

## THE BOOK OF JUDGES

### CHAPTER 1

**N**OW after the death of Jōsh-ū-ā it came to pass, that the children of Īs-rā-ēl asked the LORD, saying, Who shall go up for us against the Cā-nā-ān-ites first, to fight against them?

2 And the LORD said, Jūd-āh shall go up: behold, I have delivered the land into his hand.

3 And Jūd-āh said unto Sīm-ē-ōn his brother, Come up with me into my lot, that we may fight against the Cā-nā-ān-ites; and I likewise will go with thee into thy lot. So Sīm-ē-ōn went with him.

4 And Jūd-āh went up; and the LORD delivered the Cā-nā-ān-ites and the Pē-rīz-zītes into their hand: and they slew of them in Bē-zēk ten thousand men.

5 And they found Ād-ō-nī-bē-zēk in Bē-zēk: and they fought against him, and they slew the Cā-nā-ān-ites and the Pē-rīz-zītes.

6 But Ād-ō-nī-bē-zēk fled; and they pursued after him, and caught him, and cut off his thumbs and his great toes.

7 And Ād-ō-nī-bē-zēk said, Threescore and ten kings, having their thumbs and their great toes cut off, gathered *their meat* under my table: as I have done, so God hath requited me. And they brought him to Jē-rū-sā-lēm, and there he died.

8 Now the children of Jūd-āh had fought against Jē-rū-sā-lēm, and had taken it, and smitten it with the edge of the sword, and set the city on fire.

9 ¶ And afterward the children of Jūd-āh went down to fight against the Cā-nā-ān-ites, that dwelt in the mountain, and in the south, and in the valley.

10 And Jūd-āh went against the Cā-nā-ān-ites that dwelt in Hē-brōn: (now the name of Hē-brōn before was Kīr-jāth-ār-bā:) and they slew Shē-shāi, and Ā-hī-mān, and Tāl-māi.

11 And from thence he went against the inhabitants of Dē-bīr: and the name of Dē-bīr before was Kīr-jāth-sē-phēr:

12 And Cā-lēb said, He that smiteth Kīr-jāth-sē-phēr, and taketh it, to him will I give Āch-sāh my daughter to wife.

13 And Ōth-nī-ēl the son of Kē-nāz, Cā-lēb's younger brother, took it: and he gave him Āch-sāh his daughter to wife.

14 And it came to pass, when she came to him, that she moved him to ask of her father a field: and she lighted from off her ass; and Cā-lēb said unto her, What wilt thou?

15 And she said unto him, Give me a blessing: for thou hast given me a south land; give me also springs of water. And Cā-lēb gave her the upper springs and the nether springs.

16 ¶ And the children of the Kē-nīte, Mō-šēs' father in law, went up out of the city of palm trees with the children of Jūd-āh into the wilderness of Jūd-āh, which *lieth* in the south of Ār-ād; and they went and dwelt among the people.

17 And Jūd-āh went with Sīm-ē-ōn his brother, and they slew the Cā-nā-ān-ites that inhabited Zē-phāth, and utterly destroyed it. And the name of the city was called Hōr-māh.

18 Also Jūd-āh took Gā-zā with the coast thereof, and Ās-kē-lon with the coast thereof, and Ēk-rōn with the coast thereof.

19 And the LORD was with Jūd-āh; and he drave out *the inhabitants* of the mountain; but could not drive out the inhabitants of the valley, because they had chariots of iron.

20 And they gave Hē-brōn unto Cā-lēb, as Mō-šēs said: and he expelled thence the three sons of Ā-nāk.

21 And the children of Bēn-jā-mīn did not drive out the Jēb-ū-sītes that inhabited Jē-rū-sā-lēm; but the Jēb-ū-sītes dwell

with the children of Bēn-jā-mīn in Jē-rū-sā-lēm unto this day.

22 ¶ And the house of Jō-šēph, they also went up against Bēth-ēl: and the LORD was with them.

23 And the house of Jō-šēph sent to descry Bēth-ēl. (Now the name of the city before was Lüz.)

24 And the spies saw a man come forth out of the city, and they said unto him, Shew us, we pray thee, the entrance into the city, and we will shew thee mercy.

25 And when he shewed them the entrance into the city, they smote the city with the edge of the sword; but they let go the man and all his family.

26 And the man went into the land of the Hīt-tītes, and built a city, and called the name thereof Lüz: which is the name thereof unto this day.

27 ¶ Neither did Mā-nās-sēh drive out *the inhabitants* of Bēth-shē-ān and her towns, nor Tā-ā-nāch and her towns, nor the inhabitants of Dōr and her towns, nor the inhabitants of Īb-lē-ām and her towns, nor the inhabitants of Mē-gīd-dō and her towns: but the Cā-nā-ān-ites would dwell in that land.

28 And it came to pass, when Īs-rā-ēl was strong, that they put the Cā-nā-ān-ites to tribute, and did not utterly drive them out.

29 ¶ Neither did Ē-phrā-īm drive out the Cā-nā-ān-ites that dwelt in Gē-zēr; but the Cā-nā-ān-ites dwelt in Gē-zēr among them.

30 ¶ Neither did Zē-bū-lūn drive out the inhabitants of Kīt-rōn, nor the inhabitants of Nā-hā-lōl; but the Cā-nā-ān-ites dwelt among them, and became tributaries.

31 ¶ Neither did Āsh-ēr drive out the inhabitants of Āc-chō, nor the inhabitants of Zī-dōn, nor of Āh-lāb, nor of Āch-zīb, nor of Hēl-bāh, nor of Ā-phīk, nor of Rē-hōb:

32 But the Āsh-ēr-ites dwelt among the Cā-nā-ān-ites, the inhabitants of the land: for they did not drive them out.

33 ¶ Neither did Nāph-tā-lī drive out the inhabitants of Bēth-shē-mēsh, nor the inhabitants of Bēth-ā-nāth; but he dwelt among the Cā-nā-ān-ites, the inhabitants of the land: nevertheless the inhabitants of Bēth-shē-mēsh and of Bēth-ā-nāth became tributaries unto them.

34 And the Ām-ō-rītes forced the children of Dān into the mountain: for they would not suffer them to come down to the valley:

35 But the Ām-ō-rītes would dwell in mount Hē-rēs in Āi-jā-lōn, and in Shā-āl-bīm: yet the hand of the house of Jō-šēph prevailed, so that they became tributaries.

36 And the coast of the Ām-ō-rītes was from the going up to Āk-rāb-bīm, from the rock, and upward.

### CHAPTER 2

**A**ND an angel of the LORD came up from Gīl-gāl to Bō-chīm, and said, I made you to go up out of Ē-gypt, and have brought you unto the land which I swore unto your fathers; and I said, I will never break my covenant with you.

2 And ye shall make no league with the inhabitants of this land; ye shall throw down their altars: but ye have not obeyed my voice: why have ye done this?

3 Wherefore I also said, I will not drive them out from before you; but they shall be as *thorns* in your sides, and their gods shall be a snare unto you.

4 And it came to pass, when the angel of the LORD spake these words unto all the children of Īs-rā-ēl, that the people lifted up their voice, and wept.

5 And they called the name of that place Bō-chīm: and they sacrificed there unto the LORD.

6 ¶ And when Jōsh-ū-ā had let the people go, the children of Īś-rā-ēl went every man unto his inheritance to possess the land.

7 And the people served the LORD all the days of Jōsh-ū-ā, and all the days of the elders that outlived Jōsh-ū-ā, who had seen all the great works of the LORD, that he did for Īś-rā-ēl.

8 And Jōsh-ū-ā the son of Nūn, the servant of the LORD, died, being an hundred and ten years old.

9 And they buried him in the border of his inheritance in Tim-nāth-heres, in the mount of Ē-phrā-īm, on the north side of the hill Gā-āsh.

10 And also all that generation were gathered unto their fathers: and there arose another generation after them, which knew not the LORD, nor yet the works which he had done for Īś-rā-ēl.

11 ¶ And the children of Īś-rā-ēl did evil in the sight of the LORD, and served Bā-ā-līm:

12 And they forsook the LORD God of their fathers, which brought them out of the land of Ē-gypt, and followed other gods, of the gods of the people that were round about them, and bowed themselves unto them, and provoked the LORD to anger.

13 And they forsook the LORD, and served Bā-āl and Āsh-tā-rōth.

14 ¶ And the anger of the LORD was hot against Īś-rā-ēl, and he delivered them into the hands of spoilers that spoiled them, and he sold them into the hands of their enemies round about, so that they could not any longer stand before their enemies.

15 Whithersoever they went out, the hand of the LORD was against them for evil, as the LORD had said, and as the LORD had sworn unto them: and they were greatly distressed.

16 ¶ Nevertheless the LORD raised up judges, which delivered them out of the hand of those that spoiled them.

17 And yet they would not hearken unto their judges, but they went a whoring after other gods, and bowed themselves unto them: they turned quickly out of the way which their fathers walked in, obeying the commandments of the LORD; but they did not so.

18 And when the LORD raised them up judges, then the LORD was with the judge, and delivered them out of the hand of their enemies all the days of the judge: for it repented the LORD because of their groanings by reason of them that oppressed them and vexed them.

19 And it came to pass, when the judge was dead, that they returned, and corrupted themselves more than their fathers, in following other gods to serve them, and to bow down unto them; they ceased not from their own doings, nor from their stubborn way.

20 ¶ And the anger of the LORD was hot against Īś-rā-ēl; and he said, Because that this people hath transgressed my covenant which I commanded their fathers, and have not hearkened unto my voice;

21 I also will not henceforth drive out any from before them of the nations which Jōsh-ū-ā left when he died:

22 That through them I may prove Īś-rā-ēl, whether they will keep the way of the LORD to walk therein, as their fathers did keep it, or not.

23 Therefore the LORD left those nations, without driving them out hastily; neither delivered he them into the hand of Jōsh-ū-ā.

## CHAPTER 3

**N**OW these are the nations which the LORD left, to prove

Īś-rā-ēl by them, even as many of Īś-rā-ēl as had not known all the wars of Cā-nā-ān;

2 Only that the generations of the children of Īś-rā-ēl might know, to teach them war, at the least such as before knew nothing thereof;

3 Namely, five lords of the Phīl-īs-tīnes, and all the Cā-nā-ān-ites, and the Šī-dō-nī-āns, and the Hī-vītes that dwelt in mount Lēb-ā-ṇon, from mount Bā-āl-hēr-mon unto the entering in of Hā-māth.

4 And they were to prove Īś-rā-ēl by them, to know whether they would hearken unto the commandments of the LORD, which he commanded their fathers by the hand of Mō-šēs.

5 ¶ And the children of Īś-rā-ēl dwelt among the Cā-nā-ān-ites, Hīt-tītes, and Ām-ō-rītes, and Pē-rīz-zītes, and Hī-vītes, and Jēb-ū-sītes:

6 And they took their daughters to be their wives, and gave their daughters to their sons, and served their gods.

7 And the children of Īś-rā-ēl did evil in the sight of the LORD, and forgot the LORD their God, and served Bā-ā-līm and the groves.

8 ¶ Therefore the anger of the LORD was hot against Īś-rā-ēl, and he sold them into the hand of Chû-shān-rīsh-ā-thā-īm king of Mēs-ō-pō-tā-mī-ā: and the children of Īś-rā-ēl served Chû-shān-rīsh-ā-thā-īm eight years.

9 And when the children of Īś-rā-ēl cried unto the LORD, the LORD raised up a deliverer to the children of Īś-rā-ēl, who delivered them, even Ōth-nī-ēl the son of Kē-nāz, Cā-lēb's younger brother.

10 And the Spirit of the LORD came upon him, and he judged Īś-rā-ēl, and went out to war: and the LORD delivered Chû-shān-rīsh-ā-thā-īm king of Mēs-ō-pō-tā-mī-ā into his hand; and his hand prevailed against Chû-shān-rīsh-ā-thā-īm.

11 And the land had rest forty years. And Ōth-nī-ēl the son of Kē-nāz died.

12 ¶ And the children of Īś-rā-ēl did evil again in the sight of the LORD: and the LORD strengthened Ēg-lōn the king of Mō-āb against Īś-rā-ēl, because they had done evil in the sight of the LORD.

13 And he gathered unto him the children of Ām-mon and Ām-ā-lēk, and went and smote Īś-rā-ēl, and possessed the city of palm trees.

14 So the children of Īś-rā-ēl served Ēg-lōn the king of Mō-āb eighteen years.

15 But when the children of Īś-rā-ēl cried unto the LORD, the LORD raised them up a deliverer, Ē-hūd the son of Gē-rā, a Bēn-jā-mīte, a man lefthanded: and by him the children of Īś-rā-ēl sent a present unto Ēg-lōn the king of Mō-āb.

16 But Ē-hūd made him a dagger which had two edges, of a cubit length; and he did gird it under his raiment upon his right thigh.

17 And he brought the present unto Ēg-lōn king of Mō-āb: and Ēg-lōn was a very fat man.

18 And when he had made an end to offer the present, he sent away the people that bare the present.

19 But he himself turned again from the quarries that were by Gil-gāl, and said, I have a secret errand unto thee, O king: who said, Keep silence. And all that stood by him went out from him.

