all the men of Ĭś-rā-ĕl, were in the valley of Ē-lāh, fighting with the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes.

20 ¶ And Dā'vĭd rose up early in the morning, and left the sheep with a keeper, and took, and went, as Jĕs'sĕ had commanded him; and he came to the trench, as the host was going forth to the fight, and shouted for the battle.

21 For Ĭś-rā-ĕl and the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes had put the battle in array, army against army.

22 And Dā'vĭd left his carriage in the hand of the keeper of the carriage, and ran into the army, and came and saluted his brethren.

23 And as he talked with them, behold, there came up the champion, the Phĭl-ĭs-tīne of Găth, Gō-lī-ʿāth by name, out of the armies of the Phĭl-ʿīs-tīnes, and spake according to the same words: and Dā-ʿvĭd heard them.

24 And all the men of Ĭś-rā-ĕl, when they saw the man, fled from him, and were sore afraid.

25 And the men of Ĭś-rā-ĕl said, Have ye seen this man that is come up? surely to defy Ĭś-rā-ĕl is he come up: and it shall be, that the man who killeth him, the king will enrich him with great riches, and will give him his daughter, and make his father's house free in Ĭś-rā-ĕl.

26 And Dā-vid spake to the men that stood by him, saying, What shall be done to the man that killeth this Phil-is-tīne, and taketh away the reproach from is-rā-el? for who is this uncircumcised Phil-is-tīne, that he should defy the armies of the living God?

27 And the people answered him after this manner, saying, So shall it be done to the man that killeth

him.

28 \P And \bar{E} -lī-ab his eldest brother heard when he spake unto the men; and \bar{E} -lī-ab's anger was kindled against Dā-vid, and he said, Why camest thou down hither? and with whom hast thou left those few sheep in the wilderness? I know thy pride, and the naughtiness of thine heart; for thou art come down that thou mightest see the battle.

29 And Dā'vĭd said, What have I now done? *Is there* not a cause?

30 ¶ And he turned from him toward another, and spake after the same manner: and the people answered him again after the former manner.

31 And when the words were heard which Dā'vĭd spake, they rehearsed them before Saul: and he sent for him.

32 ¶ And Dā'vĭd said to Saul, Let no man's heart fail because of him; thy servant will go and fight with this Phĭl-ĩs-tīne.

33 And Saul said to Dā-vĭd, Thou art not able to go against this Phĭl-ĭs-tīne to fight with him: for thou art but a youth, and he a man of war from his youth.

34 And Dā'vĭd said unto Saul, Thy servant kept his father's sheep, and there came a lion, and a bear, and took a lamb out of the flock:

35 And I went out after him, and smote him, and delivered *it* out of his mouth: and when he arose against me, I caught *him* by his beard, and smote him, and slew

him.

36 Thy servant slew both the lion and the bear: and this uncircumcised Phǐl-ĭs-tīne shall be as one of them, seeing he hath defied the armies of the living God.

37 Dā'vĭd said moreover, The LORD that delivered me out of the paw of the lion, and out of the paw of the bear, he will deliver me out of the hand of this Phĭl-ĭs-tīne. And Saul said unto Dā'vĭd, Go, and the LORD be with thee.

38 ¶ And Saul armed Dā'vĭd with his armour, and he put an helmet of brass upon his head; also he armed him with a coat of mail.

39 And Dā-vid girded his sword upon his armour, and he assayed to go; for he had not proved it. And Dā-vid said unto Saul, I cannot go with these; for I have not proved them. And Dā-vid put them off him.

40 And he took his staff in his hand, and chose him five smooth stones out of the brook, and put them in a shepherd's bag which he had, even in a scrip; and his sling was in his hand: and he drew near to the Phĭl-ĭs-tīne.

41 And the Phǐl-ĭs-tīne came on and drew near unto Dā'vĭd; and the man that bare the shield went before him.

42 And when the Phǐl-ĩs-tīne looked about, and saw Dā-vǐd, he disdained him: for he was *but* a youth, and ruddy, and of a fair countenance.

43 And the Phǐl-ĭs-tīne said unto Dā-vĭd, Am I a dog, that thou comest to me with staves? And the Phǐl-ĭs-tīne cursed Dā-vĭd by his gods.

44 And the Phǐl-ĩs-tīne said to Dā-vĭd, Come to me, and I will give thy flesh unto the fowls of the air, and to the beasts of the field.

45 Then said Dā-vǐd to the Phǐl-îs-tīne, Thou comest to me with a sword, and with a spear, and with a shield: but I come to thee in the name of the LORD of hosts, the God of the armies of Ĭś-rā-ĕl, whom thou hast defied.

46 This day will the LORD deliver thee into mine hand; and I will smite thee, and take thine head from thee; and I will give the carcases of the host of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes this day unto the fowls of the air, and to the wild beasts of the earth; that all the earth may know that there is a God in Ĭs-rā-ĕl.

47 And all this assembly shall know that the LORD saveth not with sword and spear: for the battle *is* the LORD's, and he will give you into our hands.

48 And it came to pass, when the Phĭl-ĭs-tīne arose, and came and drew nigh to meet Dā-vĭd, that Dā-vĭd hasted, and ran toward the army to meet the Phĭl-ĭs-tīne.

49 And Dā-vid put his hand in his bag, and took thence a stone, and slang *it*, and smote the Phil-is-tine in his forehead, that the stone sunk into his forehead: and he fell

upon his face to the earth.

50 So Dā-vid prevailed over the Phil-is-tīne with a sling and with a stone, and smote the Phil-is-tīne, and slew him; but *there was* no sword in the hand of Dā-vid.

51 Therefore Dā'vĭd ran, and stood upon the Phǐl-ĭs-tīne, and took his sword, and drew it out of the sheath thereof, and slew him, and cut off his head therewith. And when the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes saw their champion was dead, they fled.

52 And the men of Ĭš-rā-ĕl and of Jûd-ăh arose, and shouted, and pursued the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes, until thou come to the valley, and to the gates of Ĕk-rŏn. And the wounded of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes fell down by the way to Shā-ă-rā-ĭm, even unto Găth, and unto Ĕk-rŏn.

53 And the children of Ĭś-rā-ĕl returned from chasing after the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes, and they spoiled their tents.

54 And Dā'vĭd took the head of the Phĭl'is-tīne, and brought it to Jĕ-rû'să-lĕm; but he put his armour in his tent.

55 ¶ And when Saul saw Dā'vĭd go forth against the Phǐl-ĭs-tīne, he said unto Ăb-nĕr, the captain of the host, Ăb-nĕr, whose son is this youth? And Ăb-nĕr said, As thy soul liveth, O king, I cannot tell.

56 And the king said, Inquire thou whose son the stripling *is*.

57 And as Dā-vid returned from the slaughter of the Phil-is-tine, Ăb-nĕr took him, and brought him before Saul with the head of the

Phĭl-ĭs-tīne in his hand.

58 And Saul said to him, Whose son *art* thou, *thou* young man? And Dā-vĭd answered, *I am* the son of thy servant Jĕs-sĕ the Bĕth-lĕ-mīte.

CHAPTER 18

And it came to pass, when he had made an end of speaking unto Saul, that the soul of Jŏn'ā-thăn was knit with the soul of Dā'vĭd, and Jŏn'ā-thăn loved him as his own soul.

2 And Saul took him that day, and would let him go no more home to his father's house.

3 Then Jŏn-´a-than and Dā-´vid made a covenant, because he loved him as his own soul.

4 And Jŏn-a-thăn stripped himself of the robe that was upon him, and gave it to Dā-vĭd, and his garments, even to his sword, and to his bow, and to his girdle.

5 ¶ And Dā-vid went out whither-soever Saul sent him, and behaved himself wisely: and Saul set him over the men of war, and he was accepted in the sight of all the people, and also in the sight of Saul's servants.

6 And it came to pass as they came, when Dā'vĭd was returned from the slaughter of the Phĭl'īs-tīne, that the women came out of all cities of Ĭs'rā-ĕl, singing and dancing, to meet king Saul, with tabrets, with joy, and with instruments of musick.

7 And the women answered one another as they played, and said,

Saul hath slain his thousands, and Dā-vĭd his ten thousands.

8 And Saul was very wroth, and the saying displeased him; and he said, They have ascribed unto Dā-vĭd ten thousands, and to me they have ascribed but thousands: and what can he have more but the kingdom?

