## THE EPISTLE OF PAUL TO PHĪ-LĒ-MON

PÂUL, a prisoner of Jē'sis Chrīst, and Tim'ŏ-thỹ our brother, unto Phī-lē'mon our dearly beloved, and fellow-labourer,

2 And to our beloved Apph-i-a, and Ar-chip-pus our fellowsoldier, and to the church in thy house:

3 Grace to you, and peace, from God our Father and the Lord Jē-sus Chrīst.

4 I thank my God, making mention of thee always in my prayers,

5 Hearing of thy love and faith, which thou hast toward the Lord Jē-'sŭs, and toward all saints;

6 That the communication of thy faith may become effectual by the acknowledging of every good thing which is in you in <u>Chrīst Jē</u>-'sus.

7 For we have great joy and consolation in thy love, because the bowels of the saints are refreshed by thee, brother.

8 Wherefore, though I might be much bold in Chrīst to enjoin thee that which is convenient,

9 Yet for love's sake I rather beseech *thee*, being such an one as Paul the aged, and now also a prisoner of Jē-sus Chrīst.

10 I beseech thee for my son Ō-nĕs-ı̃-mus, whom I have begotten in my bonds:

11 Which in time past was to thee unprofitable, but now profitable to thee and to me:

12 Whom I have sent again: thou

therefore receive him, that is, mine own bowels:

13 Whom I would have retained with me, that in thy stead he might have ministered unto me in the bonds of the gospel:

14 But without thy mind would I do nothing; that thy benefit should not be as it were of necessity, but willingly.

15 For perhaps he therefore departed for a season, that thou shouldest receive him for ever;

16 Not now as a servant, but above a servant, a brother beloved, specially to me, but how much more unto thee, both in the flesh, and in the Lord?

17 If thou count me therefore a partner, receive him as myself.

18 If he hath wronged thee, or oweth *thee* ought, put that on mine account;

19 I Paul have written *it* with mine own hand, I will repay *it*: albeit I do not say to thee how thou owest unto me even thine own self besides.

20 Yea, brother, let me have joy of thee in the Lord: refresh my bowels in the Lord.

21 Having confidence in thy obedience I wrote unto thee, knowing that thou wilt also do more than I say.

22 But withal prepare me also a lodging: for I trust that through your prayers I shall be given unto you.

## PHĪ-LĒ-MON

23 There salute thee Ĕpʻā-phrăs, my fellowprisoner in Chrīst Jēʻsŭs; 24 Märʻcŭs, Ār-īs-tärʻchŭs, Dēʻmăs, Lûʻcăs, my fellowlabourers.

25 The grace of our Lord Jē-sius Chrīst be with your spirit. Ä-men.