20 And Ē-hūd came unto him; and he was sitting in a summer parlour, which he had for himself alone. And Ē-hūd said, I have a message from God unto thee. And he arose out of his seat.

21 And Ē-hūd put forth his left hand, and took the dagger from his right thigh, and thrust it into his belly:

22 And the haft also went in after the blade; and the fat closed upon the blade, so that he could not draw the dagger out of his belly; and the dirt came out.

23 Then Ē-hūd went forth through the porch, and shut the doors of the parlour upon him, and locked them.

24 When he was gone out, his servants came; and when they saw that, behold, the doors of the parlour *were* locked, they said, Surely he covereth his feet in his summer chamber.

25 And they tarried till they were ashamed: and, behold, he opened not the doors of the parlour; therefore they took a key, and opened *them*: and, behold, their lord *was* fallen down dead on the earth.

26 And Ē-hūd escaped while they tarried, and passed beyond the quarries, and escaped unto Sē-ī-rāth.

27 And it came to pass, when he was come, that he blew a trumpet in the mountain of Ē-phrā-īm, and the children of Īś-rā-ēl went down with him from the mount, and he before them.

28 And he said unto them, Follow after me: for the LORD hath delivered your enemies the Mō-āb-ites into your hand. And they went down after him, and took the fords of Jōr-dān toward Mō-āb, and suffered not a man to pass over.

29 And they slew of Mō-āb at that time about ten thousand men, all lusty, and all men of valour; and there escaped not a man.

30 So Mō-āb was subdued that day under the hand of Īś-rā-ēl. And the land had rest fourscore years.

31 ¶ And after him was Shām-gār the son of Ā-nāth, which slew of the Phīl-īs-tīnēs six hundred men with an ox goad: and he also delivered Īś-rā-ēl.

## CHAPTER 4

AND the children of Īś-rā-ēl again did evil in the sight of the LORD, when Ē-hūd was dead.

2 And the LORD sold them into the hand of Jā-bīn king of Cā-nā-ān, that reigned in Hā-zōr; the captain of whose host was Sīs-ē-rā, which dwelt in Hā-rō-shēth of the Ġēn-tīlēs.

3 And the children of Īś-rā-ēl cried unto the LORD: for he had nine hundred chariots of iron; and twenty years he mightily oppressed the children of Īś-rā-ēl.

4 ¶ And Dēb-ō-rāh, a prophetess, the wife of Lāp-ī-dōth, she judged Īś-rā-ēl at that time.

5 And she dwelt under the palm tree of Dēb-ō-rāh between Rā-māh and Bēth-ēl in mount Ē-phrā-īm: and the children of Īś-rā-ēl came up to her for judgment.

6 And she sent and called Bâr-āk the son of Ā-bīn-ō-ām out of Kē-dēsh-nāph-tā-lī, and said unto him, Hath not the LORD God of Īś-rā-ēl commanded, *saying*, Go and draw toward mount Tā-bôr, and take with thee ten thousand men of the children of Nāph-tā-lī and of the children of Zē-bū-lūn?

7 And I will draw unto thee to the river Kī-shōn Sīs-ē-rā, the captain of Jā-bīn's army, with his chariots and his multitude; and I will deliver him into thine hand.

8 And Bâr-āk said unto her, If thou wilt go with me, then I will go: but if thou wilt not go with me, *then* I will not go.

9 And she said, I will surely go with thee: notwithstanding the journey that thou takest shall not be for thine honour; for the LORD shall sell Sīs-ē-rā into the hand of a woman. And Dēb-ō-rāh arose, and went with Bâr-āk to Kē-dēsh.

10 ¶ And Bâr-āk called Zē-bū-lūn and Nāph-tā-lī to Kē-dēsh; and he went up with ten thousand men at his feet: and Dēb-ō-rāh

went up with him.

11 Now Hē-bēr the Kē-nīte, *which was* of the children of Hō-bāb the father in law of Mō-šēs, had severed himself from the Kē-nītes, and pitched his tent unto the plain of Zā-ā-nā-īm, which is by Kē-dēsh.

12 And they shewed Sīs-ē-rā that Bâr-āk the son of Ā-bīn-ō-ām was gone up to mount Tā-bôr.

13 And Sīs-ē-rā gathered together all his chariots, *even* nine hundred chariots of iron, and all the people that *were* with him, from Hā-rō-shēth of the Ġēn-tīlēs unto the river of Kī-shōn.

14 And Dēb-ō-rāh said unto Bâr-āk, Up; for this *is* the day in which the LORD hath delivered Sīs-ē-rā into thine hand: is not the LORD gone out before thee? So Bâr-āk went down from mount Tā-bôr, and ten thousand men after him.

15 And the LORD discomfited Sīs-ē-rā, and all *his* chariots, and all *his* host, with the edge of the sword before Bâr-āk; so that Sīs-ē-rā lighted down off *his* chariot, and fled away on his feet.

16 But Bâr-āk pursued after the chariots, and after the host, unto Hā-rō-shēth of the Ġēn-tīlēs: and all the host of Sīs-ē-rā fell upon the edge of the sword; *and* there was not a man left.

17 Howbeit Sīs-ē-rā fled away on his feet to the tent of Jā-ēl the wife of Hē-bēr the Kē-nīte: for *there was* peace between Jā-bīn the king of Hā-zôr and the house of Hē-bēr the Kē-nīte.

18 ¶ And Jā-ēl went out to meet Sīs-ē-rā, and said unto him, Turn in, my lord, turn in to me; fear not. And when he had turned in unto her into the tent, she covered him with a mantle.

19 And he said unto her, Give me, I pray thee, a little water to drink; for I am thirsty. And she opened a bottle of milk, and gave him drink, and covered him.

20 Again he said unto her, Stand in the door of the tent, and it shall be, when any man doth come and inquire of thee, and say, Is there any man here? that thou shalt say, No.

21 Then Jā-ēl Hē-bēr's wife took a nail of the tent, and took an hammer in her hand, and went softly unto him, and smote the nail into his temples, and fastened it into the ground: for he was fast asleep and weary. So he died.

22 And, behold, as Bâr-āk pursued Sīs-ē-rā, Jā-ēl came out to meet him, and said unto him, Come, and I will shew thee the man whom thou seekest. And when he came into her *tent*, behold, Sīs-ē-rā lay dead, and the nail *was* in his temples.

23 So God subdued on that day Jā-bīn the king of Cā-nā-ān before the children of Īś-rā-ēl.

24 And the hand of the children of Īś-rā-ēl prospered, and prevailed against Jā-bīn the king of Cā-nā-ān, until they had destroyed Jā-bīn king of Cā-nā-ān.

## CHAPTER 5

THEN sang Dēb-ō-rāh and Bâr-āk the son of Ā-bīn-ō-ām on that day, saying,

2 Praise ye the LORD for the avenging of Īś-rā-ēl, when the people willingly offered themselves.

3 Hear, O ye kings; give ear, O ye princes; I, *even* I, will sing unto the LORD; I will sing *praise* to the LORD God of Īś-rā-ēl.

4 LORD, when thou wentest out of Sē-īr, when thou marchedst out of the field of Ē-dōm, the earth trembled, and the heavens dropped, the clouds also dropped water.

5 The mountains melted from before the LORD, *even* that Sī-nāi from before the LORD God of Īś-rā-ēl.

6 In the days of Shām-gār the son of Ā-nāth, in the days of Jā-ēl, the highways were unoccupied, and the travellers walked

through byways.

7 *The inhabitants of the villages ceased, they ceased in ʾĪś-rā-ēl, until that I Dēb-ō-rāh arose, that I arose a mother in ʾĪś-rā-ēl.*

8 They chose new gods; then was war in the gates: was there a shield or spear seen among forty thousand in ʾĪś-rā-ēl?

9 My heart is toward the governors of ʾĪś-rā-ēl, that offered themselves willingly among the people. Bless ye the LORD.

10 Speak, ye that ride on white asses, ye that sit in judgment, and walk by the way.

11 *They that are delivered from the noise of archers in the places of drawing water, there shall they rehearse the righteous acts of the LORD, even the righteous acts toward the inhabitants of his villages in ʾĪś-rā-ēl: then shall the people of the LORD go down to the gates.*

12 Awake, awake, Dēb-ō-rāh: awake, awake, utter a song: arise, Bār-āk, and lead thy captivity captive, thou son of Ā-bīn-ō-ām.

13 Then he made him that remaineth have dominion over the nobles among the people: the LORD made me have dominion over the mighty.

14 Out of Ē-phrā-īm was there a root of them against Ām-ā-lēk; after thee, Bēn-jā-mīn, among thy people; out of Mā-chīr came down governors, and out of Zē-bū-lūn they that handle the pen of the writer.

15 And the princes of ʾĪś-sā-chār were with Dēb-ō-rāh; even ʾĪś-sā-chār, and also Bār-āk: he was sent on foot into the valley. For the divisions of Reu-bēn there were great thoughts of heart.

16 Why abodest thou among the sheepfolds, to hear the bleatings of the flocks? For the divisions of Reu-bēn there were great searchings of heart.

17 Gīl-ē-ād abode beyond Jōr-dān: and why did Dān remain in ships? Āsh-ēr continued on the sea shore, and abode in his breaches.

18 Zē-bū-lūn and Nāph-tā-lī were a people that jeopardized their lives unto the death in the high places of the field.

19 The kings came and fought, then fought the kings of Cā-nā-ān in Tā-ā-nāch by the waters of Mē-gīd-dō; they took no gain of money.

20 They fought from heaven; the stars in their courses fought against Sīs-ē-rā.

21 The river of Kī-shōn swept them away, that ancient river, the river Kī-shōn. O my soul, thou hast trodden down strength.

22 Then were the horsehoofs broken by the means of the pransings, the pransings of their mighty ones.

23 Curse ye Mē-rōz, said the angel of the LORD, curse ye bitterly the inhabitants thereof; because they came not to the help of the LORD, to the help of the LORD against the mighty.

24 Blessed above women shall Jā-ēl the wife of Hē-bēr the Kē-nīte be, blessed shall she be above women in the tent.

25 He asked water, and she gave him milk; she brought forth butter in a lordly dish.

26 She put her hand to the nail, and her right hand to the workmen's hammer; and with the hammer she smote Sīs-ē-rā, she smote off his head, when she had pierced and stricken through his temples.

27 At her feet he bowed, he fell, he lay down: at her feet he bowed, he fell: where he bowed, there he fell down dead.

28 The mother of Sīs-ē-rā looked out at a window, and cried through the lattice, Why is his chariot so long in coming? why tarry the wheels of his chariots?

29 Her wise ladies answered her, yea, she returned answer to herself,

30 Have they not sped? have they not divided the prey; to every man a damsel or two; to Sīs-ē-rā a prey of divers colours, a prey of divers colours of needlework, of divers colours of needlework on both sides, meet for the necks of them that take the spoil?

31 So let all thine enemies perish, O LORD: but let them that love him be as the sun when he goeth forth in his might. And the land had rest forty years.

## CHAPTER 6

AND the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl did evil in the sight of the LORD: and the LORD delivered them into the hand of Mīd-ī-ān seven years.

2 And the hand of Mīd-ī-ān prevailed against ʾĪś-rā-ēl: and because of the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl made them the dens which are in the mountains, and caves, and strong holds.

3 And so it was, when ʾĪś-rā-ēl had sown, that the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes came up, and the Ā-māl-ēk-ītes, and the children of the east, even they came up against them;

4 And they encamped against them, and destroyed the increase of the earth, till thou come unto Gā-zā, and left no sustenance for ʾĪś-rā-ēl, neither sheep, nor ox, nor ass.

5 For they came up with their cattle and their tents, and they came as grasshoppers for multitude; for both they and their camels were without number: and they entered into the land to destroy it.

6 And ʾĪś-rā-ēl was greatly impoverished because of the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes; and the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl cried unto the LORD.

7 ¶ And it came to pass, when the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl cried unto the LORD because of the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes,

8 That the LORD sent a prophet unto the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl, which said unto them, Thus saith the LORD God of ʾĪś-rā-ēl, I brought you up from Ē-gypt, and brought you forth out of the house of bondage;

9 And I delivered you out of the hand of the Ē-gypt-īans, and out of the hand of all that oppressed you, and drave them out from before you, and gave you their land;

10 And I said unto you, I am the LORD your God; fear not the gods of the Ām-ō-rītes, in whose land ye dwell: but ye have not obeyed my voice.

11 ¶ And there came an angel of the LORD, and sat under an oak which was in Ōph-rāh, that pertained unto Jō-āsh the Ā-bī-ēz-rite: and his son Gīd-ē-ōn threshed wheat by the winepress, to hide it from the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes.

12 And the angel of the LORD appeared unto him, and said unto him, The LORD is with thee, thou mighty man of valour.

13 And Gīd-ē-ōn said unto him, Oh my Lord, if the LORD be with us, why then is all this befallen us? and where be all his miracles which our fathers told us of, saying, Did not the LORD bring us up from Ē-gypt? but now the LORD hath forsaken us, and delivered us into the hands of the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes.