9 And Saul eyed Dā-vĭd from that day and forward.

10 ¶ And it came to pass on the morrow, that the evil spirit from God came upon Saul, and he prophesied in the midst of the house: and Dā-vĭd played with his hand, as at other times: and *there was* a javelin in Saul's hand.

11 And Saul cast the javelin; for he said, I will smite Dā-vǐd even to the wall with it. And Dā-vǐd avoided out of his presence twice. 12 ¶ And Saul was afraid of Dā-vǐd, because the LORD was with him, and was departed from Saul.

13 Therefore Saul removed him from him, and made him his captain over a thousand; and he went out and came in before the people.

14 And Dā'vĭd behaved himself wisely in all his ways; and the LORD was with him.

15 Wherefore when Saul saw that he behaved himself very wisely, he was afraid of him.

16 But all Ĭś-rā-ĕl and Jûd-ăh loved Dā-vĭd, because he went out and came in before them.

17 ¶ And Saul said to Dā'vĭd, Behold my elder daughter Mē'răb, her will I give thee to wife: only be thou valiant for me, and fight the LORD'S battles. For Saul said, Let not mine hand be upon him, but let the hand of the Phǐl-ĭs-tīnes be upon him.

18 And Dā-vid said unto Saul, Who am I? and what is my life, or my father's family in Ĭs-rā-el, that I should be son in law to the king? 19 But it came to pass at the time when Mē-rāb Saul's daughter should have been given to Dā-vid, that she was given unto Ā-drī-el the Mē-hō-lā-thīte to wife.

20 And Mī-chăl Saul's daughter loved Dā-vid: and they told Saul, and the thing pleased him.

21 And Saul said, I will give him her, that she may be a snare to him, and that the hand of the Phil-ĭs-tīnes may be against him. Wherefore Saul said to Dā-vid, Thou shalt this day be my son in law in the one of the twain.

22 ¶ And Saul commanded his servants, saying, Commune with Dā-vid secretly, and say, Behold, the king hath delight in thee, and all his servants love thee: now therefore be the king's son in law. 23 And Saul's servants spake those words in the ears of Dā-vid. And Dā-vid said, Seemeth it to you a light thing to be a king's son in law, seeing that I am a poor man, and lightly esteemed?

24 And the servants of Saul told him, saying, On this manner spake Dā-vĭd.

25 And Saul said, Thus shall ye say

to Dā-vid, The king desireth not any dowry, but an hundred foreskins of the Phil-is-tīnes, to be avenged of the king's enemies. But Saul thought to make Dā-vid fall by the hand of the Phil-is-tīnes.

26 And when his servants told Dā-vĭd these words, it pleased Dā-vĭd well to be the king's son in law: and the days were not expired.

27 Wherefore Dā'vĭd arose and went, he and his men, and slew of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes two hundred men; and Dā'vĭd brought their foreskins, and they gave them in full tale to the king, that he might be the king's son in law. And Saul gave him Mī'chăl his daughter to wife.

28 ¶ And Saul saw and knew that the LORD was with Dā-vid, and that Mī-chăl Saul's daughter loved him.

29 And Saul was yet the more afraid of Dā-vĭd; and Saul became Dā-vĭd's enemy continually.

30 Then the princes of the Phǐl-ĭs-tīnes went forth: and it came to pass, after they went forth, that Dā'vĭd behaved himself more wisely than all the servants of Saul; so that his name was much set by.

CHAPTER 19

AND Saul spake to Jŏn-a-than his son, and to all his servants, that they should kill Dā-vid.

2 But Jŏn-´a-thăn Saul's son delighted much in Dā-´vĭd: and

Jŏn-a-than told Dā-vid, saying, Saul my father seeketh to kill thee: now therefore, I pray thee, take heed to thyself until the morning, and abide in a secret place, and hide thyself:

3 And I will go out and stand beside my father in the field where thou *art*, and I will commune with my father of thee; and what I see, that I will tell thee. 4 ¶ And Jŏn-ã-thăn spake good of Dā-vĭd unto Saul his father, and said unto him, Let not the king sin against his servant, against Dā-vĭd; because he hath not sinned against thee, and because his works *have been* to thee-ward very good:

5 For he did put his life in his hand, and slew the Phǐl-ĩs-tīne, and the LORD wrought a great salvation for all Ĭś-rā-ĕl: thou sawest *it*, and didst rejoice: wherefore then wilt thou sin against innocent blood, to slay Dā-vĭd without a cause?

6 And Saul hearkened unto the voice of Jŏn-a-than: and Saul sware, As the LORD liveth, he shall not be slain.

7 And Jŏn-a-than called Dā-vid, and Jŏn-a-than shewed him all those things. And Jŏn-a-than brought Dā-vid to Saul, and he was in his presence, as in times past.

8 ¶ And there was war again: and Dā-vĭd went out, and fought with the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes, and slew them with a great slaughter; and they fled from him.

9 And the evil spirit from the LORD was upon Saul, as he sat in his house with his javelin in his hand: and Dā-vid played with his hand.

10 And Saul sought to smite Dā-vǐd even to the wall with the javelin; but he slipped away out of Saul's presence, and he smote the javelin into the wall: and Dā-vǐd fled, and escaped that night.

11 Saul also sent messengers unto Dā-vĭd's house, to watch him, and to slay him in the morning: and Mī-chăl Dā-vĭd's wife told him, saying, If thou save not thy life to night, to morrow thou shalt be slain.

12 ¶ So Mī-chăl let Dā-vĭd down through a window: and he went, and fled, and escaped.

13 And Mī-chăl took an image, and laid *it* in the bed, and put a pillow of goats' *hair* for his bolster, and covered *it* with a cloth.

14 And when Saul sent messengers to take Dā-vĭd, she said, He is sick.

15 And Saul sent the messengers again to see Dā-vid, saying, Bring him up to me in the bed, that I may slay him.

16 And when the messengers were come in, behold, *there was* an image in the bed, with a pillow of goats' *hair* for his bolster.

17 And Saul said unto Mī-chăl, Why hast thou deceived me so, and sent away mine enemy, that he is escaped? And Mī-chăl answered Saul, He said unto me, Let me go; why should I kill thee?

18 ¶ So Dā-vĭd fled, and escaped, and came to Săm-ū-ĕl to Rā-măh, and told him all that Saul had done to him. And he and Săm-ū-ĕl went and dwelt in Nai-ōth.

19 And it was told Saul, saying, Behold, Dā-vĭd *is* at Nai-ōth in Rā-măh.

20 And Saul sent messengers to take Dā-vǐd: and when they saw the company of the prophets prophesying, and Săm-ū-ĕl standing as appointed over them, the Spirit of God was upon the messengers of Saul, and they also prophesied.

21 And when it was told Saul, he sent other messengers, and they prophesied likewise. And Saul sent messengers again the third time, and they prophesied also.

22 Then went he also to Rā'măh, and came to a great well that is in Sē'chû: and he asked and said, Where are Săm'ū-ĕl and Dā'vĭd? And one said, Behold, they be at Nāi'ōth in Rā'măh.

23 And he went thither to Nai-oth in Rā-māh: and the Spirit of God was upon him also, and he went on, and prophesied, until he came to Nai-oth in Rā-māh.

24 And he stripped off his clothes also, and prophesied before Săm'ū-ĕl in like manner, and lay down naked all that day and all that night. Wherefore they say, Is Saul also among the prophets?

CHAPTER 20 A ND Dā-́vĭd fled from Nai-́ōth in Rā-́măh, and came and said before Jŏn'ā-thăn, What have I done? what is mine iniquity? and what is my sin before thy father, that he seeketh my life?

2 And he said unto him, God forbid; thou shalt not die: behold, my father will do nothing either great or small, but that he will shew it me: and why should my father hide this thing from me? it is not so.

3 And Dā-vid sware moreover, and said, Thy father certainly knoweth that I have found grace in thine eyes; and he saith, Let not Jŏn-ă-thăn know this, lest he be grieved: but truly as the LORD liveth, and as thy soul liveth, there is but a step between me and death.

4 Then said Jŏn'ā-thăn unto Dā'vĭd, Whatsoever thy soul desireth, I will even do it for thee. 5 And Dā'vĭd said unto Jŏn'ā-thăn, Behold, to morrow is the new moon, and I should not fail to sit with the king at meat: but let me go, that I may hide myself in the field unto the third day at even.