14 And the LORD looked upon him, and said, Go in this thy might, and thou shalt save ʾĪś-rā-ēl from the hand of the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes: have not I sent thee?

15 And he said unto him, Oh my Lord, wherewith shall I save ʾĪś-rā-ēl? behold, my family is poor in Mā-nās-sēh, and I am the least in my father's house.

16 And the LORD said unto him, Surely I will be with thee, and thou shalt smite the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes as one man.

17 And he said unto him, If now I have found grace in thy sight, then shew me a sign that thou talkest with me.

18 Depart not hence, I pray thee, until I come unto thee, and bring forth my present, and set *it* before thee. And he said, I will tarry until thou come again.

19 ¶ And Gīd'ē-ōn went in, and made ready a kid, and unleavened cakes of an ē-phāh of flour: the flesh he put in a basket, and he put the broth in a pot, and brought *it* out unto him under the oak, and presented *it*.

20 And the angel of God said unto him, Take the flesh and the unleavened cakes, and lay *them* upon this rock, and pour out the broth. And he did so.

21 ¶ Then the angel of the LORD put forth the end of the staff that was in his hand, and touched the flesh and the unleavened cakes; and there rose up fire out of the rock, and consumed the flesh and the unleavened cakes. Then the angel of the LORD departed out of his sight.

22 And when Gīd'ē-ōn perceived that he was an angel of the LORD, Gīd'ē-ōn said, Alas, O Lord GOD! for because I have seen an angel of the LORD face to face.

23 And the LORD said unto him, Peace *be* unto thee; fear not: thou shalt not die.

24 Then Gīd'ē-ōn built an altar there unto the LORD, and called it Jē-hō-vāh-shā-lōm: unto this day it is yet in Ōph-rāh of the Ā-bī-ēz-rītes.

25 ¶ And it came to pass the same night, that the LORD said unto him, Take thy father's young bullock, even the second bullock of seven years old, and throw down the altar of Bā-āl that thy father hath, and cut down the grove that is by it:

26 And build an altar unto the LORD thy God upon the top of this rock, in the ordered place, and take the second bullock, and offer a burnt sacrifice with the wood of the grove which thou shalt cut down.

27 Then Gīd'ē-ōn took ten men of his servants, and did as the LORD had said unto him: and so it was, because he feared his father's household, and the men of the city, that he could not do *it* by day, that he did *it* by night.

28 ¶ And when the men of the city arose early in the morning, behold, the altar of Bā-āl was cast down, and the grove was cut down that was by it, and the second bullock was offered upon the altar *that* was built.

29 And they said one to another, Who hath done this thing? And when they inquired and asked, they said, Gīd'ē-ōn the son of Jō-āsh hath done this thing.

30 Then the men of the city said unto Jō-āsh, Bring out thy son, that he may die: because he hath cast down the altar of Bā-āl, and because he hath cut down the grove that was by it.

31 And Jō-āsh said unto all that stood against him, Will ye plead for Bā-āl? will ye save him? he that will plead for him, let him be put to death whilst *it is yet* morning; if he *be* a god, let him plead for himself, because *one* hath cast down his altar.

32 Therefore on that day he called him Jēr-üb-bā-āl, saying, Let Bā-āl plead against him, because he hath thrown down his altar.

33 ¶ Then all the Mīd'ī-ā-nītes and the Ā-māl'ēk-ītes and the children of the east were gathered together, and went over, and pitched in the valley of Jēz-rēel.

34 But the Spirit of the LORD came upon Gīd'ē-ōn, and he blew a trumpet; and Ā-bī-ē-zēr was gathered after him.

35 And he sent messengers throughout all Mā-nās-sēh; who also

was gathered after him: and he sent messengers unto Āsh-ēr, and unto Zē-bū-lūn, and unto Nāph-tā-lī; and they came up to meet them.

36 ¶ And Gīd'ē-ōn said unto God, If thou wilt save Īś-rā-ēl by mine hand, as thou hast said,

37 Behold, I will put a fleece of wool in the floor; and if the dew be on the fleece only, and *it be* dry upon all the earth *beside*, then shall I know that thou wilt save Īś-rā-ēl by mine hand, as thou hast said.

38 And it was so: for he rose up early on the morrow, and thrust the fleece together, and wringed the dew out of the fleece, a bowl full of water.

39 And Gīd'ē-ōn said unto God, Let not thine anger be hot against me, and I will speak but this once: let me prove, I pray thee, but this once with the fleece; let it now be dry only upon the fleece, and upon all the ground let there be dew.

40 And God did so that night: for it was dry upon the fleece only, and there was dew on all the ground.

## CHAPTER 7

**T**HEN Jēr-üb-bā-āl, who is Gīd'ē-ōn, and all the people that were with him, rose up early, and pitched beside the well of Hār-ōd: so that the host of the Mīd'ī-ā-nītes were on the north side of them, by the hill of Mō-rēh, in the valley.

2 And the LORD said unto Gīd'ē-ōn, The people that *are* with thee *are* too many for me to give the Mīd'ī-ā-nītes into their hands, lest Īś-rā-ēl vaunt themselves against me, saying, Mine own hand hath saved me.

3 Now therefore go to, proclaim in the ears of the people, saying, Whosoever is fearful and afraid, let him return and depart early from mount Gīl'ē-ād. And there returned of the people twenty and two thousand; and there remained ten thousand.

4 And the LORD said unto Gīd'ē-ōn, The people *are* yet too many; bring them down unto the water, and I will try them for thee there: and it shall be, *that* of whom I say unto thee, This shall go with thee, the same shall go with thee; and of whomsoever I say unto thee, This shall not go with thee, the same shall not go.

5 So he brought down the people unto the water: and the LORD said unto Gīd'ē-ōn, Every one that lappeth of the water with his tongue, as a dog lappeth, him shalt thou set by himself; likewise every one that boweth down upon his knees to drink.

6 And the number of them that lapped, *putting* their hand to their mouth, were three hundred men: but all the rest of the people bowed down upon their knees to drink water.

7 And the LORD said unto Gīd'ē-ōn, By the three hundred men that lapped will I save you, and deliver the Mīd'ī-ā-nītes into thine hand: and let all the *other* people go every man unto his place.

8 So the people took victuals in their hand, and their trumpets: and he sent all *the rest* of Īś-rā-ēl every man unto his tent, and retained those three hundred men: and the host of Mīd'ī-ān was beneath him in the valley.

9 ¶ And it came to pass the same night, that the LORD said unto him, Arise, get thee down unto the host; for I have delivered it into thine hand.

10 But if thou fear to go down, go thou with Phū-rāh thy servant down to the host:

11 And thou shalt hear what they say; and afterward shall thine hands be strengthened to go down unto the host. Then went he down with Phū-rāh his servant unto the outside of the armed

men that *were* in the host.

12 And the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes and the Ā-māl-ēk-ītes and all the children of the east lay along in the valley like grasshoppers for multitude; and their camels *were* without number, as the sand by the sea side for multitude.

13 And when Gīd-ē-ōn was come, behold, *there was* a man that told a dream unto his fellow, and said, Behold, I dreamed a dream, and, lo, a cake of barley bread tumbled into the host of Mīd-ī-ān, and came unto a tent, and smote it that it fell, and overturned it, that the tent lay along.

14 And his fellow answered and said, This is nothing else save the sword of Gīd-ē-ōn the son of Jō-āsh, a man of Īs-rā-ēl: *for* into his hand hath God delivered Mīd-ī-ān, and all the host.

15 ¶ And it was so, when Gīd-ē-ōn heard the telling of the dream, and the interpretation thereof, that he worshipped, and returned into the host of Īs-rā-ēl, and said, Arise; for the LORD hath delivered into your hand the host of Mīd-ī-ān.

16 And he divided the three hundred men *into* three companies, and he put a trumpet in every man's hand, with empty pitchers, and lamps within the pitchers.

17 And he said unto them, Look on me, and do likewise: and, behold, when I come to the outside of the camp, it shall be *that*, as I do, so shall ye do.

18 When I blow with a trumpet, I and all that *are* with me, then blow ye the trumpets also on every side of all the camp, and say, *The sword* of the LORD, and of Gīd-ē-ōn.

19 ¶ So Gīd-ē-ōn, and the hundred men that *were* with him, came unto the outside of the camp in the beginning of the middle watch; and they had but newly set the watch: and they blew the trumpets, and brake the pitchers that *were* in their hands.

20 And the three companies blew the trumpets, and brake the pitchers, and held the lamps in their left hands, and the trumpets in their right hands to blow *withal*: and they cried, The sword of the LORD, and of Gīd-ē-ōn.

21 And they stood every man in his place round about the camp: and all the host ran, and cried, and fled.

22 And the three hundred blew the trumpets, and the LORD set every man's sword against his fellow, even throughout all the host: and the host fled to Bēth-shīt-tāh in Zēr-ē-rāth, *and* to the border of Ā-bēl-mē-hō-lāh, unto Tāb-bāth.

23 And the men of Īs-rā-ēl gathered themselves together out of Nāph-tā-lī, and out of Āsh-ēr, and out of all Mā-nās-sēh, and pursued after the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes.

24 ¶ And Gīd-ē-ōn sent messengers throughout all mount Ē-phrā-īm, saying, Come down against the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes, and take before them the waters unto Bēth-bār-āh and Jōr-dān. Then all the men of Ē-phrā-īm gathered themselves together, and took the waters unto Bēth-bār-āh and Jōr-dān.

25 And they took two princes of the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes, Ōr-ēb and Zēeb; and they slew Ōr-ēb upon the rock Ōr-ēb, and Zēeb they slew at the winepress of Zēeb, and pursued Mīd-ī-ān, and brought the heads of Ōr-ēb and Zēeb to Gīd-ē-ōn on the other side Jōr-dān.

#### CHAPTER 8

**A**ND the men of Ē-phrā-īm said unto him, Why hast thou served us thus, that thou calledst us not, when thou wentest to fight with the Mīd-ī-ā-nītes? And they did chide with him sharply.

2 And he said unto them, What have I done now in comparison of

you? *Is* not the gleaning of the grapes of Ē-phrā-īm better than the vintage of Ā-bī-ē-zēr?

3 God hath delivered into your hands the princes of Mīd-ī-ān, Ōr-ēb and Zēeb: and what was I able to do in comparison of you? Then their anger was abated toward him, when he had said that.

4 ¶ And Gīd-ē-ōn came to Jōr-dān, *and* passed over, he, and the three hundred men that *were* with him, faint, yet pursuing *them*.

5 And he said unto the men of Sūc-cōth, Give, I pray you, loaves of bread unto the people that follow me; for they *be* faint, and I am pursuing after Zē-bāh and Zāl-mūn-nā, kings of Mīd-ī-ān.

6 ¶ And the princes of Sūc-cōth said, *Are* the hands of Zē-bāh and Zāl-mūn-nā now in thine hand, that we should give bread unto thine army?

7 And Gīd-ē-ōn said, Therefore when the LORD hath delivered Zē-bāh and Zāl-mūn-nā into mine hand, then I will tear your flesh with the thorns of the wilderness and with briers.

8 ¶ And he went up thence to Pēn-ū-ēl, and spake unto them likewise: and the men of Pēn-ū-ēl answered him as the men of Sūc-cōth had answered *him*.

9 And he spake also unto the men of Pēn-ū-ēl, saying, When I come again in peace, I will break down this tower.

10 ¶ Now Zē-bāh and Zāl-mūn-nā *were* in Kār-kōr, and their hosts with them, about fifteen thousand *men*, all that were left of all the hosts of the children of the east: for there fell an hundred and twenty thousand men that drew sword.

11 ¶ And Gīd-ē-ōn went up by the way of them that dwelt in tents on the east of Nō-bāh and Jōg-bē-hāh, and smote the host: for the host was secure.

12 And when Zē-bāh and Zāl-mūn-nā fled, he pursued after them, and took the two kings of Mīd-ī-ān, Zē-bāh and Zāl-mūn-nā, and discomfited all the host.

13 ¶ And Gīd-ē-ōn the son of Jō-āsh returned from battle before the sun was up,

14 And caught a young man of the men of Sūc-cōth, and inquired of him: and he described unto him the princes of Sūc-cōth, and the elders thereof, *even* threescore and seventeen men.

15 And he came unto the men of Sūc-cōth, and said, Behold Zē-bāh and Zāl-mūn-nā, with whom ye did upbraid me, saying, *Are* the hands of Zē-bāh and Zāl-mūn-nā now in thine hand, that we should give bread unto thy men *that are* weary?

16 And he took the elders of the city, and thorns of the wilderness and briers, and with them he taught the men of Sūc-cōth.

17 And he beat down the tower of Pēn-ū-ēl, and slew the men of the city.

18 ¶ Then said he unto Zē-bāh and Zāl-mūn-nā, What manner of men *were they* whom ye slew at Tā-bōr? And they answered, As thou art, so *were they*; each one resembled the children of a king.

19 And he said, They *were* my brethren, *even* the sons of my mother: as the LORD liveth, if ye had saved them alive, I would not slay you.

20 And he said unto Jē-thēr his firstborn, Up, *and* slay them. But the youth drew not his sword: for he feared, because he was yet a youth.

21 Then Zē-bāh and Zāl-mūn-nā said, Rise thou, and fall upon us: for as the man is, so is his strength. And Gīd-ē-ōn arose, and slew Zē-bāh and Zāl-mūn-nā, and took away the ornaments that *were* on their camels' necks.

22 ¶ Then the men of Īs-rā-ēl said unto Gīd-ē-ōn, Rule thou over us, both thou, and thy son, and thy son's son also: for thou hast

delivered us from the hand of Mīd-ī-ān.

23 And Gīd-ē-ōn said unto them, I will not rule over you, neither shall my son rule over you: the LORD shall rule over you.

24 ¶ And Gīd-ē-ōn said unto them, I would desire a request of you, that ye would give me every man the earrings of his prey. (For they had golden earrings, because they were Īsh-mā-ē-lītes.)

25 And they answered, We will willingly give *them*. And they spread a garment, and did cast therein every man the earrings of his prey.

26 And the weight of the golden earrings that he requested was a thousand and seven hundred *shē-kēls* of gold; beside ornaments, and collars, and purple raiment that was on the kings of Mīd-ī-ān, and beside the chains that were about their camels' necks.

27 And Gīd-ē-ōn made an ē-phōd thereof, and put it in his city, even in Ōph-rāh: and all Īs-rā-ēl went thither a whoring after it: which thing became a snare unto Gīd-ē-ōn, and to his house.

28 ¶ Thus was Mīd-ī-ān subdued before the children of Īs-rā-ēl, so that they lifted up their heads no more. And the country was in quietness forty years in the days of Gīd-ē-ōn.

29 ¶ And Jēr-üb-bā-āl the son of Jō-āsh went and dwelt in his own house.

30 And Gīd-ē-ōn had threescore and ten sons of his body begotten: for he had many wives.

31 And his concubine that was in Shē-chēm, she also bare him a son, whose name he called Ā-bīm-ē-lēch.

32 ¶ And Gīd-ē-ōn the son of Jō-āsh died in a good old age, and was buried in the sepulchre of Jō-āsh his father, in Ōph-rāh of the Ā-bī-ēz-rītes.

33 And it came to pass, as soon as Gīd-ē-ōn was dead, that the children of Īs-rā-ēl turned again, and went a whoring after Bā-ā-līm, and made Bā-āl-bē-rīth their god.

34 And the children of Īs-rā-ēl remembered not the LORD their God, who had delivered them out of the hands of all their enemies on every side:

35 Neither shewed they kindness to the house of Jēr-üb-bā-āl, namely, Gīd-ē-ōn, according to all the goodness which he had shewed unto Īs-rā-ēl.

#### CHAPTER 9

AND Ā-bīm-ē-lēch the son of Jēr-üb-bā-āl went to Shē-chēm unto his mother's brethren, and communed with them, and with all the family of the house of his mother's father, saying,

2 Speak, I pray you, in the ears of all the men of Shē-chēm, Whether is better for you, either that all the sons of Jēr-üb-bā-āl, which are threescore and ten persons, reign over you, or that one reign over you? remember also that I *am* your bone and your flesh.

3 And his mother's brethren spake of him in the ears of all the men of Shē-chēm all these words: and their hearts inclined to follow Ā-bīm-ē-lēch; for they said, He is our brother.

4 And they gave him threescore and ten *pieces* of silver out of the house of Bā-āl-bē-rīth, wherewith Ā-bīm-ē-lēch hired vain and light persons, which followed him.

5 And he went unto his father's house at Ōph-rāh, and slew his brethren the sons of Jēr-üb-bā-āl, being threescore and ten persons, upon one stone: notwithstanding yet Jō-thām the youngest son of Jēr-üb-bā-āl was left; for he hid himself.

6 And all the men of Shē-chēm gathered together, and all the house of Mīl-lō, and went, and made Ā-bīm-ē-lēch king, by the plain of the pillar that was in Shē-chēm.

7 ¶ And when they told it to Jō-thām, he went and stood in the top of mount Gē-rī-zīm, and lifted up his voice, and cried, and said unto them, Hearken unto me, ye men of Shē-chēm, that God may hearken unto you.

8 The trees went forth on a time to anoint a king over them; and they said unto the olive tree, Reign thou over us.

9 But the olive tree said unto them, Should I leave my fatness, wherewith by me they honour God and man, and go to be promoted over the trees?

10 And the trees said to the fig tree, Come thou, and reign over us.

11 But the fig tree said unto them, Should I forsake my sweetness, and my good fruit, and go to be promoted over the trees?

12 Then said the trees unto the vine, Come thou, and reign over us.

13 And the vine said unto them, Should I leave my wine, which cheereth God and man, and go to be promoted over the trees?

14 Then said all the trees unto the bramble, Come thou, and reign over us.

15 And the bramble said unto the trees, If in truth ye anoint me king over you, then come and put your trust in my shadow: and if not, let fire come out of the bramble, and devour the cedars of Lēb-ā-nōn.

16 Now therefore, if ye have done truly and sincerely, in that ye have made Ā-bīm-ē-lēch king, and if ye have dealt well with Jēr-üb-bā-āl and his house, and have done unto him according to the deserving of his hands;

17 (For my father fought for you, and adventured his life far, and delivered you out of the hand of Mīd-ī-ān:

18 And ye are risen up against my father's house this day, and have slain his sons, threescore and ten persons, upon one stone, and have made Ā-bīm-ē-lēch, the son of his maidservant, king over the men of Shē-chēm, because he is your brother;)

19 If ye then have dealt truly and sincerely with Jēr-üb-bā-āl and with his house this day, then rejoice ye in Ā-bīm-ē-lēch, and let him also rejoice in you:

20 But if not, let fire come out from Ā-bīm-ē-lēch, and devour the men of Shē-chēm, and the house of Mīl-lō; and let fire come out from the men of Shē-chēm, and from the house of Mīl-lō, and devour Ā-bīm-ē-lēch.

21 And Jō-thām ran away, and fled, and went to Bēer, and dwelt there, for fear of Ā-bīm-ē-lēch his brother.

22 ¶ When Ā-bīm-ē-lēch had reigned three years over Īs-rā-ēl,

23 Then God sent an evil spirit between Ā-bīm-ē-lēch and the men of Shē-chēm; and the men of Shē-chēm dealt treacherously with Ā-bīm-ē-lēch:

24 That the cruelty done to the threescore and ten sons of Jēr-üb-bā-āl might come, and their blood be laid upon Ā-bīm-ē-lēch their brother, which slew them; and upon the men of Shē-chēm, which aided him in the killing of his brethren.

25 And the men of Shē-chēm set liers in wait for him in the top of the mountains, and they robbed all that came along that way by them: and it was told Ā-bīm-ē-lēch.

26 And Gā-āl the son of Ē-bēd came with his brethren, and went over to Shē-chēm: and the men of Shē-chēm put their confidence in him.

27 And they went out into the fields, and gathered their vineyards, and trode the grapes, and made merry, and went into the house of their god, and did eat and drink, and cursed Ā-bīm-ē-lēch.

28 And Gā-āl the son of Ē-bēd said, Who is Ā-bīm-ē-lēch, and who is Shē-chēm, that we should serve him? is not *he* the son of Jēr-üb-bā-āl? and Zē-bül his officer? serve the men of Hā-môr the father of Shē-chēm: for why should we serve him?

29 And would to God this people were under my hand! then would I remove Ā-bīm-ē-lēch. And he said to Ā-bīm-ē-lēch, Increase thine army, and come out.

30 ¶ And when Zē-bül the ruler of the city heard the words of Gā-āl the son of Ē-bēd, his anger was kindled.

31 And he sent messengers unto Ā-bīm-ē-lēch privily, saying, Behold, Gā-āl the son of Ē-bēd and his brethren be come to Shē-chēm; and, behold, they fortify the city against thee.

32 Now therefore up by night, thou and the people that is with thee, and lie in wait in the field:

33 And it shall be, *that* in the morning, as soon as the sun is up, thou shalt rise early, and set upon the city: and, behold, *when* he and the people that is with him come out against thee, then mayest thou do to them as thou shalt find occasion.

34 ¶ And Ā-bīm-ē-lēch rose up, and all the people that were with him, by night, and they laid wait against Shē-chēm in four companies.

35 And Gā-āl the son of Ē-bēd went out, and stood in the entering of the gate of the city: and Ā-bīm-ē-lēch rose up, and the people that were with him, from lying in wait.

36 And when Gā-āl saw the people, he said to Zē-bül, Behold, there come people down from the top of the mountains. And Zē-bül said unto him, Thou seest the shadow of the mountains as if they were men.

37 And Gā-āl spake again and said, See there come people down by the middle of the land, and another company come along by the plain of Mē-ō-nē-nīm.

38 Then said Zē-bül unto him, Where is now thy mouth, wherewith thou saidst, Who is Ā-bīm-ē-lēch, that we should serve him? is not this the people that thou hast despised? go out, I pray now, and fight with them.

39 And Gā-āl went out before the men of Shē-chēm, and fought with Ā-bīm-ē-lēch.

40 And Ā-bīm-ē-lēch chased him, and he fled before him, and many were overthrown and wounded, *even* unto the entering of the gate.

41 And Ā-bīm-ē-lēch dwelt at Ā-rû-mäh: and Zē-bül thrust out Gā-āl and his brethren, that they should not dwell in Shē-chēm.

42 And it came to pass on the morrow, that the people went out into the field; and they told Ā-bīm-ē-lēch.

43 And he took the people, and divided them into three companies, and laid wait in the field, and looked, and, behold, the people were come forth out of the city; and he rose up against them, and smote them.

44 And Ā-bīm-ē-lēch, and the company that was with him, rushed forward, and stood in the entering of the gate of the city: and the two *other* companies ran upon all *the* people that were in the fields, and slew them.

45 And Ā-bīm-ē-lēch fought against the city all that day; and he took the city, and slew the people that was therein, and beat down the city, and sowed it with salt.

46 ¶ And when all the men of the tower of Shē-chēm heard *that*, they entered into an hold of the house of the god Berith.

47 And it was told Ā-bīm-ē-lēch, that all the men of the tower of Shē-chēm were gathered together.

48 And Ā-bīm-ē-lēch gat him up to mount Zäl-mön, he and all the people that were with him; and Ā-bīm-ē-lēch took an axe in his hand, and cut down a bough from the trees, and took it, and laid it on his shoulder, and said unto the people that were with him, What ye have seen me do, make haste, and do as I have done.

49 And all the people likewise cut down every man his bough, and followed Ā-bīm-ē-lēch, and put *them* to the hold, and set the hold on fire upon them; so that all the men of the tower of Shē-chēm died also, about a thousand men and women.

50 ¶ Then went Ā-bīm-ē-lēch to Thē-bēz, and encamped against Thē-bēz, and took it.

51 But there was a strong tower within the city, and thither fled all the men and women, and all they of the city, and shut *it* to them, and gat them up to the top of the tower.

52 And Ā-bīm-ē-lēch came unto the tower, and fought against it, and went hard unto the door of the tower to burn it with fire.

53 And a certain woman cast a piece of a millstone upon Ā-bīm-ē-lēch's head, and all to brake his skull.

54 Then he called hastily unto the young man his armourbearer, and said unto him, Draw thy sword, and slay me, that men say not of me, A woman slew him. And his young man thrust him through, and he died.

55 And when the men of Īs-rā-ēl saw that Ā-bīm-ē-lēch was dead, they departed every man unto his place.

56 ¶ Thus God rendered the wickedness of Ā-bīm-ē-lēch, which he did unto his father, in slaying his seventy brethren:

57 And all the evil of the men of Shē-chēm did God render upon their heads: and upon them came the curse of Jō-thām the son of Jēr-üb-bā-āl.

## CHAPTER 10

AND after Ā-bīm-ē-lēch there arose to defend Īs-rā-ēl Tō-lā the son of Pū-äh, the son of Dō-dō, a man of Īs-sā-chär; and he dwelt in Shā-mir in mount Ē-phrā-īm.

2 And he judged Īs-rā-ēl twenty and three years, and died, and was buried in Shā-mir.

3 ¶ And after him arose Jā-ir, a Gil-ē-ād-ite, and judged Īs-rā-ēl twenty and two years.

4 And he had thirty sons that rode on thirty ass colts, and they had thirty cities, which are called Hā-vōth-jā-ir unto this day, which are in the land of Gil-ē-ād.

5 And Jā-ir died, and was buried in Cā-mön.

6 ¶ And the children of Īs-rā-ēl did evil again in the sight of the LORD, and served Bā-ä-līm, and Āsh-tā-rōth, and the gods of Sūr-ī-ä, and the gods of Zī-dön, and the gods of Mō-äb, and the gods of the children of Ām-mön, and the gods of the Phil-īs-tineš, and forsook the LORD, and served not him.