6 If thy father at all miss me, then say, Dā-vǐd earnestly asked *leave* of me that he might run to Běth-lě-hěm his city: for *there is* a yearly sacrifice there for all the family.

7 If he say thus, *It is* well; thy servant shall have peace: but if he be very wroth, *then* be sure that evil is determined by him.

8 Therefore thou shalt deal kindly with thy servant; for thou hast brought thy servant into a

covenant of the LORD with thee: notwithstanding, if there be in me iniquity, slay me thyself; for why shouldest thou bring me to thy father?

9 And Jŏn'ā-thăn said, Far be it from thee: for if I knew certainly that evil were determined by my father to come upon thee, then would not I tell it thee?

10 Then said Dā'vĭd to Jŏn'ā-thăn, Who shall tell me? or what *if* thy father answer thee roughly?

11 ¶ And Jŏn-ã-thăn said unto Dā-vĭd, Come, and let us go out into the field. And they went out both of them into the field.

12 And Jŏn-a-than said unto Dā-vid, O LORD God of Ĭs-rā-el, when I have sounded my father about to morrow any time, or the third day, and, behold, if there be good toward Dā-vid, and I then send not unto thee, and shew it thee;

13 The LORD do so and much more to Jŏn-ʿā-thăn: but if it please my father to do thee evil, then I will shew it thee, and send thee away, that thou mayest go in peace: and the LORD be with thee, as he hath been with my father.

14 And thou shalt not only while yet I live shew me the kindness of the LORD, that I die not:

15 But *also* thou shalt not cut off thy kindness from my house for ever: no, not when the LORD hath cut off the enemies of Dā-vid every one from the face of the earth.

16 So Jŏn-ʿa-than made a covenant with the house of Dā-ʿvid, saying, Let the LORD even require it at the hand of Dā-ʿvid's enemies.

17 And Jŏnʻa-thăn caused Dāʻvĭd to swear again, because he loved him: for he loved him as he loved his own soul.

18 Then Jŏn'ā-thăn said to Dā'vĭd, To morrow *is* the new moon: and thou shalt be missed, because thy seat will be empty.

19 And when thou hast stayed three days, then thou shalt go down quickly, and come to the place where thou didst hide thyself when the business was in hand, and shalt remain by the stone Ē-zel.

20 And I will shoot three arrows on the side *thereof*, as though I shot at a mark.

21 And, behold, I will send a lad, saying, Go, find out the arrows. If I expressly say unto the lad, Behold, the arrows are on this side of thee, take them; then come thou: for there is peace to thee, and no hurt; as the LORD liveth.

22 But if I say thus unto the young man, Behold, the arrows *are* beyond thee; go thy way: for the LORD hath sent thee away.

23 And as touching the matter which thou and I have spoken of, behold, the LORD be between thee and me for ever.

 $24\,\P$ So Dā-vid hid himself in the field: and when the new moon was come, the king sat him down to eat meat.

25 And the king sat upon his seat, as at other times, even upon a seat by the wall: and Jŏn-´ā-thăn arose, and Ăb-´nĕr sat by Saul's side, and Dā-´vĭd's place was empty.

26 Nevertheless Saul spake not any thing that day: for he thought, Something hath befallen him, he is not clean; surely he is not clean. 27 And it came to pass on the morrow, which was the second day of the month, that Dā-vid's place was empty: and Saul said unto Jŏn-ă-thăn his son, Wherefore cometh not the son of Jĕs-sĕ to meat, neither yesterday, nor to day?

28 And Jŏn-´a-thăn answered Saul, Dā-´vĭd earnestly asked *leave* of me to go to Bĕth-´lĕ-hĕm:

29 And he said, Let me go, I pray thee; for our family hath a sacrifice in the city; and my brother, he hath commanded me to be there: and now, if I have found favour in thine eyes, let me get away, I pray thee, and see my brethren. Therefore he cometh not unto the king's table.

30 Then Saul's anger was kindled against Jŏn-ʿā-thăn, and he said unto him, Thou son of the perverse rebellious woman, do not I know that thou hast chosen the son of Jĕs-ʿsĕ to thine own confusion, and unto the confusion of thy mother's nakedness?

31 For as long as the son of Jěs´sě liveth upon the ground, thou shalt not be established, nor thy kingdom. Wherefore now send

and fetch him unto me, for he shall surely die.

32 And Jŏn-a-than answered Saul his father, and said unto him, Wherefore shall he be slain? what hath he done?

33 And Saul cast a javelin at him to smite him: whereby Jŏn-a-than knew that it was determined of his father to slay Dā-vĭd.

34 So Jŏn-a-than arose from the table in fierce anger, and did eat no meat the second day of the month: for he was grieved for Dā-vid, because his father had done him shame.

35 ¶ And it came to pass in the morning, that Jŏn-ʻa-than went out into the field at the time appointed with Dā-ʻvĭd, and a little lad with him.

36 And he said unto his lad, Run, find out now the arrows which I shoot. *And* as the lad ran, he shot an arrow beyond him.

37 And when the lad was come to the place of the arrow which Jŏn-a-than had shot, Jŏn-a-than cried after the lad, and said, *Is* not the arrow beyond thee?

38 And Jŏn-´ā-thăn cried after the lad, Make speed, haste, stay not. And Jŏn-´ā-thăn's lad gathered up the arrows, and came to his master.

39 But the lad knew not any thing: only Jŏn-ã-thăn and Dā-vĭd knew the matter.

40 And Jŏn-´a-than gave his artillery unto his lad, and said unto him, Go, carry them to the

city.

41 \P *And* as soon as the lad was gone, $D\bar{a}$ -vĭd arose out of *a place* toward the south, and fell on his face to the ground, and bowed himself three times: and they kissed one another, and wept one with another, until $D\bar{a}$ -vĭd exceeded.

42 And Jŏnʻa-thăn said to Dāʻvĭd, Go in peace, forasmuch as we have sworn both of us in the name of the LORD, saying, The LORD be between me and thee, and between my seed and thy seed for ever. And he arose and departed: and Jŏnʻa-thăn went into the city.

CHAPTER 21

THEN came Dā-vid to Nöb to A-him-ĕ-lĕch the priest: and A-him-ĕ-lĕch was afraid at the meeting of Dā-vid, and said unto him, Why art thou alone, and no man with thee?

2 And Dā-vid said unto Ă-him-ĕ-lĕch the priest, The king hath commanded me a business, and hath said unto me, Let no man know any thing of the business whereabout I send thee, and what I have commanded thee: and I have appointed my servants to such and such a place.

3 Now therefore what is under thine hand? give *me* five *loaves of* bread in mine hand, or what there is present.

4 And the priest answered Dā'vǐd, and said, *There is* no common bread under mine hand, but there is hallowed bread; if the young

men have kept themselves at least from women.

5 And Dā-vid answered the priest, and said unto him, Of a truth women have been kept from us about these three days, since I came out, and the vessels of the young men are holy, and the bread is in a manner common, yea, though it were sanctified this day in the vessel.

6 So the priest gave him hallowed bread: for there was no bread there but the shewbread, that was taken from before the LORD, to put hot bread in the day when it was taken away.

7 Now a certain man of the servants of Saul was there that day, detained before the LORD; and his name was Dō´eg, an Ē′dom-īte, the chiefest of the herdmen that belonged to Saul.

8 ¶ And Dā-vĭd said unto Ă-hĭm-ĕ-lĕch, And is there not here under thine hand spear or sword? for I have neither brought my sword nor my weapons with me, because the king's business required haste.

9 And the priest said, The sword of Gō-lī-ath the Phĭl-ĭs-tīne, whom thou slewest in the valley of Ē-lāh, behold, it is here wrapped in a cloth behind the ē-phŏd: if thou wilt take that, take it: for there is no other save that here. And Dā-vĭd said, There is none like that; give it me.

10 ¶ And Dā'vĭd arose, and fled that day for fear of Saul, and went

to Ā-chĭsh the king of Găth.

11 And the servants of Ā-chĭsh said unto him, *Is* not this Dā-vĭd the king of the land? did they not sing one to another of him in dances, saying, Saul hath slain his thousands, and Dā-vĭd his ten thousands?

12 And Dā'vĭd laid up these words in his heart, and was sore afraid of Ā'chĭsh the king of Găth.

13 And he changed his behaviour before them, and feigned himself mad in their hands, and scrabbled on the doors of the gate, and let his spittle fall down upon his heard.