7 And the anger of the LORD was hot against Īs-rā-ēl, and he sold them into the hands of the Phil-īs-tineš, and into the hands of the children of Ām-mön.

8 And that year they vexed and oppressed the children of Īs-rā-ēl: eighteen years, all the children of Īs-rā-ēl that were on the other side Jōr-dän in the land of the Ām-ō-rītes, which is in Gil-ē-ād.

9 Moreover the children of Ām-mön passed over Jōr-dän to fight also against Jüd-äh, and against Bēn-jä-mīn, and against the house of Ē-phrā-īm; so that Īs-rā-ēl was sore distressed.

10 ¶ And the children of Īs-rā-ēl cried unto the LORD, saying, We have sinned against thee, both because we have forsaken our God, and also served Bā-ä-līm.

11 And the LORD said unto the children of Īs-rā-ēl, Did not I deliver



you from the Ē-gÿp-tiāns, and from the Ām-ō-rītes, from the children of Ām-mōn, and from the Phīl-īs-tīnēs?

12 The Zī-dō-nī-āns also, and the Ā-māl-ēk-ītes, and the Mā-ōn-ītes, did oppress you; and ye cried to me, and I delivered you out of their hand.

13 Yet ye have forsaken me, and served other gods: wherefore I will deliver you no more.

14 Go and cry unto the gods which ye have chosen; let them deliver you in the time of your tribulation.

15 ¶ And the children of Īś-rā-ēl said unto the LORD, We have sinned: do thou unto us whatsoever seemeth good unto thee; deliver us only, we pray thee, this day.

16 And they put away the strange gods from among them, and served the LORD: and his soul was grieved for the misery of Īś-rā-ēl.

17 Then the children of Ām-mōn were gathered together, and encamped in Gīl-ē-ād. And the children of Īś-rā-ēl assembled themselves together, and encamped in Mīz-pēh.

18 And the people and princes of Gīl-ē-ād said one to another, What man is he that will begin to fight against the children of Ām-mōn? he shall be head over all the inhabitants of Gīl-ē-ād.

#### CHAPTER 11

**N**ow Jēph-thāh the Gīl-ē-ād-īte was a mighty man of valour, and he was the son of an harlot: and Gīl-ē-ād begat Jēph-thāh.

2 And Gīl-ē-ād's wife bare him sons; and his wife's sons grew up, and they thrust out Jēph-thāh, and said unto him, Thou shalt not inherit in our father's house; for thou art the son of a strange woman.

3 Then Jēph-thāh fled from his brethren, and dwelt in the land of Tōb: and there were gathered vain men to Jēph-thāh, and went out with him.

4 ¶ And it came to pass in process of time, that the children of Ām-mōn made war against Īś-rā-ēl.

5 And it was so, that when the children of Ām-mōn made war against Īś-rā-ēl, the elders of Gīl-ē-ād went to fetch Jēph-thāh out of the land of Tōb:

6 And they said unto Jēph-thāh, Come, and be our captain, that we may fight with the children of Ām-mōn.

7 And Jēph-thāh said unto the elders of Gīl-ē-ād, Did not ye hate me, and expel me out of my father's house? and why are ye come unto me now when ye are in distress?

8 And the elders of Gīl-ē-ād said unto Jēph-thāh, Therefore we turn again to thee now, that thou mayest go with us, and fight against the children of Ām-mōn, and be our head over all the inhabitants of Gīl-ē-ād.

9 And Jēph-thāh said unto the elders of Gīl-ē-ād, If ye bring me home again to fight against the children of Ām-mōn, and the LORD deliver them before me, shall I be your head?

10 And the elders of Gīl-ē-ād said unto Jēph-thāh, The LORD be witness between us, if we do not so according to thy words.

11 Then Jēph-thāh went with the elders of Gīl-ē-ād, and the people made him head and captain over them: and Jēph-thāh uttered all his words before the LORD in Mīz-pēh.

12 ¶ And Jēph-thāh sent messengers unto the king of the children of Ām-mōn, saying, What hast thou to do with me, that thou art come against me to fight in my land?

13 And the king of the children of Ām-mōn answered unto the messengers of Jēph-thāh, Because Īś-rā-ēl took away my land,

when they came up out of Ē-gÿpt, from Ār-nōn even unto Jāb-bōk, and unto Jōr-dān: now therefore restore those lands again peaceably.

14 And Jēph-thāh sent messengers again unto the king of the children of Ām-mōn:

15 And said unto him, Thus saith Jēph-thāh, Īś-rā-ēl took not away the land of Mō-āb, nor the land of the children of Ām-mōn:

16 But when Īś-rā-ēl came up from Ē-gÿpt, and walked through the wilderness unto the Red sea, and came to Kā-dēsh;

17 Then Īś-rā-ēl sent messengers unto the king of Ē-dōm, saying, Let me, I pray thee, pass through thy land: but the king of Ē-dōm would not hearken *thereto*. And in like manner they sent unto the king of Mō-āb: but he would not consent: and Īś-rā-ēl abode in Kā-dēsh.

18 Then they went along through the wilderness, and compassed the land of Ē-dōm, and the land of Mō-āb, and came by the east side of the land of Mō-āb, and pitched on the other side of Ār-nōn, but came not within the border of Mō-āb: for Ār-nōn was the border of Mō-āb.

19 And Īś-rā-ēl sent messengers unto Sī-hōn king of the Ām-ō-rītes, the king of Hēsh-bōn; and Īś-rā-ēl said unto him, Let us pass, we pray thee, through thy land into my place.

20 But Sī-hōn trusted not Īś-rā-ēl to pass through his coast: but Sī-hōn gathered all his people together, and pitched in Jā-hāz, and fought against Īś-rā-ēl.

21 And the LORD God of Īś-rā-ēl delivered Sī-hōn and all his people into the hand of Īś-rā-ēl, and they smote them: so Īś-rā-ēl possessed all the land of the Ām-ō-rītes, the inhabitants of that country.

22 And they possessed all the coasts of the Ām-ō-rītes, from Ār-nōn even unto Jāb-bōk, and from the wilderness even unto Jōr-dān.

23 So now the LORD God of Īś-rā-ēl hath dispossessed the Ām-ō-rītes from before his people Īś-rā-ēl, and shouldest thou possess it?

24 Wilt not thou possess that which Chē-mōsh thy god giveth thee to possess? So whomsoever the LORD our God shall drive out from before us, them will we possess.

25 And now art thou any thing better than Bā-lāk the son of Zīp-pōr, king of Mō-āb? did he ever strive against Īś-rā-ēl, or did he ever fight against them,

26 While Īś-rā-ēl dwelt in Hēsh-bōn and her towns, and in Ā-rō-ēr and her towns, and in all the cities that be along by the coasts of Ār-nōn, three hundred years? why therefore did ye not recover them within that time?

27 Wherefore I have not sinned against thee, but thou doest me wrong to war against me: the LORD the Judge be judge this day between the children of Īś-rā-ēl and the children of Ām-mōn.

28 Howbeit the king of the children of Ām-mōn hearkened not unto the words of Jēph-thāh which he sent him.

29 ¶ Then the Spirit of the LORD came upon Jēph-thāh, and he passed over Gīl-ē-ād, and Mā-nās-sēh, and passed over Mīz-pēh of Gīl-ē-ād, and from Mīz-pēh of Gīl-ē-ād he passed over unto the children of Ām-mōn.

30 And Jēph-thāh vowed a vow unto the LORD, and said, If thou shalt without fail deliver the children of Ām-mōn into mine hands,

31 Then it shall be, that whatsoever cometh forth of the doors of my house to meet me, when I return in peace from the children

of Ām'-mōn, shall surely be the LORD'S, and I will offer it up for a burnt offering.

32 ¶ So Jēph-thāh passed over unto the children of Ām'-mōn to fight against them; and the LORD delivered them into his hands.

33 And he smote them from Ā-rō-ēr, even till thou come to Mīn-nīth, *even* twenty cities, and unto the plain of the vineyards, with a very great slaughter. Thus the children of Ām'-mōn were subdued before the children of Īś-rā-ēl.

34 ¶ And Jēph-thāh came to Mīz-pēh unto his house, and, behold, his daughter came out to meet him with timbrels and with dances: and she *was* his only child; beside her he had neither son nor daughter.

35 And it came to pass, when he saw her, that he rent his clothes, and said, Alas, my daughter! thou hast brought me very low, and thou art one of them that trouble me: for I have opened my mouth unto the LORD, and I cannot go back.

36 And she said unto him, My father, *if* thou hast opened thy mouth unto the LORD, do to me according to that which hath proceeded out of thy mouth; forasmuch as the LORD hath taken vengeance for thee of thine enemies, *even* of the children of Ām'-mōn.

37 And she said unto her father, Let this thing be done for me: let me alone two months, that I may go up and down upon the mountains, and bewail my virginity, I and my fellows.

38 And he said, Go. And he sent her away *for* two months: and she went with her companions, and bewailed her virginity upon the mountains.

39 And it came to pass at the end of two months, that she returned unto her father, who did with her *according* to his vow which he had vowed: and she knew no man. And it was a custom in Īś-rā-ēl,

40 *That* the daughters of Īś-rā-ēl went yearly to lament the daughter of Jēph-thāh the Gīl-ē-ād-ite four days in a year.

## CHAPTER 12

**A**ND the men of Ē-phrā-īm gathered themselves together, and went northward, and said unto Jēph-thāh, Wherefore passedst thou over to fight against the children of Ām'-mōn, and didst not call us to go with thee? we will burn thine house upon thee with fire.

2 And Jēph-thāh said unto them, I and my people were at great strife with the children of Ām'-mōn; and when I called you, ye delivered me not out of their hands.

3 And when I saw that ye delivered *me* not, I put my life in my hands, and passed over against the children of Ām'-mōn, and the LORD delivered them into my hand: wherefore then are ye come up unto me this day, to fight against me?

4 Then Jēph-thāh gathered together all the men of Gīl-ē-ād, and fought with Ē-phrā-īm: and the men of Gīl-ē-ād smote Ē-phrā-īm, because they said, Ye Gīl-ē-ād-ites *are* fugitives of Ē-phrā-īm among the Ē-phrā-īm-ites, *and* among the Mā-nās-sites.

5 And the Gīl-ē-ād-ites took the passages of Jōr-dān before the Ē-phrā-īm-ites: and it was so, that when those Ē-phrā-īm-ites which were escaped said, Let me go over; that the men of Gīl-ē-ād said unto him, *Art* thou an Ē-phrā-īm-ite? If he said, Nay;

6 Then said they unto him, Say now Shīb-bō-lēth: and he said Sīb-bō-lēth: for he could not frame to pronounce *it* right. Then they took him, and slew him at the passages of Jōr-dān: and there fell at that time of the Ē-phrā-īm-ites forty and two thousand.

7 And Jēph-thāh judged Īś-rā-ēl six years. Then died Jēph-thāh

the Gīl-ē-ād-ite, and was buried in *one* of the cities of Gīl-ē-ād.

8 ¶ And after him Īb-zān of Bēth-lē-hēm judged Īś-rā-ēl.

9 And he had thirty sons, and thirty daughters, *whom* he sent abroad, and took in thirty daughters from abroad for his sons. And he judged Īś-rā-ēl seven years.

10 Then died Īb-zān, and was buried at Bēth-lē-hēm.

11 ¶ And after him Ē-lōn, a Zē-bū-lōn-ite, judged Īś-rā-ēl; and he judged Īś-rā-ēl ten years.

12 And Ē-lōn the Zē-bū-lōn-ite died, and was buried in Āi-jā-lōn in the country of Zē-bū-lūn.

13 ¶ And after him Āb-dōn the son of Hīl-lēl, a Pī-rā-thōn-ite, judged Īś-rā-ēl.

14 And he had forty sons and thirty nephews, that rode on threescore and ten ass colts: and he judged Īś-rā-ēl eight years.

15 And Āb-dōn the son of Hīl-lēl the Pī-rā-thōn-ite died, and was buried in Pī-rā-thōn in the land of Ē-phrā-īm, in the mount of the Ā-māl-ēk-ites.

## CHAPTER 13

**A**ND the children of Īś-rā-ēl did evil again in the sight of the LORD; and the LORD delivered them into the hand of the Phīl-īs-tīnēs forty years.

2 ¶ And there was a certain man of Zōr-āh, of the family of the Dān-ites, whose name was Mā-nō-āh; and his wife was barren, and bare not.

3 And the angel of the LORD appeared unto the woman, and said unto her, Behold now, thou *art* barren, and bearest not: but thou shalt conceive, and bear a son.

4 Now therefore beware, I pray thee, and drink not wine nor strong drink, and eat not any unclean *thing*:

5 For, lo, thou shalt conceive, and bear a son; and no razor shall come on his head: for the child shall be a Nāz-ā-rīte unto God from the womb: and he shall begin to deliver Īś-rā-ēl out of the hand of the Phīl-īs-tīnēs.

6 ¶ Then the woman came and told her husband, saying, A man of God came unto me, and his countenance *was* like the countenance of an angel of God, very terrible: but I asked him not whence he *was*, neither told he me his name:

7 But he said unto me, Behold, thou shalt conceive, and bear a son; and now drink no wine nor strong drink, neither eat any unclean *thing*: for the child shall be a Nāz-ā-rīte to God from the womb to the day of his death.

8 ¶ Then Mā-nō-āh intreated the LORD, and said, O my Lord, let the man of God which thou didst send come again unto us, and teach us what we shall do unto the child that shall be born.

9 And God hearkened to the voice of Mā-nō-āh; and the angel of God came again unto the woman as she sat in the field: but Mā-nō-āh her husband *was* not with her.

10 And the woman made haste, and ran, and shewed her husband, and said unto him, Behold, the man hath appeared unto me, that came unto me the *other* day.

11 And Mā-nō-āh arose, and went after his wife, and came to the man, and said unto him, *Art* thou the man that spakest unto the woman? And he said, *I am*.

12 And Mā-nō-āh said, Now let thy words come to pass. How shall we order the child, and *how* shall we do unto him?

13 And the angel of the LORD said unto Mā-nō-āh, Of all that I said unto the woman let her beware.

14 She may not eat of any *thing* that cometh of the vine, neither let her drink wine or strong drink, nor eat any unclean *thing*: all

that I commanded her let her observe.

15 ¶ And Mă-nō-ăh said unto the angel of the LORD, I pray thee, let us detain thee, until we shall have made ready a kid for thee.

16 And the angel of the LORD said unto Mă-nō-ăh, Though thou detain me, I will not eat of thy bread: and if thou wilt offer a burnt offering, thou must offer it unto the LORD. For Mă-nō-ăh knew not that he was an angel of the LORD.

17 And Mă-nō-ăh said unto the angel of the LORD, What is thy name, that when thy sayings come to pass we may do thee honour?

18 And the angel of the LORD said unto him, Why askest thou thus after my name, seeing it is secret?

19 So Mă-nō-ăh took a kid with a meat offering, and offered it upon a rock unto the LORD: and the angel did wondrously; and Mă-nō-ăh and his wife looked on.

20 For it came to pass, when the flame went up toward heaven from off the altar, that the angel of the LORD ascended in the flame of the altar. And Mă-nō-ăh and his wife looked on it, and fell on their faces to the ground.

21 But the angel of the LORD did no more appear to Mă-nō-ăh and to his wife. Then Mă-nō-ăh knew that he was an angel of the LORD.

22 And Mă-nō-ăh said unto his wife, We shall surely die, because we have seen God.

23 But his wife said unto him, If the LORD were pleased to kill us, he would not have received a burnt offering and a meat offering at our hands, neither would he have shewed us all these things, nor would as at this time have told us such things as these.

24 ¶ And the woman bare a son, and called his name Săm-son: and the child grew, and the LORD blessed him.

25 And the Spirit of the LORD began to move him at times in the camp of Dăn between Zôr-ăh and Ĕsh-tă-öl.

#### CHAPTER 14

AND Săm-son went down to Tīm-năth, and saw a woman in Tīm-năth of the daughters of the Phīl-īs-tīnēs.

2 And he came up, and told his father and his mother, and said, I have seen a woman in Tīm-năth of the daughters of the Phīl-īs-tīnēs: now therefore get her for me to wife.

3 Then his father and his mother said unto him, Is there never a woman among the daughters of thy brethren, or among all my people, that thou goest to take a wife of the uncircumcised Phīl-īs-tīnēs? And Săm-son said unto his father, Get her for me; for she pleaseth me well.

4 But his father and his mother knew not that it was of the LORD, that he sought an occasion against the Phīl-īs-tīnēs: for at that time the Phīl-īs-tīnēs had dominion over Īś-ră-ěl.

5 ¶ Then went Săm-son down, and his father and his mother, to Tīm-năth, and came to the vineyards of Tīm-năth: and, behold, a young lion roared against him.

6 And the Spirit of the LORD came mightily upon him, and he rent him as he would have rent a kid, and he had nothing in his hand: but he told not his father or his mother what he had done.

7 And he went down, and talked with the woman; and she pleased Săm-son well.

8 ¶ And after a time he returned to take her, and he turned aside to see the carcase of the lion: and, behold, there was a swarm of bees and honey in the carcase of the lion.

9 And he took thereof in his hands, and went on eating, and came to his father and mother, and he gave them, and they did eat: but

he told not them that he had taken the honey out of the carcase of the lion.

10 ¶ So his father went down unto the woman: and Săm-son made there a feast; for so used the young men to do.

11 And it came to pass, when they saw him, that they brought thirty companions to be with him.

12 ¶ And Săm-son said unto them, I will now put forth a riddle unto you: if ye can certainly declare it me within the seven days of the feast, and find it out, then I will give you thirty sheets and thirty change of garments:

13 But if ye cannot declare it me, then shall ye give me thirty sheets and thirty change of garments. And they said unto him, Put forth thy riddle, that we may hear it.

14 And he said unto them, Out of the eater came forth meat, and out of the strong came forth sweetness. And they could not in three days expound the riddle.

15 And it came to pass on the seventh day, that they said unto Săm-son's wife, Entice thy husband, that he may declare unto us the riddle, lest we burn thee and thy father's house with fire: have ye called us to take that we have? is it not so?

16 And Săm-son's wife wept before him, and said, Thou dost but hate me, and lovest me not: thou hast put forth a riddle unto the children of my people, and hast not told it me. And he said unto her, Behold, I have not told it my father nor my mother, and shall I tell it thee?

17 And she wept before him the seven days, while their feast lasted: and it came to pass on the seventh day, that he told her, because she lay sore upon him: and she told the riddle to the children of her people.

18 And the men of the city said unto him on the seventh day before the sun went down, What is sweeter than honey? and what is stronger than a lion? And he said unto them, If ye had not plowed with my heifer, ye had not found out my riddle.

19 ¶ And the Spirit of the LORD came upon him, and he went down to Āsh-kē-lon, and slew thirty men of them, and took their spoil, and gave change of garments unto them which expounded the riddle. And his anger was kindled, and he went up to his father's house.

20 But Săm-son's wife was given to his companion, whom he had used as his friend.

#### CHAPTER 15

BUT it came to pass within a while after, in the time of wheat harvest, that Săm-son visited his wife with a kid; and he said, I will go in to my wife into the chamber. But her father would not suffer him to go in.

2 And her father said, I verily thought that thou hadst utterly hated her; therefore I gave her to thy companion: is not her younger sister fairer than she? take her, I pray thee, instead of her.

3 ¶ And Săm-son said concerning them, Now shall I be more blameless than the Phīl-īs-tīnēs, though I do them a displeasure.

4 And Săm-son went and caught three hundred foxes, and took firebrands, and turned tail to tail, and put a firebrand in the midst between two tails.

5 And when he had set the brands on fire, he let them go into the standing corn of the Phīl-īs-tīnēs, and burnt up both the shocks, and also the standing corn, with the vineyards and olives.

6 ¶ Then the Phīl-īs-tīnēs said, Who hath done this? And they answered, Săm-son, the son in law of the Tīm-nīte, because he

had taken his wife, and given her to his companion. And the Phīl'īs-tīneš came up, and burnt her and her father with fire.

7 ¶ And Sām'son said unto them, Though ye have done this, yet will I be avenged of you, and after that I will cease.

8 And he smote them hip and thigh with a great slaughter: and he went down and dwelt in the top of the rock Ē'tām.

9 ¶ Then the Phīl'īs-tīneš went up, and pitched in Jûd'āh, and spread themselves in Lē'hī.

10 And the men of Jûd'āh said, Why are ye come up against us? And they answered, To bind Sām'son are we come up, to do to him as he hath done to us.

11 Then three thousand men of Jûd'āh went to the top of the rock Ē'tām, and said to Sām'son, Knowest thou not that the Phīl'īs-tīneš are rulers over us? what is this that thou hast done unto us? And he said unto them, As they did unto me, so have I done unto them.

12 And they said unto him, We are come down to bind thee, that we may deliver thee into the hand of the Phīl'īs-tīneš. And Sām'son said unto them, Swear unto me, that ye will not fall upon me yourselves.

13 And they spake unto him, saying, No; but we will bind thee fast, and deliver thee into their hand: but surely we will not kill thee. And they bound him with two new cords, and brought him up from the rock.

14 ¶ And when he came unto Lē'hī, the Phīl'īs-tīneš shouted against him: and the Spirit of the LORD came mightily upon him, and the cords that were upon his arms became as flax that was burnt with fire, and his bands loosed from off his hands.

15 And he found a new jawbone of an ass, and put forth his hand, and took it, and slew a thousand men therewith.

16 And Sām'son said, With the jawbone of an ass, heaps upon heaps, with the jaw of an ass have I slain a thousand men.

17 And it came to pass, when he had made an end of speaking, that he cast away the jawbone out of his hand, and called that place Rā'māth-lē'hī.

18 ¶ And he was sore athirst, and called on the LORD, and said, Thou hast given this great deliverance into the hand of thy servant: and now shall I die for thirst, and fall into the hand of the uncircumcised?

19 But God clave an hollow place that was in the jaw, and there came water thereout; and when he had drunk, his spirit came again, and he revived: wherefore he called the name thereof Ēn-hāk-kôr-ē, which is in Lē'hī unto this day.

20 And he judged Īš-rā-ēl in the days of the Phīl'īs-tīneš twenty years.

## CHAPTER 16

THEN went Sām'son to Gā'zā, and saw there an harlot, and went in unto her.

2 And it was told the Gā'zites, saying, Sām'son is come hither. And they compassed him in, and laid wait for him all night in the gate of the city, and were quiet all the night, saying, In the morning, when it is day, we shall kill him.

3 And Sām'son lay till midnight, and arose at midnight, and took the doors of the gate of the city, and the two posts, and went away with them, bar and all, and put them upon his shoulders, and carried them up to the top of an hill that is before Hē-brōn.

4 ¶ And it came to pass afterward, that he loved a woman in the valley of Sôr-ēk, whose name was Dē-lī'lāh.

5 And the lords of the Phīl'īs-tīneš came up unto her, and said

unto her, Entice him, and see wherein his great strength *lieth*, and by what *means* we may prevail against him, that we may bind him to afflict him: and we will give thee every one of us eleven hundred *pieces* of silver.

6 ¶ And Dē-lī'lāh said to Sām'son, Tell me, I pray thee, wherein thy great strength *lieth*, and wherewith thou mightest be bound to afflict thee.

7 And Sām'son said unto her, If they bind me with seven green withs that were never dried, then shall I be weak, and be as another man.

8 Then the lords of the Phīl'īs-tīneš brought up to her seven green withs which had not been dried, and she bound him with them.

9 Now *there were* men lying in wait, abiding with her in the chamber. And she said unto him, The Phīl'īs-tīneš be upon thee, Sām'son. And he brake the withs, as a thread of tow is broken when it toucheth the fire. So his strength was not known.

10 And Dē-lī'lāh said unto Sām'son, Behold, thou hast mocked me, and told me lies: now tell me, I pray thee, wherewith thou mightest be bound.

11 And he said unto her, If they bind me fast with new ropes that never were occupied, then shall I be weak, and be as another man.

12 Dē-lī'lāh therefore took new ropes, and bound him therewith, and said unto him, The Phīl'īs-tīneš be upon thee, Sām'son. And *there were* liars in wait abiding in the chamber. And he brake them from off his arms like a thread.

13 And Dē-lī'lāh said unto Sām'son, Hitherto thou hast mocked me, and told me lies: tell me wherewith thou mightest be bound. And he said unto her, If thou weavest the seven locks of my head with the web.

14 And she fastened it with the pin, and said unto him, The Phīl'īs-tīneš be upon thee, Sām'son. And he awaked out of his sleep, and went away with the pin of the beam, and with the web.

15 ¶ And she said unto him, How canst thou say, I love thee, when thine heart is not with me? thou hast mocked me these three times, and hast not told me wherein thy great strength *lieth*.

16 And it came to pass, when she pressed him daily with her words, and urged him, so that his soul was vexed unto death;

17 That he told her all his heart, and said unto her, There hath not come a razor upon mine head; for I *have been* a Nāz'ā-rīte unto God from my mother's womb: if I be shaven, then my strength will go from me, and I shall become weak, and be like any other man.

18 And when Dē-lī'lāh saw that he had told her all his heart, she sent and called for the lords of the Phīl'īs-tīneš, saying, Come up this once, for he hath shewed me all his heart. Then the lords of the Phīl'īs-tīneš came up unto her, and brought money in their hand.

19 And she made him sleep upon her knees; and she called for a man, and she caused him to shave off the seven locks of his head; and she began to afflict him, and his strength went from him.

20 And she said, The Phīl'īs-tīneš be upon thee, Sām'son. And he awoke out of his sleep, and said, I will go out as at other times before, and shake myself. And he wist not that the LORD was departed from him.

21 ¶ But the Phīl'īs-tīneš took him, and put out his eyes, and brought him down to Gā'zā, and bound him with fetters of brass; and he did grind in the prison house.