14 Then said Ā'chĭsh unto his servants, Lo, ye see the man is mad: wherefore *then* have ye brought him to me?

15 Have I need of mad men, that ye have brought this *fellow* to play the mad man in my presence? shall this *fellow* come into my house?

CHAPTER 22

 $\mathbf{D}^{\text{A'VID}}$ therefore departed thence, and escaped to the cave A-dŭl'l and when his brethren and all his father's house heard it, they went down thither to him.

2 And every one that was in distress, and every one that was in debt, and every one that was discontented, gathered themselves unto him; and he became a captain over them: and there were with him about four hundred men.

3 ¶ And Dā-vid went thence to Miz-pēh of Mō-ab: and he said unto the king of Mō-ab, Let my father and my mother, I pray thee, come forth, and be with you, till I know what God will do for me.

4 And he brought them before the king of Mō-ab: and they dwelt with him all the while that Dā-vid was in the hold.

5 ¶ And the prophet Găd said unto Dā-vĭd, Abide not in the hold; depart, and get thee into the land of Jûd-ăh. Then Dā-vĭd departed, and came into the forest of Hâr-eth.

6 ¶ When Saul heard that Dā'vĭd was discovered, and the men that were with him, (now Saul abode in Gĭb'ĕ-ăh under a tree in Rā'măh, having his spear in his hand, and all his servants were standing about him;)

7 Then Saul said unto his servants that stood about him, Hear now, ye Běn-'jă-mītes; will the son of Jěs-'sĕ give every one of you fields and vineyards, and make you all captains of thousands, and captains of hundreds;

8 That all of you have conspired against me, and *there is* none that sheweth me that my son hath made a league with the son of Jĕs´sĕ, and *there is* none of you that is sorry for me, or sheweth unto me that my son hath stirred up my servant against me, to lie in wait, as at this day?

9 \P Then answered Dō'ĕg the Ē'dom-īte, which was set over the

servants of Saul, and said, I saw the son of Jěs-sě coming to Nŏb, to Ă-hǐm-ě-lěch the son of Ă-hī-tŭb. 10 And he inquired of the LORD for him, and gave him victuals, and gave him the sword of Gō-lī-ăth the Phǐl-ĭs-tīne.

11 Then the king sent to call Ă-hĭm-'ĕ-lĕch the priest, the son of Ă-hī-'tŭb, and all his father's house, the priests that were in Nŏb: and they came all of them to the king.

12 And Saul said, Hear now, thou son of Ă-hī-tŭb. And he answered, Here I am, my lord.

13 And Saul said unto him, Why have ye conspired against me, thou and the son of Jěs-sě, in that thou hast given him bread, and a sword, and hast inquired of God for him, that he should rise against me, to lie in wait, as at this day?

14 Then Ă-hĭm'ĕ-lĕch answered the king, and said, And who *is so* faithful among all thy servants as Dā'vĭd, which is the king's son in law, and goeth at thy bidding, and is honourable in thine house?

15 Did I then begin to inquire of God for him? be it far from me: let not the king impute *any* thing unto his servant, *nor* to all the house of my father: for thy servant knew nothing of all this, less or more.

16 And the king said, Thou shalt surely die, Ă-hĭm-ĕ-lĕch, thou, and all thy father's house.

17 ¶ And the king said unto the

footmen that stood about him, Turn, and slay the priests of the LORD; because their hand also is with $D\bar{a}'v\bar{v}d$, and because they knew when he fled, and did not shew it to me. But the servants of the king would not put forth their hand to fall upon the priests of the LORD.

18 And the king said to Dō-ĕg, Turn thou, and fall upon the priests. And Dō-ĕg the Ē-dom-īte turned, and he fell upon the priests, and slew on that day fourscore and five persons that did wear a linen ē-phŏd.

19 And Nŏb, the city of the priests, smote he with the edge of the sword, both men and women, children and sucklings, and oxen, and asses, and sheep, with the edge of the sword.

20 ¶ And one of the sons of Ă-hĭm'ĕ-lĕch the son of Ă-hī'tŭb, named Ă-bī'ā-thär, escaped, and fled after Dā'vĭd.

21 And Ă-bī-ă-thär shewed Dā-vĭd that Saul had slain the LORD's priests.

22 And Dā'vĭd said unto Ă-bī'ā-thär, I knew *it* that day, when Dō'ĕg the Ē'dom-īte was there, that he would surely tell Saul: I have occasioned *the death* of all the persons of thy father's house.

23 Abide thou with me, fear not: for he that seeketh my life seeketh thy life: but with me thou *shalt be* in safeguard.

CHAPTER 23

THEN they told Dā-vǐd, saying, Behold, the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes fight against Kē-ī-lăh, and they rob the threshingfloors.

2 Therefore Dā'vĭd inquired of the LORD, saying, Shall I go and smite these Phĭl'īs-tīnes? And the LORD said unto Dā'vĭd, Go, and smite the Phĭl'īs-tīnes, and save Kē-ī'lăh.

3 And Dā'vid's men said unto him, Behold, we be afraid here in Jûd'ăh: how much more then if we come to Kē-ī'lăh against the armies of the Phĭl'īs-tīnes'?

4 Then Dā'vĭd inquired of the LORD yet again. And the LORD answered him and said, Arise, go down to Kē-ī-lăh; for I will deliver the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes into thine hand.

5 So Dā-vǐd and his men went to Kē-ī-lāh, and fought with the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes, and brought away their cattle, and smote them with a great slaughter. So Dā-vǐd saved the inhabitants of Kē-ī-lāh.

6 And it came to pass, when Ă-bī-ă-thär the son of Ă-hĭm-ĕ-lĕch fled to Dā-vĭd to Kē-ī-lāh, that he came down with an ē-phŏd in his hand.

7¶ And it was told Saul that Dā-vĭd was come to Kē-ī-lāh. And Saul said, God hath delivered him into mine hand; for he is shut in, by entering into a town that hath gates and bars.

8 And Saul called all the people together to war, to go down to Kē-ī-lah, to besiege Dā-vĭd and his

men.

9¶ And Dā-vĭd knew that Saul secretly practised mischief against him; and he said to Ă-bī-ă-thär the priest, Bring hither the ē-phŏd.
10 Then said Dā-vĭd, O LORD God of Ĭś-rā-ĕl, thy servant hath certainly

10 Then said Da-vid, O LORD God of Iś-rā-ĕl, thy servant hath certainly heard that Saul seeketh to come to Kē-ī-lāh, to destroy the city for my sake.

11 Will the men of Kē-ī-lah deliver me up into his hand? will Saul come down, as thy servant hath heard? O LORD God of Ĭś-rā-ĕl, I beseech thee, tell thy servant. And the LORD said, He will come down. 12 Then said Dā-vid, Will the men of Kē-ī-lah deliver me and my men into the hand of Saul? And the LORD said, They will deliver thee up.

13 ¶ Then Dā-vid and his men, which were about six hundred, arose and departed out of Kē-ī-lāh, and went whithersoever they could go. And it was told Saul that Dā-vid was escaped from Kē-ī-lāh; and he forbare to go forth.

14 And Dā-vǐd abode in the wilderness in strong holds, and remained in a mountain in the wilderness of Zǐph. And Saul sought him every day, but God delivered him not into his hand.

15 And Dā-vĭd saw that Saul was come out to seek his life: and Dā-vĭd was in the wilderness of Zĭph in a wood.

16 ¶ And Jŏn-a-than Saul's son arose, and went to Dā-vid into the wood, and strengthened his hand

in God.

17 And he said unto him, Fear not: for the hand of Saul my father shall not find thee; and thou shalt be king over Ĭśʻrā-ĕl, and I shall be next unto thee; and that also Saul my father knoweth.

18 And they two made a covenant before the LORD: and Dā-vid abode in the wood, and Jŏn-ā-thān went to his house.

19 ¶ Then came up the Zĭph-ītes to Saul to Gĭb-ĕ-ăh, saying, Doth not Dā-vĭd hide himself with us in strong holds in the wood, in the hill of Hă-chī-lăh, which is on the south of Jē-shī-mon?

20 Now therefore, O king, come down according to all the desire of thy soul to come down; and our part *shall be* to deliver him into the king's hand.