22 Howbeit the hair of his head began to grow again after he was shaven.

23 Then the lords of the Phīl'īs-tīneš gathered them together for to offer a great sacrifice unto Dā'gōn their god, and to rejoice: for they said, Our god hath delivered Sām'sōn our enemy into our hand.

24 And when the people saw him, they praised their god: for they said, Our god hath delivered into our hands our enemy, and the destroyer of our country, which slew many of us.

25 And it came to pass, when their hearts were merry, that they said, Call for Sām'sōn, that he may make us sport. And they called for Sām'sōn out of the prison house; and he made them sport: and they set him between the pillars.

26 And Sām'sōn said unto the lad that held him by the hand, Suffer me that I may feel the pillars whereupon the house standeth, that I may lean upon them.

27 Now the house was full of men and women; and all the lords of the Phīl'īs-tīneš were there; and *there were* upon the roof about three thousand men and women, that beheld while Sām'sōn made sport.

28 And Sām'sōn called unto the LORD, and said, O Lord GOD, remember me, I pray thee, and strengthen me, I pray thee, only this once, O God, that I may be at once avenged of the Phīl'īs-tīneš for my two eyes.

29 And Sām'sōn took hold of the two middle pillars upon which the house stood, and on which it was borne up, of the one with his right hand, and of the other with his left.

30 And Sām'sōn said, Let me die with the Phīl'īs-tīneš. And he bowed himself with *all his* might; and the house fell upon the lords, and upon all the people that were therein. So the dead which he slew at his death were more than *they* which he slew in his life.

31 Then his brethren and all the house of his father came down, and took him, and brought *him* up, and buried him between Zōr'āh and Ĕsh'tā-ōl in the buryingplace of Mā-nō'āh his father. And he judged Īs'rā-ēl twenty years.

#### CHAPTER 17

**A**ND there was a man of mount Ē'phrā-īm, whose name was Mī'cāh.

2 And he said unto his mother, The eleven hundred *shē-kēls* of silver that were taken from thee, about which thou cursedst, and spakest of also in mine ears, behold, the silver *is* with me; I took it. And his mother said, Blessed *be thou* of the LORD, my son.

3 And when he had restored the eleven hundred *shē-kēls* of silver to his mother, his mother said, I had wholly dedicated the silver unto the LORD from my hand for my son, to make a graven image and a molten image: now therefore I will restore it unto thee.

4 Yet he restored the money unto his mother; and his mother took two hundred *shē-kēls* of silver, and gave them to the founder, who made thereof a graven image and a molten image: and they were in the house of Mī'cāh.

5 And the man Mī'cāh had an house of gods, and made an ē'phōd, and tēr'ā-phīm, and consecrated one of his sons, who became his priest.

6 In those days *there was* no king in Īs'rā-ēl, *but* every man did *that which* was right in his own eyes.

7 ¶ And there was a young man out of Bēth-lē-hēm-jû'dāh of the family of Jûd'āh, who was a Lē'vīte, and he sojourned there.

8 And the man departed out of the city from Bēth-lē-hēm-jû'dāh

to sojourn where he could find a *place*: and he came to mount Ē'phrā-īm to the house of Mī'cāh, as he journeyed.

9 And Mī'cāh said unto him, Whence comest thou? And he said unto him, I *am* a Lē'vīte of Bēth-lē-hēm-jû'dāh, and I go to sojourn where I may find a *place*.

10 And Mī'cāh said unto him, Dwell with me, and be unto me a father and a priest, and I will give thee ten *shē-kēls* of silver by the year, and a suit of apparel, and thy victuals. So the Lē'vīte went in.

11 And the Lē'vīte was content to dwell with the man; and the young man was unto him as one of his sons.

12 And Mī'cāh consecrated the Lē'vīte; and the young man became his priest, and was in the house of Mī'cāh.

13 Then said Mī'cāh, Now know I that the LORD will do me good, seeing I have a Lē'vīte to *my* priest.

#### CHAPTER 18

**I**N those days *there was* no king in Īs'rā-ēl: and in those days the tribe of the Dān'ītes sought them an inheritance to dwell in; for unto that day *all their* inheritance had not fallen unto them among the tribes of Īs'rā-ēl.

2 And the children of Dān sent of their family five men from their coasts, men of valour, from Zōr'āh, and from Ĕsh'tā-ōl, to spy out the land, and to search it; and they said unto them, Go, search the land: who when they came to mount Ē'phrā-īm, to the house of Mī'cāh, they lodged there.

3 When they were by the house of Mī'cāh, they knew the voice of the young man the Lē'vīte: and they turned in thither, and said unto him, Who brought thee hither? and what makest thou in this *place*? and what hast thou here?

4 And he said unto them, Thus and thus dealeth Mī'cāh with me, and hath hired me, and I am his priest.

5 And they said unto him, Ask counsel, we pray thee, of God, that we may know whether our way which we go shall be prosperous.

6 And the priest said unto them, Go in peace: before the LORD *is* your way wherein ye go.

7 ¶ Then the five men departed, and came to Lā'ish, and saw the people that were therein, how they dwelt careless, after the manner of the Zī-dō'nī-āns, quiet and secure; and *there was* no magistrate in the land, that might put *them* to shame in *any* thing; and they were far from the Zī-dō'nī-āns, and had no business with *any* man.

8 And they came unto their brethren to Zōr'āh and Ĕsh'tā-ōl: and their brethren said unto them, What say ye?

9 And they said, Arise, that we may go up against them: for we have seen the land, and, behold, it is very good: and *are* ye still? be not slothful to go, and to enter to possess the land.

10 When ye go, ye shall come unto a people secure, and to a large land: for God hath given it into your hands; a place where *there is* no want of any thing that *is* in the earth.

11 ¶ And there went from thence of the family of the Dān'ītes, out of Zōr'āh and out of Ĕsh'tā-ōl, six hundred men appointed with weapons of war.

12 And they went up, and pitched in Kīr-jāth-jē'ā-rīm, in Jûd'āh: wherefore they called that place Mā'hā-nēh-dān unto this day: behold, *it is* behind Kīr-jāth-jē'ā-rīm.

13 And they passed thence unto mount Ē'phrā-īm, and came unto the house of Mī'cāh.

14 ¶ Then answered the five men that went to spy out the country of Lā'ish, and said unto their brethren, Do ye know that

there is in these houses an ē-phōd, and tēr-ā-phīm, and a graven image, and a molten image? now therefore consider what ye have to do.

15 And they turned thitherward, and came to the house of the young man the Lē-vīte, *even* unto the house of Mī-cāh, and saluted him.

16 And the six hundred men appointed with their weapons of war, which *were* of the children of Dān, stood by the entering of the gate.

17 And the five men that went to spy out the land went up, *and* came in thither, *and* took the graven image, and the ē-phōd, and the tēr-ā-phīm, and the molten image: and the priest stood in the entering of the gate with the six hundred men *that were* appointed with weapons of war.

18 And these went into Mī-cāh's house, and fetched the carved image, the ē-phōd, and the tēr-ā-phīm, and the molten image. Then said the priest unto them, What do ye?

19 And they said unto him, Hold thy peace, lay thine hand upon thy mouth, and go with us, and be to us a father and a priest: *is it* better for thee to be a priest unto the house of one man, or that thou be a priest unto a tribe and a family in Īs-rā-ēl?

20 And the priest's heart was glad, and he took the ē-phōd, and the tēr-ā-phīm, and the graven image, and went in the midst of the people.

21 So they turned and departed, and put the little ones and the cattle and the carriage before them.

22 ¶ *And* when they were a good way from the house of Mī-cāh, the men that *were* in the houses near to Mī-cāh's house were gathered together, and overtook the children of Dān.

23 And they cried unto the children of Dān. And they turned their faces, and said unto Mī-cāh, What aileth thee, that thou comest with such a company?

24 And he said, Ye have taken away my gods which I made, and the priest, and ye are gone away: and what have I more? and what *is this that* ye say unto me, What aileth thee?

25 And the children of Dān said unto him, Let not thy voice be heard among us, lest angry fellows run upon thee, and thou lose thy life, with the lives of thy household.

26 And the children of Dān went their way: and when Mī-cāh saw that they *were* too strong for him, he turned and went back unto his house.

27 And they took *the things* which Mī-cāh had made, and the priest which he had, and came unto Lā-īsh, unto a people *that were* at quiet and secure: and they smote them with the edge of the sword, and burnt the city with fire.

28 And *there was* no deliverer, because it was far from Zī-dōn, and they had no business with *any* man; and it was in the valley that *lieth* by Bēth-rē-hōb. And they built a city, and dwelt therein.

29 And they called the name of the city Dān, after the name of Dān their father, who was born unto Īs-rā-ēl: howbeit the name of the city was Lā-īsh at the first.

30 ¶ And the children of Dān set up the graven image: and Jōn-ā-thān, the son of Gēr-shōm, the son of Mā-nās-sēh, he and his sons were priests to the tribe of Dān until the day of the captivity of the land.

31 And they set them up Mī-cāh's graven image, which he made, all the time that the house of God was in Shī-lōh.

## CHAPTER 19

**A**ND it came to pass in those days, when *there was* no king in

Īs-rā-ēl, that there was a certain Lē-vīte sojourning on the side of mount Ē-phrā-īm, who took to him a concubine out of Bēth-lē-hēm-jū-dāh.

2 And his concubine played the whore against him, and went away from him unto her father's house to Bēth-lē-hēm-jū-dāh, and was there four whole months.

3 And her husband arose, and went after her, to speak friendly unto her, *and* to bring her again, having his servant with him, and a couple of asses: and she brought him into her father's house: and when the father of the damsel saw him, he rejoiced to meet him.

4 And his father in law, the damsel's father, retained him; and he abode with him three days: so they did eat and drink, and lodged there.

5 ¶ And it came to pass on the fourth day, when they arose early in the morning, that he rose up to depart: and the damsel's father said unto his son in law, Comfort thine heart with a morsel of bread, and afterward go your way.

6 And they sat down, and did eat and drink both of them together: for the damsel's father had said unto the man, Be content, I pray thee, and tarry all night, and let thine heart be merry.

7 And when the man rose up to depart, his father in law urged him: therefore he lodged there again.

8 And he arose early in the morning on the fifth day to depart: and the damsel's father said, Comfort thine heart, I pray thee. And they tarried until afternoon, and they did eat both of them.

9 And when the man rose up to depart, he, and his concubine, and his servant, his father in law, the damsel's father, said unto him, Behold, now the day draweth toward evening, I pray you tarry all night: behold, the day groweth to an end, lodge here, that thine heart may be merry; and to morrow get you early on your way, that thou mayest go home.

10 But the man would not tarry that night, but he rose up and departed, and came over against Jē-būs, which *is* Jē-rū-sā-lēm; and *there were* with him two asses saddled, his concubine also was with him.

11 *And* when they *were* by Jē-būs, the day was far spent; and the servant said unto his master, Come, I pray thee, and let us turn in into this city of the Jēb-ū-sītes, and lodge in it.

12 And his master said unto him, We will not turn aside hither into the city of a stranger, that *is not* of the children of Īs-rā-ēl; we will pass over to Gīb-ē-āh.

13 And he said unto his servant, Come, and let us draw near to one of these places to lodge all night, in Gīb-ē-āh, or in Rā-māh.

14 And they passed on and went their way; and the sun went down upon them *when they were* by Gīb-ē-āh, which *belongeth* to Bēn-jā-mīn.

15 And they turned aside thither, to go in *and* to lodge in Gīb-ē-āh: and when he went in, he sat him down in a street of the city: for *there was* no man that took them into his house to lodging.

16 ¶ And, behold, there came an old man from his work out of the field at even, which was also of mount Ē-phrā-īm; and he sojourned in Gīb-ē-āh: but the men of the place *were* Bēn-jā-mītes.

17 And when he had lifted up his eyes, he saw a wayfaring man in the street of the city: and the old man said, Whither goest thou? and whence comest thou?

18 And he said unto him, We *are* passing from Bēth-lē-hēm-jû-dāh toward the side of mount Ē-phrā-īm; from thence *am* I: and I went to Bēth-lē-hēm-jû-dāh, but I *am now* going to the house of the LORD; and there *is* no man that receiveth me to house.

19 Yet there is both straw and provender for our asses; and there is bread and wine also for me, and for thy handmaid, and for the young man *which is* with thy servants: *there is* no want of any thing.

20 And the old man said, Peace *be* with thee; howsoever *let* all thy wants *lie* upon me; only lodge not in the street.

21 So he brought him into his house, and gave provender unto the asses: and they washed their feet, and did eat and drink.

22 ¶ Now as they were making their hearts merry, behold, the men of the city, certain sons of Bē-lī-āl, beset the house round about, *and* beat at the door, and spake to the master of the house, the old man, saying, Bring forth the man that came into thine house, that we may know him.

23 And the man, the master of the house, went out unto them, and said unto them, Nay, my brethren, *nay*, I pray you, do not so wickedly; seeing that this man is come into mine house, do not this folly.

24 Behold, *here is* my daughter a maiden, and his concubine; them I will bring out now, and humble ye them, and do with them what seemeth good unto you: but unto this man do not so vile a thing.