21 And Saul said, Blessed *be* ye of the LORD; for ye have compassion on me.

22 Go, I pray you, prepare yet, and know and see his place where his haunt is, *and* who hath seen him there: for it is told me *that* he dealeth very subtilly.

23 See therefore, and take knowledge of all the lurking places where he hideth himself, and come ye again to me with the certainty, and I will go with you: and it shall come to pass, if he be in the land, that I will search him out throughout all the thousands of Jûd-ăh.

24 And they arose, and went to Zĭph before Saul: but Dā'vĭd and

his men were in the wilderness of Mā-on, in the plain on the south of Jĕ-shī-mon.

25 Saul also and his men went to seek him. And they told Dā'vĭd: wherefore he came down into a rock, and abode in the wilderness of Mā'on. And when Saul heard that, he pursued after Dā'vĭd in the wilderness of Mā'on.

26 And Saul went on this side of the mountain, and Dā-vǐd and his men on that side of the mountain: and Dā-vǐd made haste to get away for fear of Saul; for Saul and his men compassed Dā-vǐd and his men round about to take them.

27 ¶ But there came a messenger unto Saul, saying, Haste thee, and come; for the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes have invaded the land.

28 Wherefore Saul returned from pursuing after Dā-vid, and went against the Phil-is-tīnes: therefore they called that place Sĕ-lä-hăm-mäh-lĕ-kōth.

29 ¶ And Dā-vĭd went up from thence, and dwelt in strong holds at Ĕn-ġē-dī.

CHAPTER 24

And it came to pass, when Saul was returned from following the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes, that it was told him, saying, Behold, Dā'vĭd is in the wilderness of Ĕn-ġē'dī.

2 Then Saul took three thousand chosen men out of all Ĭś-rā-ĕl, and went to seek Dā-vĭd and his men upon the rocks of the wild goats.

3 And he came to the sheepcotes by the way, where was a cave; and

Saul went in to cover his feet: and Dā-vĭd and his men remained in the sides of the cave.

4 And the men of Dā'vĭd said unto him, Behold the day of which the LORD said unto thee, Behold, I will deliver thine enemy into thine hand, that thou mayest do to him as it shall seem good unto thee. Then Dā'vĭd arose, and cut off the skirt of Saul's robe privily.

5 And it came to pass afterward, that Dā-vĭd's heart smote him, because he had cut off Saul's skirt. 6 And he said unto his men, The LORD forbid that I should do this thing unto my master, the LORD'S anointed, to stretch forth mine hand against him, seeing he is the anointed of the LORD.

7 So Dā-vǐd stayed his servants with these words, and suffered them not to rise against Saul. But Saul rose up out of the cave, and went on his way.

8 Dā'vĭd also arose afterward, and went out of the cave, and cried after Saul, saying, My lord the king. And when Saul looked behind him, Dā'vĭd stooped with his face to the earth, and bowed himself.

9¶ And Dā'vĭd said to Saul, Wherefore hearest thou men's words, saying, Behold, Dā'vĭd seeketh thy hurt?

10 Behold, this day thine eyes have seen how that the LORD had delivered thee to day into mine hand in the cave: and some bade me kill thee: but mine eye spared thee; and I said, I will not put forth mine hand against my lord; for he is the LORD'S anointed.

11 Moreover, my father, see, yea, see the skirt of thy robe in my hand: for in that I cut off the skirt of thy robe, and killed thee not, know thou and see that *there is* neither evil nor transgression in mine hand, and I have not sinned against thee; yet thou huntest my soul to take it.

12 The LORD judge between me and thee, and the LORD avenge me of thee: but mine hand shall not be upon thee.

13 As saith the proverb of the ancients, Wickedness proceedeth from the wicked: but mine hand shall not be upon thee.

14 After whom is the king of Ĭś-rā-ĕl come out? after whom dost thou pursue? after a dead dog, after a flea.

15 The LORD therefore be judge, and judge between me and thee, and see, and plead my cause, and deliver me out of thine hand.

16 ¶ And it came to pass, when Dā'vĭd had made an end of speaking these words unto Saul, that Saul said, *Is* this thy voice, my son Dā'vĭd? And Saul lifted up his voice, and wept.

17 And he said to Dā-vid, Thou art more righteous than I: for thou hast rewarded me good, whereas I have rewarded thee evil.

18 And thou hast shewed this day how that thou hast dealt well with me: forasmuch as when the LORD had delivered me into thine hand, thou killedst me not.

19 For if a man find his enemy, will he let him go well away? wherefore the LORD reward thee good for that thou hast done unto me this day.

20 And now, behold, I know well that thou shalt surely be king, and that the kingdom of Ĭś-rā-ĕl shall be established in thine hand.

21 Swear now therefore unto me by the LORD, that thou wilt not cut off my seed after me, and that thou wilt not destroy my name out of my father's house.

22 And Dā'vĭd sware unto Saul. And Saul went home; but Dā'vĭd and his men gat them up unto the hold.

CHAPTER 25

AND Săm'ū-ĕl died; and all the Tiś'rā-ĕl-ītes were gathered together, and lamented him, and buried him in his house at Rā'măh. And Dā'vĭd arose, and went down to the wilderness of Pâr'ăn.

2 And there was a man in Mā-on, whose possessions were in Cär-měl; and the man was very great, and he had three thousand sheep, and a thousand goats: and he was shearing his sheep in Cär-měl.

3 Now the name of the man was Nā-băl; and the name of his wife Ăb-ĩ-gail: and she was a woman of good understanding, and of a beautiful countenance: but the man was churlish and evil in his

doings; and he was of the house of $C\bar{a}$ -leb.

4¶ And Dā'vĭd heard in the wilderness that Nā'băl did shear his sheep.

5 And Dā-vid sent out ten young men, and Dā-vid said unto the young men, Get you up to Cär-měl, and go to Nā-băl, and greet him in my name:

6 And thus shall ye say to him that liveth *in prosperity*, Peace *be* both to thee, and peace *be* to thine house, and peace *be* unto all that thou hast.

7 And now I have heard that thou hast shearers: now thy shepherds which were with us, we hurt them not, neither was there ought missing unto them, all the while they were in Cär-měl.

8 Ask thy young men, and they will shew thee. Wherefore let the young men find favour in thine eyes: for we come in a good day: give, I pray thee, whatsoever cometh to thine hand unto thy servants, and to thy son Dā-vĭd.

9 And when Dā-vid's young men came, they spake to Nā-băl according to all those words in the name of Dā-vid, and ceased.

10 ¶ And Nā-'băl answered Dā-'vĭd's servants, and said, Who is Dā-'vĭd? and who is the son of Jĕs-'sĕ? there be many servants now a days that break away every man from his master.

11 Shall I then take my bread, and my water, and my flesh that I have killed for my shearers, and give *it*

unto men, whom I know not whence they be?

12 So Dā-vĭd's young men turned their way, and went again, and came and told him all those sayings.

13 And Dā-vid said unto his men, Gird ye on every man his sword. And they girded on every man his sword; and Dā-vid also girded on his sword: and there went up after Dā-vid about four hundred men; and two hundred abode by the stuff.

14 ¶ But one of the young men told Ăb-ĭ-gail, Nā-băl's wife, saying, Behold, Dā-vĭd sent messengers out of the wilderness to salute our master; and he railed on them.

15 But the men were very good unto us, and we were not hurt, neither missed we any thing, as long as we were conversant with them, when we were in the fields: 16 They were a wall unto us both by night and day, all the while we were with them keeping the sheep.

17 Now therefore know and consider what thou wilt do; for evil is determined against our master, and against all his household: for he *is such* a son of Bē-lĭ-ăl, that a man cannot speak to him.

18 ¶ Then Ăb-ĭ-gail made haste, and took two hundred loaves, and two bottles of wine, and five sheep ready dressed, and five measures of parched *corn*, and an hundred clusters of raisins, and two

hundred cakes of figs, and laid them on asses.

19 And she said unto her servants, Go on before me; behold, I come after you. But she told not her husband Nā-băl.

20 And it was so, as she rode on the ass, that she came down by the covert of the hill, and, behold, Dā-vĭd and his men came down against her; and she met them.

21 Now Dā-vid had said, Surely in vain have I kept all that this *fellow* hath in the wilderness, so that nothing was missed of all that *pertained* unto him: and he hath requited me evil for good.

22 So and more also do God unto the enemies of $D\bar{a}'$ vĭd, if I leave of all that *pertain* to him by the morning light any that pisseth against the wall.

23 And when Ăb-ĭ-gail saw Dā-vid, she hasted, and lighted off the ass, and fell before Dā-vid on her face, and bowed herself to the ground, 24 And fell at his feet, and said, Upon me, my lord, upon me let this iniquity be: and let thine handmaid, I pray thee, speak in thine audience, and hear the words of thine handmaid.

25 Let not my lord, I pray thee, regard this man of Bē-lǐ-ăl, even Nā-băl: for as his name is, so is he; Nā-băl is his name, and folly is with him: but I thine handmaid saw not the young men of my lord, whom thou didst send.

26 Now therefore, my lord, as the LORD liveth, and as thy soul liveth,

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seeing the LORD hath withholden thee from coming to *shed* blood, and from avenging thyself with thine own hand, now let thine enemies, and they that seek evil to my lord, be as Nā-băl.

27 And now this blessing which thine handmaid hath brought unto my lord, let it even be given unto the young men that follow my lord.

28 I pray thee, forgive the trespass of thine handmaid: for the LORD will certainly make my lord a sure house; because my lord fighteth the battles of the LORD, and evil hath not been found in thee *all* thy days.

29 Yet a man is risen to pursue thee, and to seek thy soul: but the soul of my lord shall be bound in the bundle of life with the LORD thy God; and the souls of thine enemies, them shall he sling out, as out of the middle of a sling.

30 And it shall come to pass, when the LORD shall have done to my lord according to all the good that he hath spoken concerning thee, and shall have appointed thee ruler over Ĭśʻrā-ĕl;

31 That this shall be no grief unto thee, nor offence of heart unto my lord, either that thou hast shed blood causeless, or that my lord hath avenged himself: but when the LORD shall have dealt well with my lord, then remember thine handmaid.

32 ¶ And Dā-vĭd said to Ăb-î-gail, Blessed *be* the LORD God of Ĭś-rā-ĕl, which sent thee this day to meet me:

33 And blessed *be* thy advice, and blessed *be* thou, which hast kept me this day from coming to *shed* blood, and from avenging myself with mine own hand.

34 For in very deed, as the LORD God of Ĭś-rā-ĕl liveth, which hath kept me back from hurting thee, except thou hadst hasted and come to meet me, surely there had not been left unto Nā-băl by the morning light any that pisseth against the wall.

35 So Dā-vid received of her hand that which she had brought him, and said unto her, Go up in peace to thine house; see, I have hearkened to thy voice, and have accepted thy person.

36 ¶ And Ăb-ĩ-gail came to Nā-băl; and, behold, he held a feast in his house, like the feast of a king; and Nā-băl's heart was merry within him, for he was very drunken: wherefore she told him nothing, less or more, until the morning light.

37 But it came to pass in the morning, when the wine was gone out of Nā-băl, and his wife had told him these things, that his heart died within him, and he became as a stone.

38 And it came to pass about ten days *after*, that the LORD smote Nā-băl, that he died.

39 ¶ And when Dā-vĭd heard that Nā-băl was dead, he said, Blessed be the LORD, that hath pleaded the

cause of my reproach from the hand of Nā-băl, and hath kept his servant from evil: for the LORD hath returned the wickedness of Nā-băl upon his own head. And Dā-vid sent and communed with Ăb-ī-gail, to take her to him to wife.

40 And when the servants of Dā-vid were come to Ăb-i-gail to Cär-mel, they spake unto her, saying, Dā-vid sent us unto thee, to take thee to him to wife.

41 And she arose, and bowed herself on *her* face to the earth, and said, Behold, *let* thine handmaid *be* a servant to wash the feet of the servants of my lord.

42 And Åb-ĭ-gail hasted, and arose, and rode upon an ass, with five damsels of hers that went after her; and she went after the messengers of Dā-́vĭd, and became his wife.

43 Dā-vid also took Ă-hin-ō-ăm of Jĕz-reel; and they were also both of them his wives.

44 ¶ But Saul had given Mī-chăl his daughter, Dā-vĭd's wife, to Phăl-tī the son of Lā-ĭsh, which was of Găl-lĭm.

CHAPTER 26

A ND the Zǐph-ītes came unto Saul to Gĭb-ĕ-ăh, saying, Doth not Dā-vid hide himself in the hill of Hă-chī-lăh, which is before Jĕ-shī-mon?

2 Then Saul arose, and went down to the wilderness of Zĭph, having three thousand chosen men of Ĭś-rā-ĕl with him, to seek Dā-vĭd in the wilderness of Zĭph.

3 And Saul pitched in the hill of Hă-chī-lăh, which is before Jĕ-shī-mon, by the way. But Dā-vĭd abode in the wilderness, and he saw that Saul came after him into the wilderness.

4 Dā'vĭd therefore sent out spies, and understood that Saul was come in very deed.

5 ¶ And Dā-vid arose, and came to the place where Saul had pitched: and Dā-vid beheld the place where Saul lay, and Ăb-nĕr the son of Nĕr, the captain of his host: and Saul lay in the trench, and the people pitched round about him.

6 Then answered Dā-vǐd and said to Ă-hǐm-ĕ-lēch the Hǐt-tīte, and to Ăb-ĭ-shai the son of Zĕr-ū-ī-ăh, brother to Jō-ăb, saying, Who will go down with me to Saul to the camp? And Ăb-ĭ-shai said, I will go down with thee.

7 So Dā-vĭd and Åb-ĭ-shai came to the people by night: and, behold, Saul lay sleeping within the trench, and his spear stuck in the ground at his bolster: but Åb-nĕr and the people lay round about him.

8 Then said Ăb-ĩ-shai to Dā-vǐd, God hath delivered thine enemy into thine hand this day: now therefore let me smite him, I pray thee, with the spear even to the earth at once, and I will not *smite* him the second time.

9 And Dā'vĭd said to Ăb'ī-shai, Destroy him not: for who can stretch forth his hand against the

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LORD's anointed, and be guiltless? 10 Dā-vid said furthermore, As the LORD liveth, the LORD shall smite him; or his day shall come to die; or he shall descend into battle, and perish.

11 The LORD forbid that I should stretch forth mine hand against the LORD's anointed: but, I pray thee, take thou now the spear that is at his bolster, and the cruse of water, and let us go.

12 So Dā'vĭd took the spear and the cruse of water from Saul's bolster; and they gat them away, and no man saw it, nor knew it, neither awaked: for they were all asleep; because a deep sleep from the LORD was fallen upon them.

13 ¶ Then Dā-vĭd went over to the other side, and stood on the top of an hill afar off; a great space being between them:

14 And Dā'vĭd cried to the people, and to Ăb'nĕr the son of Nĕr, saying, Answerest thou not, Ăb'nĕr? Then Ăb'nĕr answered and said, Who art thou that criest to the king?

15 And Dā-vid said to Ăb-ner, Art not thou a valiant man? and who is like to thee in Is-rā-el? wherefore then hast thou not kept thy lord the king? for there came one of the people in to destroy the king thy lord.

16 This thing is not good that thou hast done. As the LORD liveth, ye are worthy to die, because ye have not kept your master, the LORD's anointed. And now see where the

king's spear is, and the cruse of water that was at his bolster.

17 And Saul knew Dā-vid's voice, and said, *Is* this thy voice, my son Dā-vid? And Dā-vid said, *It is* my voice, my lord, O king.

18 And he said, Wherefore doth my lord thus pursue after his servant? for what have I done? or what evil is in mine hand?

19 Now therefore, I pray thee, let my lord the king hear the words of his servant. If the LORD have stirred thee up against me, let him accept an offering: but if they be the children of men, cursed be they before the LORD; for they have driven me out this day from abiding in the inheritance of the LORD, saying, Go, serve other gods. 20 Now therefore, let not my blood fall to the earth before the face of the LORD: for the king of Is-ra-el is come out to seek a flea, as when one doth hunt a partridge in the mountains.

21 ¶ Then said Saul, I have sinned: return, my son Dā-vǐd: for I will no more do thee harm, because my soul was precious in thine eyes this day: behold, I have played the fool, and have erred exceedingly. 22 And Dā-vǐd answered and said, Behold the king's spear! and let one of the young men come over and fetch it.

23 The LORD render to every man his righteousness and his faithfulness: for the LORD delivered thee into my hand to day, but I would not stretch forth

mine hand against the LORD'S anointed.