25 But the men would not hearken to him: so the man took his concubine, and brought her forth unto them; and they knew her, and abused her all the night until the morning; and when the day began to spring, they let her go.

26 Then came the woman in the dawning of the day, and fell down at the door of the man's house where her lord was, till it was light.

27 And her lord rose up in the morning, and opened the doors of the house, and went out to go his way: and, behold, the woman his concubine was fallen down at the door of the house, and her hands *were* upon the threshold.

28 And he said unto her, Up, and let us be going. But none answered. Then the man took her *up* upon an ass, and the man rose up, and gat him unto his place.

29 ¶ And when he was come into his house, he took a knife, and laid hold on his concubine, and divided her, *together* with her bones, into twelve pieces, and sent her into all the coasts of Īś-rā-ēl.

30 And it was so, that all that saw it said, There was no such deed done nor seen from the day that the children of Īś-rā-ēl came up out of the land of Ē-ġypt unto this day: consider of it, take advice, and speak *your minds*.

#### CHAPTER 20

**T**HEN all the children of Īś-rā-ēl went out, and the congregation was gathered together as one man, from Dān even to Beer-shē-bā, with the land of Gīl-ē-ād, unto the LORD in Mīz-pēh.

2 And the chief of all the people, *even* of all the tribes of Īś-rā-ēl, presented themselves in the assembly of the people of God, four hundred thousand footmen that drew sword.

3 (Now the children of Bēn-jā-mīn heard that the children of Īś-rā-ēl were gone up to Mīz-pēh.) Then said the children of Īś-rā-ēl, Tell *us*, how was this wickedness?

4 And the Lē-vīte, the husband of the woman that was slain,

answered and said, I came into Gīb-ē-āh that *belongeth* to Bēn-jā-mīn, I and my concubine, to lodge.

5 And the men of Gīb-ē-āh rose against me, and beset the house round about upon me by night, *and* thought to have slain me: and my concubine have they forced, that she is dead.

6 And I took my concubine, and cut her in pieces, and sent her throughout all the country of the inheritance of Īś-rā-ēl: for they have committed lewdness and folly in Īś-rā-ēl.

7 Behold, ye *are* all children of Īś-rā-ēl; give here your advice and counsel.

8 ¶ And all the people arose as one man, saying, We will not any *of us* go to his tent, neither will we any *of us* turn into his house.

9 But now this *shall be* the thing which we will do to Gīb-ē-āh; we *will go up* by lot against it;

10 And we will take ten men of an hundred throughout all the tribes of Īś-rā-ēl, and an hundred of a thousand, and a thousand out of ten thousand, to fetch victual for the people, that they may do, when they come to Gīb-ē-āh of Bēn-jā-mīn, according to all the folly that they have wrought in Īś-rā-ēl.

11 So all the men of Īś-rā-ēl were gathered against the city, knit together as one man.

12 ¶ And the tribes of Īś-rā-ēl sent men through all the tribe of Bēn-jā-mīn, saying, What wickedness *is* this that is done among you?

13 Now therefore deliver *us* the men, the children of Bē-lī-āl, which *are* in Gīb-ē-āh, that we may put them to death, and put away evil from Īś-rā-ēl. But the children of Bēn-jā-mīn would not hearken to the voice of their brethren the children of Īś-rā-ēl:

14 But the children of Bēn-jā-mīn gathered themselves together out of the cities unto Gīb-ē-āh, to go out to battle against the children of Īś-rā-ēl.

15 And the children of Bēn-jā-mīn were numbered at that time out of the cities twenty and six thousand men that drew sword, beside the inhabitants of Gīb-ē-āh, which were numbered seven hundred chosen men.

16 Among all this people *there were* seven hundred chosen men lefthanded; every one could sling stones at an hair *breadth*, and not miss.

17 And the men of Īś-rā-ēl, beside Bēn-jā-mīn, were numbered four hundred thousand men that drew sword: all these *were* men of war.

18 ¶ And the children of Īś-rā-ēl arose, and went up to the house of God, and asked counsel of God, and said, Which of us shall go up first to the battle against the children of Bēn-jā-mīn? And the LORD said, Jûd-āh *shall go up* first.

19 And the children of Īś-rā-ēl rose up in the morning, and encamped against Gīb-ē-āh.

20 And the men of Īś-rā-ēl went out to battle against Bēn-jā-mīn; and the men of Īś-rā-ēl put themselves in array to fight against them at Gīb-ē-āh.

21 And the children of Bēn-jā-mīn came forth out of Gīb-ē-āh, and destroyed down to the ground of the Īś-rā-ēl-ites that day twenty and two thousand men.

22 And the people the men of Īś-rā-ēl encouraged themselves, and set their battle again in array in the place where they put themselves in array the first day.

23 (And the children of Īś-rā-ēl went up and wept before the LORD until even, and asked counsel of the LORD, saying, Shall I go up again to battle against the children of Bēn-jā-mīn my brother?

And the LORD said, Go up against him.)

24 And the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl came near against the children of Bēn-jā-mīn the second day.

25 And Bēn-jā-mīn went forth against them out of Gīb-ē-āh the second day, and destroyed down to the ground of the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl again eighteen thousand men; all these drew the sword.

26 ¶ Then all the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl, and all the people, went up, and came unto the house of God, and wept, and sat there before the LORD, and fasted that day until even, and offered burnt offerings and peace offerings before the LORD.

27 And the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl inquired of the LORD, (for the ark of the covenant of God was there in those days,

28 And Phīn-ē-hās, the son of ʾĒl-ē-ā-zār, the son of ʾĀa-ron, stood before it in those days,) saying, Shall I yet again go out to battle against the children of Bēn-jā-mīn my brother, or shall I cease? And the LORD said, Go up; for to morrow I will deliver them into thine hand.

29 And ʾĪś-rā-ēl set liers in wait round about Gīb-ē-āh.

30 And the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl went up against the children of Bēn-jā-mīn on the third day, and put themselves in array against Gīb-ē-āh, as at other times.

31 And the children of Bēn-jā-mīn went out against the people, and were drawn away from the city; and they began to smite of the people, and kill, as at other times, in the highways, of which one goeth up to the house of God, and the other to Gīb-ē-āh in the field, about thirty men of ʾĪś-rā-ēl.

32 And the children of Bēn-jā-mīn said, They are smitten down before us, as at the first. But the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl said, Let us flee, and draw them from the city unto the highways.

33 And all the men of ʾĪś-rā-ēl rose up out of their place, and put themselves in array at Bā-āl-tā-mār: and the liers in wait of ʾĪś-rā-ēl came forth out of their places, even out of the meadows of Gīb-ē-āh.

34 And there came against Gīb-ē-āh ten thousand chosen men out of all ʾĪś-rā-ēl, and the battle was sore: but they knew not that evil was near them.

35 And the LORD smote Bēn-jā-mīn before ʾĪś-rā-ēl: and the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl destroyed of the Bēn-jā-mītes that day twenty and five thousand and an hundred men: all these drew the sword.

36 So the children of Bēn-jā-mīn saw that they were smitten: for the men of ʾĪś-rā-ēl gave place to the Bēn-jā-mītes, because they trusted unto the liers in wait which they had set beside Gīb-ē-āh.

37 And the liers in wait hastened, and rushed upon Gīb-ē-āh; and the liers in wait drew themselves along, and smote all the city with the edge of the sword.

38 Now there was an appointed sign between the men of ʾĪś-rā-ēl and the liers in wait, that they should make a great flame with smoke rise up out of the city.

39 And when the men of ʾĪś-rā-ēl retired in the battle, Bēn-jā-mīn began to smite and kill of the men of ʾĪś-rā-ēl about thirty persons: for they said, Surely they are smitten down before us, as in the first battle.

40 But when the flame began to arise up out of the city with a pillar of smoke, the Bēn-jā-mītes looked behind them, and, behold, the flame of the city ascended up to heaven.

41 And when the men of ʾĪś-rā-ēl turned again, the men of Bēn-jā-mīn were amazed: for they saw that evil was come upon them.

42 Therefore they turned their backs before the men of ʾĪś-rā-ēl

unto the way of the wilderness; but the battle overtook them; and them which came out of the cities they destroyed in the midst of them.

43 Thus they inclosed the Bēn-jā-mītes round about, and chased them, and trode them down with ease over against Gīb-ē-āh toward the sunrising.

44 And there fell of Bēn-jā-mīn eighteen thousand men; all these were men of valour.

45 And they turned and fled toward the wilderness unto the rock of Rīm-mōn: and they gleaned of them in the highways five thousand men; and pursued hard after them unto Gidom, and slew two thousand men of them.

46 So that all which fell that day of Bēn-jā-mīn were twenty and five thousand men that drew the sword; all these were men of valour.

47 But six hundred men turned and fled to the wilderness unto the rock Rīm-mōn, and abode in the rock Rīm-mōn four months.

48 And the men of ʾĪś-rā-ēl turned again upon the children of Bēn-jā-mīn, and smote them with the edge of the sword, as well the men of every city, as the beast, and all that came to hand: also they set on fire all the cities that they came to.

#### CHAPTER 21

**N**OW the men of ʾĪś-rā-ēl had sworn in Mīz-pēh, saying, There shall not any of us give his daughter unto Bēn-jā-mīn to wife.

2 And the people came to the house of God, and abode there till even before God, and lifted up their voices, and wept sore;

3 And said, O LORD God of ʾĪś-rā-ēl, why is this come to pass in ʾĪś-rā-ēl, that there should be to day one tribe lacking in ʾĪś-rā-ēl?

4 And it came to pass on the morrow, that the people rose early, and built there an altar, and offered burnt offerings and peace offerings.

5 And the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl said, Who is there among all the tribes of ʾĪś-rā-ēl that came not up with the congregation unto the LORD? For they had made a great oath concerning him that came not up to the LORD to Mīz-pēh, saying, He shall surely be put to death.

6 And the children of ʾĪś-rā-ēl repented them for Bēn-jā-mīn their brother, and said, There is one tribe cut off from ʾĪś-rā-ēl this day.

7 How shall we do for wives for them that remain, seeing we have sworn by the LORD that we will not give them of our daughters to wives?

8 ¶ And they said, What one is there of the tribes of ʾĪś-rā-ēl that came not up to Mīz-pēh to the LORD? And, behold, there came none to the camp from Jā-bēsh-gīl-ē-ād to the assembly.

9 For the people were numbered, and, behold, there were none of the inhabitants of Jā-bēsh-gīl-ē-ād there.

10 And the congregation sent thither twelve thousand men of the valiantest, and commanded them, saying, Go and smite the inhabitants of Jā-bēsh-gīl-ē-ād with the edge of the sword, with the women and the children.

11 And this is the thing that ye shall do, Ye shall utterly destroy every male, and every woman that hath lain by man.

12 And they found among the inhabitants of Jā-bēsh-gīl-ē-ād four hundred young virgins, that had known no man by lying with any male: and they brought them unto the camp to Shī-lōh, which is in the land of Cā-nā-ān.

13 And the whole congregation sent some to speak to the children of Bēn-jā-mīn that were in the rock Rīm-mōn, and to call



peaceably unto them.

14 And Běn-jǎ-mǐn came again at that time; and they gave them wives which they had saved alive of the women of Jā-běsh-gǐl-ě-ād: and yet so they sufficed them not.

15 And the people repented them for Běn-jǎ-mǐn, because that the LORD had made a breach in the tribes of Īś-rā-ěl.

16 ¶ Then the elders of the congregation said, How shall we do for wives for them that remain, seeing the women are destroyed out of Běn-jǎ-mǐn?

17 And they said, *There must be* an inheritance for them that be escaped of Běn-jǎ-mǐn, that a tribe be not destroyed out of Īś-rā-ěl.

18 Howbeit we may not give them wives of our daughters: for the children of Īś-rā-ěl have sworn, saying, Cursed be he that giveth a wife to Běn-jǎ-mǐn.

19 Then they said, Behold, *there is* a feast of the LORD in Shī-lōh yearly *in a place* which is on the north side of Běth-ěl, on the east side of the highway that goeth up from Běth-ěl to Shē-chēm, and on the south of Lě-bō-năh.

20 Therefore they commanded the children of Běn-jǎ-mǐn,

saying, Go and lie in wait in the vineyards;

21 And see, and, behold, if the daughters of Shī-lōh come out to dance in dances, then come ye out of the vineyards, and catch you every man his wife of the daughters of Shī-lōh, and go to the land of Běn-jǎ-mǐn.

22 And it shall be, when their fathers or their brethren come unto us to complain, that we will say unto them, Be favourable unto them for our sakes: because we reserved not to each man his wife in the war: for ye did not give unto them at this time, *that* ye should be guilty.

23 And the children of Běn-jǎ-mǐn did so, and took *them* wives, according to their number, of them that danced, whom they caught: and they went and returned unto their inheritance, and repaired the cities, and dwelt in them.

24 And the children of Īś-rā-ěl departed thence at that time, every man to his tribe and to his family, and they went out from thence every man to his inheritance.

25 In those days *there was* no king in Īś-rā-ěl: every man did *that which* was right in his own eyes.