24 And, behold, as thy life was much set by this day in mine eyes, so let my life be much set by in the eyes of the LORD, and let him deliver me out of all tribulation.

25 Then Saul said to Dā'vĭd, Blessed *be* thou, my son Dā'vĭd: thou shalt both do great *things*, and also shalt still prevail. So Dā'vĭd went on his way, and Saul returned to his place.

CHAPTER 27

AND Dā-vǐd said in his heart, I shall now perish one day by the hand of Saul: there is nothing better for me than that I should speedily escape into the land of the Phǐl-ĭs-tīnes; and Saul shall despair of me, to seek me any more in any coast of Ĭs-rā-ĕl: so shall I escape out of his hand.

2 And Dā'vid arose, and he passed over with the six hundred men that were with him unto Ā'chish, the son of Mā'ŏch, king of Găth.

3 And Dā-vid dwelt with Ā-chish at Găth, he and his men, every man with his household, even Dā-vid with his two wives, Ă-hǐn-ō-ām the Jēz-reel-ī-tēss, and Ăb-ĩ-gail the Cär-měl-ī-tēss, Nā-băl's wife.
4 And it was told Saul that Dā-vid was fled to Găth: and he sought no more again for him.

5 ¶ And Dā'vĭd said unto Ā'chĭsh, If I have now found grace in thine eyes, let them give me a place in some town in the country, that I may dwell there: for why should

thy servant dwell in the royal city with thee?

6 Then Ā-chīsh gave him Zǐk-lăg that day: wherefore Zǐk-lăg pertaineth unto the kings of Jûd-ah unto this day.

7 And the time that Dā'vĭd dwelt in the country of the Phĭl'īs-tīnes was a full year and four months.

8 \P And Dā'vĭd and his men went up, and invaded the Gĕ-shū'rītes, and the A-măl'ĕk-ītes: for those *nations* were of old the inhabitants of the land, as thou goest to Shūr, even unto the land of \bar{E} 'ġŏpt.

9 And Dā'vĭd smote the land, and left neither man nor woman alive, and took away the sheep, and the oxen, and the asses, and the camels, and the apparel, and returned, and came to Ā'chĭsh.

10 And Ā'chish said, Whither have ye made a road to day? And Dā'vid said, Against the south of Jûd'āh, and against the south of the Jē-rāh'meel-ītes, and against the south of the Kē'nītes.

11 And Dā-vid saved neither man nor woman alive, to bring *tidings* to Găth, saying, Lest they should tell on us, saying, So did Dā-vid, and so *will be* his manner all the while he dwelleth in the country of the Phil-is-tīnes.

12 And Ā'chĭsh believed Dā'vĭd, saying, He hath made his people Ĭs'rā-ĕl utterly to abhor him; therefore he shall be my servant for ever.

CHAPTER 28

AND it came to pass in those days, that the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes gathered their armies together for warfare, to fight with Ĭś-rā-ĕl. And Ā-chĭsh said unto Dā-vĭd, Know thou assuredly, that thou shalt go out with me to battle, thou and thy men.

2 And Dā-vǐd said to Ā-chǐsh, Surely thou shalt know what thy servant can do. And Ā-chǐsh said to Dā-vǐd, Therefore will I make thee keeper of mine head for ever. 3 ¶ Now Săm-ū-ĕl was dead, and all Ĭs-rā-ĕl had lamented him, and buried him in Rā-măh, even in his own city. And Saul had put away those that had familiar spirits, and the wizards, out of the land.

4 And the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes gathered themselves together, and came and pitched in Shû-nem: and Saul gathered all Ĭs-rā-el together, and they pitched in Gĭl-bō-ă.

5 And when Saul saw the host of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes, he was afraid, and his heart greatly trembled.

6 And when Saul inquired of the LORD, the LORD answered him not, neither by dreams, nor by Ū-rĭm, nor by prophets.

7¶ Then said Saul unto his servants, Seek me a woman that hath a familiar spirit, that I may go to her, and inquire of her. And his servants said to him, Behold, there is a woman that hath a familiar spirit at Ĕn′-dôr.

8 And Saul disguised himself, and put on other raiment, and he

went, and two men with him, and they came to the woman by night: and he said, I pray thee, divine unto me by the familiar spirit, and bring me *him* up, whom I shall name unto thee.

9 And the woman said unto him, Behold, thou knowest what Saul hath done, how he hath cut off those that have familiar spirits, and the wizards, out of the land: wherefore then layest thou a snare for my life, to cause me to die?

10 And Saul sware to her by the LORD, saying, As the LORD liveth, there shall no punishment happen to thee for this thing.

11 Then said the woman, Whom shall I bring up unto thee? And he said, Bring me up Săm-ū-ĕl.

12 And when the woman saw Săm'-ū-ĕl, she cried with a loud voice: and the woman spake to Saul, saying, Why hast thou deceived me? for thou art Saul.

13 And the king said unto her, Be not afraid: for what sawest thou? And the woman said unto Saul, I saw gods ascending out of the earth.

14 And he said unto her, What form is he of? And she said, An old man cometh up; and he is covered with a mantle. And Saul perceived that it was Săm'ū-ĕl, and he stooped with his face to the ground, and bowed himself.

15 ¶ And Săm'ū-ĕl said to Saul, Why hast thou disquieted me, to bring me up? And Saul answered, I am sore distressed; for the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes make war against me, and God is departed from me, and answereth me no more, neither by prophets, nor by dreams: therefore I have called thee, that thou mayest make known unto me what I shall do.

16 Then said Săm'ū-ĕl, Wherefore then dost thou ask of me, seeing the LORD is departed from thee, and is become thine enemy?

17 And the LORD hath done to him, as he spake by me: for the LORD hath rent the kingdom out of thine hand, and given it to thy neighbour, *even* to Dā-vǐd:

18 Because thou obeyedst not the voice of the LORD, nor executedst his fierce wrath upon Ăm-ă-lĕk, therefore hath the LORD done this thing unto thee this day.

19 Moreover the LORD will also deliver Ĭś-rā-ĕl with thee into the hand of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīneś: and to morrow shalt thou and thy sons be with me: the LORD also shall deliver the host of Ĭś-rā-ĕl into the hand of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīneś.

20 Then Saul fell straightway all along on the earth, and was sore afraid, because of the words of Săm'ū-ĕl: and there was no strength in him; for he had eaten no bread all the day, nor all the night.

21 ¶ And the woman came unto Saul, and saw that he was sore troubled, and said unto him, Behold, thine handmaid hath obeyed thy voice, and I have put

my life in my hand, and have hearkened unto thy words which thou spakest unto me.

22 Now therefore, I pray thee, hearken thou also unto the voice of thine handmaid, and let me set a morsel of bread before thee; and eat, that thou mayest have strength, when thou goest on thy way.

23 But he refused, and said, I will not eat. But his servants, together with the woman, compelled him; and he hearkened unto their voice. So he arose from the earth, and sat upon the bed.

24 And the woman had a fat calf in the house; and she hasted, and killed it, and took flour, and kneaded *it*, and did bake unleavened bread thereof:

25 And she brought *it* before Saul, and before his servants; and they did eat. Then they rose up, and went away that night.

CHAPTER 29

N ow the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes gathered together all their armies to Ā-phěk: and the Ĭs-rā-el-ītes pitched by a fountain which is in Jez-reel.

2 And the lords of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes passed on by hundreds, and by thousands: but $D\bar{a}$ -vĭd and his men passed on in the rereward with \bar{A} -chĭsh.

3 Then said the princes of the Phǐl-īs-tīnes, What do these Hē-brēws here? And Ā-chĭsh said unto the princes of the Phǐl-īs-tīnes, Is not this Dā-vǐd, the

servant of Saul the king of Ĭśʻrā-ĕl, which hath been with me these days, or these years, and I have found no fault in him since he fell unto me unto this day?

4 And the princes of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes were wroth with him; and the princes of the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes said unto him, Make this fellow return, that he may go again to his place which thou hast appointed him, and let him not go down with us to battle, lest in the battle he be an adversary to us: for wherewith should he reconcile himself unto his master? should it not be with the heads of these men?

5 Is not this Dā'vĭd, of whom they sang one to another in dances, saying, Saul slew his thousands, and Dā'vĭd his ten thousands?

6 ¶ Then Ā-chĭsh called Dā-vĭd, and said unto him, Surely, as the LORD liveth, thou hast been upright, and thy going out and thy coming in with me in the host is good in my sight: for I have not found evil in thee since the day of thy coming unto me unto this day: nevertheless the lords favour thee not.

7 Wherefore now return, and go in peace, that thou displease not the lords of the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes.

8 \P And Dā'vĭd said unto Ā'chĭsh, But what have I done? and what hast thou found in thy servant so long as I have been with thee unto this day, that I may not go fight against the enemies of my lord the king?

9 And Ā-chĭsh answered and said to Dā-vid, I know that thou *art* good in my sight, as an angel of God: notwithstanding the princes of the Phǐl-ĭs-tīnes have said, He shall not go up with us to the battle.

10 Wherefore now rise up early in the morning with thy master's servants that are come with thee: and as soon as ye be up early in the morning, and have light, depart.

11 So Dā-vid and his men rose up early to depart in the morning, to return into the land of the Phil-is-tīnes. And the Phil-is-tīnes went up to Jěz-reel.

CHAPTER 30

And it came to pass, when Dā-vid and his men were come to Zik-lăg on the third day, that the Ă-măl-ĕk-ītes had invaded the south, and Zik-lăg, and smitten Zik-lăg, and burned it with fire;

2 And had taken the women captives, that were therein: they slew not any, either great or small, but carried them away, and went on their way.

3 ¶ So Dā-vid and his men came to the city, and, behold, it was burned with fire; and their wives, and their sons, and their daughters, were taken captives.

4 Then Dā'vĭd and the people that were with him lifted up their voice and wept, until they had no more power to weep.

5 And Dā-vĭd's two wives were

taken captives, Ă-hĭn-o-ăm the Jĕz-reel-ī-tĕss, and Ăb-î-gail the wife of Nā-băl the Cär-mĕl-īte.

6 And Dā-vĭd was greatly distressed; for the people spake of stoning him, because the soul of all the people was grieved, every man for his sons and for his daughters: but Dā-vĭd encouraged himself in the LORD his God.

7 And Dā-vid said to Ă-bī-a-thär the priest, Ă-him-e-lech's son, I pray thee, bring me hither the e-phod. And Ă-bī-a-thär brought thither the e-phod to Dā-vid.

8 And Dā'vĭd inquired at the LORD, saying, Shall I pursue after this troop? shall I overtake them? And he answered him, Pursue: for thou shalt surely overtake *them*, and without fail recover *all*.

9 So Dā-'vĭd went, he and the six hundred men that were with him, and came to the brook Bē-'sôr, where those that were left behind stayed.

10 But Dā-vid pursued, he and four hundred men: for two hundred abode behind, which were so faint that they could not go over the brook Bē-sôr.

11 ¶ And they found an Ē-ġyp-tīān in the field, and brought him to Dā-vĭd, and gave him bread, and he did eat; and they made him drink water;

12 And they gave him a piece of a cake of figs, and two clusters of raisins: and when he had eaten, his spirit came again to him: for he had eaten no bread, nor drunk *any*

water, three days and three nights.

13 And Dā-vid said unto him, To whom belongest thou? and whence art thou? And he said, I am a young man of Ē-ʻġypt, servant to an Ă-măl-ʾĕk-īte; and my master left me, because three days agone I fell sick.

14 We made an invasion upon the south of the Cheré-e-thītes, and upon the coast which belongeth to Jûd-ah, and upon the south of Cā-leb; and we burned Zik-lag with fire.

15 And Dā-vid said to him, Canst thou bring me down to this company? And he said, Swear unto me by God, that thou wilt neither kill me, nor deliver me into the hands of my master, and I will bring thee down to this company.

16 ¶ And when he had brought him down, behold, they were spread abroad upon all the earth, eating and drinking, and dancing, because of all the great spoil that they had taken out of the land of the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes, and out of the land of Jûd-ăh.

17 And Dā'vĭd smote them from the twilight even unto the evening of the next day: and there escaped not a man of them, save four hundred young men, which rode upon camels, and fled.

18 And Dā-vid recovered all that the Ă-măl-ek-ītes had carried away: and Dā-vid rescued his two wives.

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19 And there was nothing lacking to them, neither small nor great, neither sons nor daughters, neither spoil, nor any *thing* that they had taken to them: Dā'vĭd recovered all.

20 And Dā'vĭd took all the flocks and the herds, which they drave before those other cattle, and said, This is Dā'vĭd's spoil.

21 ¶ And Dā'vĭd came to the two hundred men, which were so faint that they could not follow Dā'vĭd, whom they had made also to abide at the brook Bē'sôr: and they went forth to meet Dā'vĭd, and to meet the people that were with him: and when Dā'vĭd came near to the people, he saluted them.

22 Then answered all the wicked men and men of Bē-lǐ-al, of those that went with Dā-vǐd, and said, Because they went not with us, we will not give them ought of the spoil that we have recovered, save to every man his wife and his children, that they may lead them away, and depart.

23 Then said Dā-vǐd, Ye shall not do so, my brethren, with that which the LORD hath given us, who hath preserved us, and delivered the company that came against us into our hand.

24 For who will hearken unto you in this matter? but as his part *is* that goeth down to the battle, so *shall* his part *be* that tarrieth by the stuff: they shall part alike.

25 And it was so from that day forward, that he made it a statute

and an ordinance for Ĭś-rā-ĕl unto this day.

26 ¶ And when Dā-vid came to Zik-lăg, he sent of the spoil unto the elders of Jûd-ăh, even to his friends, saying, Behold a present for you of the spoil of the enemies of the LORD;

27 To them which were in Běth'ěl, and to them which were in south Rā'mŏth, and to them which were in Jăt'tĭr,

28 And to them which were in Ă-rō-ĕr, and to them which were in Sĭph-mōth, and to them which were in Ĕsh-tĕ-mō-ã,

29 And to them which were in Rā-chăl, and to them which were in the cities of the Jĕ-räh-meel-ītes, and to them which were in the cities of the Kē-nītes,

30 And to them which were in Hôr-măh, and to them which were in Chôr-ăsh-ăn, and to them which were in Ā-thăch,

31 And to them which were in Hē-brŏn, and to all the places where Dā-vĭd himself and his men were wont to haunt.

CHAPTER 31

Now the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes fought against Ĭs-rā-ĕl: and the men of Ĭs-rā-ĕl fled from before the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes, and fell down slain in mount Gĭl-bō-ă.

2 And the Phǐl-ĭs-tīnes followed hard upon Saul and upon his sons; and the Phĭl-ĭs-tīnes slew Jŏn-ˇa-thăn, and Ă-bĭn-ˇa-dăb, and Măl-ʿchī-shû-ˇa, Saul's sons.

3 And the battle went sore against

Saul, and the archers hit him; and he was sore wounded of the archers.

4 Then said Saul unto his armourbearer, Draw thy sword, and thrust me through therewith; lest these uncircumcised come and thrust me through, and abuse me. But his armourbearer would not; for he was sore afraid. Therefore Saul took a sword, and fell upon it.

5 And when his armourbearer saw that Saul was dead, he fell likewise upon his sword, and died with him.

6 So Saul died, and his three sons, and his armourbearer, and all his men, that same day together.

7¶ And when the men of Ĭś′rā-ĕl that were on the other side of the valley, and they that were on the other side Jôr′dăn, saw that the men of Ĭś′rā-ĕl fled, and that Saul and his sons were dead, they forsook the cities, and fled; and the Phĭl-ĩs-tīneṡ came and dwelt in them.

8 And it came to pass on the morrow, when the Phǐl-ĩs-tīnes came to strip the slain, that they found Saul and his three sons fallen in mount Gǐl-bō-ă.

9 And they cut off his head, and stripped off his armour, and sent into the land of the Phĭl-ĩs-tīneṡ round about, to publish *it in* the house of their idols, and among the people.

10 And they put his armour in the house of Ash-ta-roth: and they fastened his body to the wall of Běth-shan.

11 ¶ And when the inhabitants of Jā'bĕsh-gĭl'ĕ-ăd heard of that which the Phĭl'ĭs-tīnes had done to Saul;

12 All the valiant men arose, and went all night, and took the body of Saul and the bodies of his sons from the wall of Běth-shăn, and came to Jā-běsh, and burnt them there.

13 And they took their bones, and buried *them* under a tree at Jā-bĕsh, and fasted seven days.
